#### **IMPORTANT INFORMATION – PLEASE READ**

Nominees MUST attend the Nomination Meeting (in person or by Zoom) to accept their nomination, and MUST attend the Candidate Forum.

Nominees must sign an acceptance of nomination, complete criminal records check (including a vulnerable sector check, and a declaration of eligibility form within 48 hours of accepting nomination.

Nominees are fully responsible for properly completing all nomination requirements AND submitting these document requirements to the Electoral Officer.

Any candidate for the office of Councillor must:

- be of Ktunaxa ancestry;
- be 18 years of age and qualify as an Elector;
- be nominated for that office, in accordance with the procedures set out in these regulations;
- ordinarily reside within the Ktunaxa Traditional Territory;
- not have been convicted of a criminal offence within seven (7) years prior to their nomination;
- subject to a five (5) years drivers license abstract that is clean from Immediate Roadside Prohibitions;
- provide a clean vulnerable sector check;
- not be in arrears on any established legal indebtedness to ?akisqnuk First Nation or any of its business entities by the date of the election;
- have not resigned from Council within the last 4 years;
- has not been removed from Council within the last five (5) years.

#### Elkhorn PCD Minors Trust Update

Council selected First Nations Bank (FNB) Trust to act as trustee for the minors eligible to receive a per capita distribution from the Elkhorn Settlement. Administration is now working with First Nations Bank to set up the trusts. As part of the set-up process, FNB will hold information sessions and prepare a FAQ document to provide minors and their guardians information. Additional information on these information sessions, and the timing to set up the trusts will be circulated to minors and their guardians in the near future. Applications for withdrawals from the minors trusts, in accordance with the Elkhorn Settlement Proceeds Policy, will be considered once the trusts have been established.

### Status on the Recreation Centre

As you are all aware, the Columbia Lake Recreation Centre was 'closed to all' for some time.

Recently, work was done to open the centre to Akisqnuk Members. As we make more progress in our planning, we are moving more towards our goal of having the centre fully open and operating.

At this time, we have been able to accommodate a few groups for "organized activities".

However, we are still **Not fully open to the public community**.

We still have some work to do, in order to reach this goal. Staff is working hard on this, and we appreciate everyone's patience. In the last couple of weeks, there have been a lot of different messages circulating, which has prompted this message. We need to reiterate to you all that at this time, the Columbia Lake Recreation Centre is not fully open to the Public.

### Logging off Kootenay #3 Road, around Madias Area Update

Ki?su?k kyu?kyit,

An update on the logging concerns:

This area being logged is private property and the laws are different on private property. Rest assured, AFN staff are working on this.

Staff set up a meeting between the company and Akisqnuk to discuss the concern. He had no idea there were concerns with the logging and didn't realize the sub division application was such a sour spot. After giving a history lesson we expressed our concerns and they are open to accommodate.

This included Archeological sites which are to be avoided.

Watercourse. We informed them the creek goes under water in places and to treat it as it was visible. They have a 10 m buffer and are not planning on going into an area dominated by deciduous trees which so happens to be where the creek is underground.

We talked about wildlife and winter forage as well as leaving cover so people can't hunt from the old road.

Traffic was discussed and Their trucks all have GPS, so they can track their speed to see who is speeding, Even better, they are going to put in a warning alarm for when the driver approaches the speed limit.

Signs will be posted (for Danny) letting people know logging trucks are turning.

We will have some drone aerial video work as well as ground truthing to identify the proper creek bed, as well as regular check-ins.

Our biggest concern was the proposed sub division. We were able to get them to stop their application for a sub-division in the area which would have made all the lands off limits similar to crooked tree and alpine road. Further to this point, they are open to selling the parcel to Akisqnuk removing the threat of further alienation or sub-division.

Staff and Council will inform the local realtor industry of our position on sub division so they may inform future developers of the opposition that court challenges are likely.
