Dear Brothers & Sisters,

Last weekend we sent a pastoral note to Central Plains congregations in the Twin Cities with prayers for strength and mercy in the wake of the killing of George Floyd by Minneapolis police officers. Today we want to speak to the entire membership of Central Plains Mennonite Conference.

We join in the cries for justice for Mr. Floyd and for the transformation of the systems that have allowed racism, disparities, and injustice to flourish for far too long. We confess that what has been laid bare through this tragedy has, in fact, been among us all along.

So, we pray for the peace of our cities and towns, our rural communities, and our entire country — not for a peace that ignores the cries of those who suffer, but for a peace that acknowledges the pain, offers humble repentance, and works to right the wrongs of racial injustice that were so tragically brought to the forefront last week in Minnesota.

With the leadership of Mennonite Church USA, we agree that "this is not a time for Mennonites to be the quiet in the land. We call on our congregations to lament and pray together. More than that, we encourage you to stand in solidarity with communities of color, walk alongside them and, indeed, be led by them" (MC USA Statement on Racial Injustice, June 1, 2020).

We echo the urging of Glen Guyton, Executive Director for MC USA, that "along with thoughts and prayers, we need action. We need to be unified around who we are as transformative peacemakers, not our political ideologies." We join his call "on all MC USA congregations to have a time of prayer on Sunday, June 7, to lament the violence, pain and injustice that is plaguing our country. I ask that you pray for compassionate and wise leadership for our country during this time" (We Need to Engage in More Costly Peacemaking, June 1, 2020).

"We, who are many, are one body in Christ, and individually we are members one of another" (Rom. 12:5). In this season of Pentecost, may we all be filled anew by the life-giving power of the Holy Spirit, so that we might be strengthened for our daily labors, equipped to offer compassionate care to one another, and emboldened to proclaim the Good News in word and action.
