WEEKLY ADVENT DEVOTIONAL

"What are we waiting for?"

Advent means "coming or arrival." It is a season of waiting for an arrival. It begins four Sundays before Christmas. During Advent we focus our attention on two different periods of time—waiting for the Christ child, the Messiah to be born; and waiting for Jesus Christ to come again in glory.

The first period was the time of the Hebrew prophets who announced the restoration of Israel with the arrival of a Messiah. The Jews waited 400 years from the last prophecy until the birth of Jesus. Those who don't believe Jesus is the promised Messiah are still waiting. Christians believe Jesus is the fulfillment of that period.

The second period began with the ascension of the resurrected Jesus into heaven and the promise of His return. We Christians live in the time between the advents of Jesus: Christmas and the Second Coming. Our celebration of Advent and the Christmas birth of Jesus is focused knowledge in the Easter joy of Christ' Resurrection. We celebrate God who has already come into the world. Emmanuel (God with us) has shown us God's Love and God's Power of victory over evil and death. What are we waiting for? We have work to do. We have been given the assignment of the Great Commission to go out into all the world to share the Gospel. We "wait" in confidence of Jesus return. As we prepare for Christmas, in the security of God's love, may we have renewed energy and be empowered to live, to love, to work for God's kingdom sharing the "Good news", our assignment.
