- have not resigned from Council within the last 4 years;
- has not been removed from Council within the last five (5) years.

# NOT JUST NALOXONE WORKSHOP:

Talking about substance use in Indigenous communities

Not Just Naloxone (NJN) is a virtual workshop hosted by the First Nations Health Authority and is delivered by the Four Directions team. This training was developed in response to the overdose crisis in BC, which continues to disproportionately impact Indigenous people.

While Naloxone is an effective life-saving medicine to reverse an overdose, it is not our only response. The NJN workshops teach participants to facilitate community-based discussions about:

- > Racism and prohibition in Canada
- > Decolonizing substance use
- Indigenous harm reduction practices
- Trauma- and resiliency-informed practice
- > Anti-stigma work
- > Naloxone training (nasal/injection)




Let the 2022-2023 Ski Season Begin! Well... almost!
