## **Community Connections**

"Are You Smarter Than An 8th Grader?" scheduled at the Freeman Community Center at 2 p.m. on Sunday, Nov. 9, will offer a unique look at one-room country schools. The game-show format (modeled after the popular "Are You Smarter than a 5th Grader" TV show) will feature students, teachers, pastors and members of the business community who will attempt to correctly answer questions from a 1912 eighth-grade exam. The teams will be able to consult with a panel of six high school students – three from both Freeman Academy and Freeman Public. The event is being presented by Heritage Hall Museum & Archives free to the public, thanks to nine local businesses that are joining the museum as sponsors. The museum will be accepting donations for its Diamond Valley School Renovation Project. The one-room country school served students south of Freeman from 1882 to 1969 and is now part of the HHM&A complex.
