

Lilies and Cedars Homeschool Coalition 2026-2027

Anna Dyer, Ed.D., will be leading a coalition of 10-12 female students through their year of homeschooling. Included in this year will be:



- A meeting with Dr. Dyer to plan your student's homeschool plan for the year
- In-person group instruction Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday from 9:30 AM – 1:30 PM (Tuesday is an optional workday; lessons will be held in specific students' homes)
 - One-on-one educational and spiritual mentorship
 - Virtual office hours accessible to parents and students
 - Transcripts for the year for English, History and Bible
- Various local field trips and a potential larger trip later in the year

The coalition studies will include:

- Literature and Creative Writing
- American History (during America's 250th birthday!)
 - A review of American and World Geography
 -
 - A student-led World Showcase culture study
 - Bible and Christian Worldview

Field trips could include:

- A day spent in Charleston paired with a project presenting the history of our state and city
- A trip to a plantation during our Civil War studies to see firsthand evidence of the era
 - Viewing theatre productions, such as *A Christmas Carol* or *Les Misérables*
 - Various lunch outings on special occasions
 - ...and more!

Overall, this year will provide each student with:

- Full credit for three courses
- Individual academic support and guidance for each student in all subjects
 - Curriculum rooted in God's Word and Spirit-led instruction
- A group of young girls seeking God and strong friendships with one another
 - Accountability, organization, and record-keeping
- Personalized feedback to parents on student progress and emotional growth
- A path setting students up for future success, including a plan to reach dual-enrollment college courses by their Junior year of high school if desired

All English books will be paired with either an essay or a project after reading

Reading will take place both in class together and assigned at home, followed by discussions

History curriculum includes a textbook, workbook, quizzes, tests, and more; additional activities and projects will be assigned periodically

Around 70% of this work will be done during the 2-3 days of in-person group instruction

Around 30% of the work will be done on the student's own time at home

Dr. Dyer will be reachable on some Mondays and Fridays for students needing further support

Cost Breakdown and Schedule

Deposit due upon registration - \$250

(This payment secures your student's enrollment in the program)

Literature Books - \$80 (Plus a book of their choosing)

IEW Curriculum - \$30

Bible Books - \$40 (Plus a Bible)

History Books - \$150 (Includes three textbooks, a workbook, and a quiz/exam book)

Supply and Tech Fee - \$150 (Binders, binder covers, binder dividers, paper, posterboards, craft supplies for various projects, and other items that will accumulate throughout the year)

Total Due by July 1st for all resources - \$450

Quarterly Tuition - \$850 (Due Sept. 1st, Nov. 1st, Feb. 1st, and April 1st)

- 60 lesson days (students must attend these in-person)
- 28 optional workdays (students can call or video conference on days they cannot attend)
 - 352 total hours of instruction
 - Additional office hours on non-class days

Additional Requirements

Students will also need a laptop

Field trip fees will be discussed as opportunities arise throughout the year
