Sewage: Motion was made by Ed Robinson and seconded by Bob Boice to give Ronald Roxbury permission to connect his mobile home to an existing tap and all present voted ves.

A motion was made by Dave Stellfox and seconded by Ed Robinson as recommended by Engineer Bill Deemer, to approve \$5000.00 for Insight Pipe to repair major infiltration leaks at Y's and drops in the Borough sewage lines and all present voted yes.

Dave Johnston, Butler County Planning Director commented on Community Development and Block Grants. He also commented on required criteria to receive consideration for Grants. He said he will fax applicable forms to the Borough Office for the Wednesday extended meeting.

Ed Robinson will contact Mike English concerning all new and modified Ordinances required by the Borough which includes the Ordinance required for Stop signs at Wilson and Kennedy Roads.

Parks: Nothing to Report.

Streets: All Wilson Road documentation is being up-graded and distributed as required. Several problem properties have been properly attended to.

Police: The Police report was presented by Mayor Butler, see attached report.

Personnel: Nothing to report.

Maintenance of Facility: Nothing to Report.

Planning Commission: Nothing to Report.

Visitors: Frank Matis, Butler County Emergency Management, updated the Council on Emergency Plans required by the Borough. He is coordinating with Councilman Glen Gitzen and Kirk Dalton to assure emergency information is available to all Borough Citizens.

Barb Robinson stated concerns about construction material and brush clean-up on her property related to the Wilson Road Storm Water Project.

Nick Vaccarello stated concerns about a back-flow preventer, corrections to Minutes, and that his sewage system did not require inspection at time of construction.

Communications: Fire Department minutes were received. Storm Water Management Ordinance was received.

Old Business: Bob Boice gave a detailed description of his investigative finds concerning all of the Borough insurance matters. He discovered several potential cost saving situations. A motion was made by Ed Robinson and seconded by Dave Stellfox to give Bob Boice approval to remove any insurance policy paperwork from the Borough building that he may need for his research. All present voted yes. Robert Hixson will provide equipment listings to Bob Boice for insurance purposes.

New Business: Bob Boice reported regarding Marcellus Shale Ordinances. He gave several details concerning Borough responsibilities to the safety of its citizens. One concern was the amount of liquids used in the process that remain in the ground after the drilling is finished. Dave Stellfox commented that the Ordinance should restrict the lubricants used to bio-degradable liquids and oils that are currently available to that industry.

Mayor Butler reported that the Butler County Tax collection meeting on Act 32 will be held at Slippery Rock Middle School at 7:00pm Tuesday June 7, 2011.

No further business at hand, motion was made by Ed Robinson and seconded by Dave Stellfox to extend the meeting on Wednesday, June 8 th at 7:00 pm all voted yes except for Bob Boice who voted no.
