Now the people of Israel were assembled with fasting and in sackcloth, and with earth on their heads. And they stood and confessed their sins and the iniquities of their ancestors. Standing in place they read from the Book of the Law of the LORD their God for a quarter of the day; for another quarter of it they made confession and worshiped the LORD their God. Then the Levites said, “Stand up and bless the LORD your God from everlasting to everlasting.”

Blessed be your glorious name, which is exalted above all blessing and praise. You are the LORD, you alone.

You have made heaven, the heaven of heavens, with all their host, the earth and all that is on it, the seas and all that is in them; and you preserve all of them; and the host of heaven worships you. You gave your good Spirit to instruct them and did not withhold your manna from their mouth and gave them water for their thirst. Forty years you sustained them in the wilderness, and they lacked nothing. Their clothes did not wear out and their feet did not swell. You multiplied their children as the stars of heaven, and you brought them into the land that you had promised, full of all good things, cisterns already hewn, vineyards, olive orchards and fruit trees in abundance. So they ate and were filled and became fat and delighted themselves in your great goodness.

Nevertheless, we were disobedient and rebelled against you and cast your law behind our back and killed your prophets, who warned us to turn back to you. We acted presumptuously and did not obey your commandments, but sinned against your law, which gives life when we follow it. We turned a stubborn shoulder and stiffened our neck and would not give ear to obey. Long you have borne with us and warned us by your Spirit through your prophets. Behold, we are slaves this day because of our sins, and we are in great distress. Nevertheless, in your great mercies you did not make an end of us or forsake us, for you are a gracious and merciful God.

Our God, the great, the mighty, and the awesome God, who keeps covenant and steadfast love, let not all our hardship seem little to you; though we acted wickedly, yet you have been righteous and deal faithfully. When we turn and cry to you, hear from heaven, and deliver us according to your mercies.
