## **SOUTH CHURCH NEWS AND NOTES**

**The Mission and Service Team invites you to look at the signup sheet** on the narthex table for serving or making food at the Yankton Banquet on Thursday, February 12. Monetary donations for groceries can be given to Lee Brockmueller, earmarked "The Banquet". Thank you!

**Four Way Mission** (formerly Ecuador Two Way Mission) – Please stop by the display in the narthex to view and read about the new Four Way Mission in Ecuador. This is a collaboration between two new nonprofit organizations working together to strengthen connections between people, communities, the earth and God. The US partner is the newly formed 501(c)(3) tax- deductible nonprofit organization with a board who raises money for the work in Ecuador. They collaborate with the newly formed nonprofit in Ecuador known as Fundacion Four Way Mission who disperses the funds to further the work that the Ross-Richers did among the Cofan people.

The display lists the board members of both non-profits, shows the finances, lists where the funds are going and gives testimonials from 4 of the university level students who are being supported to earn degrees in education and nursing. In addition to training young people in 3 different levels of education, funding is going for seminars on Anabaptist leadership, and preparation of teaching materials written by indigenous church leaders. This is the organization that our congregation supports through the department of Mission & Service.

**Additional help is being sought to help make coffee** for our church's Sunday morning coffee time. There are currently three Sunday School classes taking turns. It takes about 10-15 minutes before church and again after church or Sunday School. It can be done by an individual or as many people as you want to help you! There are written instructions to make the coffee, but any of the current volunteers would be happy to work with you until you are comfortable. If you would be willing to occasionally take a turn, please write your name on the signup sheet in the narthex. If you have questions, please talk to Donna Ries, Kris Carlson, or Brent Brockmueller or any member of the Conference Room Class, Class 10 or the Young Adult Class.

**On Jan. 25, the worship offering for the first time will go to the Mennonite World Conference Global Church Sharing Fund's Jubilee account.** Through the Jubilee account of the Global Church Sharing Fund, MWC member and associate member churches in Africa, Asia and Latin America/Caribbean may receive a grant of up to \$10 000 for ministries that advance the life and mission of their churches. Inspired by the biblical teaching of Sabbath and Jubilee year sharing (in Leviticus 25 and 2 Cor. 8:13-15, for example), Mennonite World Conference set up the Global Church Sharing Fund. Sharing Fund Jubilee grants have been used for: translation and publication of materials; scholarships for students; upgrading computer systems; church supplies; bicycles for evangelists; vehicles for church organizing; evangelism and leadership training; construction and repair of church facilities; promotion of Anabaptist identity and belonging. The fund has also been used for supporting the churches with relief actions when there is a natural disaster in their region.
