**On Sunday Sept. 5th,** Everett Waltner and Matt Waltner gave the below joint statement to the congregation from the Chairs of the Deacon Board and Pastoral Search Committee respectively:

On Saturday, Sept. 18th members of the Pastoral Search Team and the Board of Deacons as well as some members of the church council will be meeting with the Conflict Resolution Team of Central Plains Mennonite Conference. The goal of this meeting is to clarify misunderstandings and differences of opinion in the pastoral search process as well as to chart a clearer path forward with greater transparency and better communication. We hope to work toward strengthening our common goal of serving Christ and his Church. We also want to address the frustrations and hurt feelings that have surfaced in recent weeks. We ask for your prayerful support in this endeavor as well as continued prayer for our church as a whole.

**From the Mission and Service team** – As MCC responds to needs around the world in Ethiopia, Afghanistan, Myanmar, Congo and other crisis areas, they need our help in replenishing their supplies of <u>relief kits and hygiene kits</u>.
