## Let's Come Together to Help Your Child Succeed!

At *Preschool 101* we want to help your child grow towards success: as parents, guidance and encouragement are some of the ways that we can use to lead them there. We have observed that children are very proud of what they can do, and one thing notice as a parent is that we do not give them enough time to accomplish them or we are afraid that things might get too messy.

At the preschool, we expose children to all sorts of new sensations and experiences: glue, scissors, paints, playdough and lots of time to explore. But we need your help; we would like children to not only be able to have this at school, but also at home.

Remember, supervision of all these activities is compulsory!

### You can help your child by:

- 1) **Giving him/her time to pull up his own pants after they use the bathroom, getting himself/herself dressed or putting on their own shoes.** This is mainly when they are trying to pull up the back end of the pants or pulling up the heel of their shoes. We know that it is easier if you do it for them, but slow and steady wins the race, and before you know it, they will be able to do these things by themselves in the long run.
- 2) **Letting him/her feed himself/herself.** Resist the temptation to feed him/her and let them try to conquer poking or scooping the food by himself/herself. If he/she needs to use his/her hands, then let it be, sometimes it is the easier way to eat. This improves their skill of mastering hand/eye co-ordination and messes do happen. Do make sure that your child takes one bite of food at a time; it teaches them to chew properly and most importantly prevents them from choking.
- 3) **Knowing it is alright to get messy.** Water, playdough, paint, glue, sand.... These are all okay to get their little hands into; it teaches children new textures and functions of various items. Some of us dread cleaning these up, but it is all part of learning and discovery. The objective is to introduce children to various areas of science. What can get worse? Washing your hands afterwards and they end up with clean hands.
- 4) **Help them with using scissors.** Many of us are afraid of letting our children use scissors as we do not want them to cut themselves or get hurt. However, laying down the ground rules before letting them use them is a must, before each use. Each time before we let the students use scissors, we demonstrate to the group **what not to do** by acting silly and pretend to try and cut various items in the room. The children would stop us from cutting certain things. We then ask them back if they should cut those as well. When Ms. Renee's children were very little, she would sit down with her children and they would cut straight lines on the flyers that they received every week, like helping her make a visual grocery list or having them provide her with a visual of gifts they would like to receive on their birthday or Christmas. See picture 1 for a sample of how to hold scissors properly.
- 5) **Teach him/her how to hold a pencil.** As teachers, we cringe when we see anyone holding a pencil like she/he is stirring a pot of soup. Proper pencil grip is important for young children to learn as it helps them control their pencil when they are learning to write letters and numbers, and even when they are drawing. See picture 2 for a sample of how to hold a writing instrument properly.

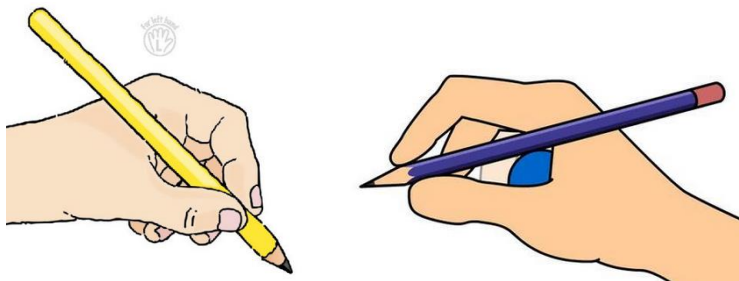
We hope that we have enlightened you as to how we can come together to help your child on a road to success.
