Drawing supplies

To learn to draw all you really need is a good pencil and a quality eraser.

AND - cool supplies are fun and when you need to accomplish something that a #2 pencil can't - here are some suggestions.



Prismacolor Premier Graphite Drawing Pencils with Erasers & Sharpeners,
18-Piece Set approx \$20.

ERASERS in this set are good.

This set will allow you to learn and experiment with a wide range of drawing techniques and methods.




If you want an eraser on the end of these pencils - I would get white polymer erasers like these!



Prismacolor Premier Colored Pencils, Soft Core, 24 Pack

This set is an excellent starter kit of high quality, that won't leave you frustrated by any flaws. They are approx \$24.



Canson Artist Series Drawing Paper, Wirebound Pad, 9x12 inches, 24 Sheets (80lb/130g) - Artist Paper for Adults and Students - Charcoal, Colored Pencil, Ink...This is a good all around drawing paper, in a size that is good for class work. You may want a smaller one to take to coffee shops or to keep at the kitchen table.

Other options are: SMOOTH BRISTOL or Smooth Cardstock. If you are in search of creating DETAIL - I would recommend a smooth paper. (Smooth does not work well with charcoal if that is what you want to use.)



This kit by GENERAL (American made) is excellent for beginners to see what options there are for starting with charcoal.



Try drawing with pen - that is fully ERASABLE!
