Sunday, August 4 in Pioneer Hall will be the final installment in a three-part series of panel discussions that have explored the 150th anniversary of the wave of Germans-from-Russia migration to North America that began in 1874.

Dan Flyger, Marnette (Ortman) Hofer, Norman Hofer and S. Roy Kaufman are providing unique perspectives on different aspects of this story. That includes the history of Hutterite, Lutheran, Low German Mennonite, Reformed and Swiss Amish immigrants who all settled in southeastern Dakota Territory in the 1870s.

Freeman Academy is needing housing for an International Volunteer Exchange Program (IVEP) worker planning to come for the 2024-25 school year. This young man is an English teacher from Chad, and he will be working at FA as a teacher's assistant in a variety of capacities. CPMC Conference Report (from Marilyn Brockmueller)

I was privileged to attend the CPMC Annual Meetings this year at Sugar Creek Mennonite Church in Wayland, Iowa. I went as the representative from our Department of Mission & Service. I attended 2 workshops that were relevant to our department. 1) "Ecuador Partnership Update" lead by Joel Beachy and Nathan Luitjens who visited Ecuador earlier this year. They showed pictures of the locations, the people that we are supporting and explained about the church work and programs they are doing. 2) "Immigration Injustice, What Can I Do?" was led by Margie Mejia-Caraballo (CPMC pastor) and Abraham Diaz Alanso (MCC Central States Immigration Program Coordinator). Margie read her recently published poem about one immigrant family and told stories about the immigrants who she is helping that are in her congregation and in the Quad City area. Abraham told about what resources MCC Central States has to help all the Mennonite congregations in the region who work with immigrants.

I, also, enjoyed meeting with people that I had served with while serving on the CPMC Board and other people that I have met throughout the years. Saturday evening, we met at Crooked Creek Camp which is located in a very scenic setting near Washington, Iowa. It was interesting to see another Mennonite camp. From there we visited Nick, Erika and the boys at their home in Washington. I would encourage everyone to attend an Annual Meeting to better understand the working of CPMC and meet people from the many varied congregations throughout our conference.
