

2020 Sumter County Fair YOUTH Family Living Exhibit

The Family Living Exhibit of the Sumter County Fair is open to ALL YOUTH ages 5-18. The fair will follow the age divisions set forth by the Florida 4-H program. All ages are as of September 1st of the current 4-H year. It is the responsibility of all youth exhibitors to know the criteria specified in each exhibit class and entry category. It is also the responsibility of the exhibitor to register and follow the guidelines set forth in this document. If you have questions, please contact the UF/IFAS Extension Sumter County office at 352-569-6863.

1. ALL ENTRIES MUST BE PRE-REGISTERED ON THE EXHIBIT ENTRY FORM.
2. All entries should be owned, produced, or made by the YOUTH EXHIBITOR, and clearly marked with the name, age, and club/school information on affixed entry tag.
3. **All entries must have been completed since March 1, 2019, or never before entered.**
4. All entries are submitted and exhibited at the owner's risk. While every precaution will be taken to protect exhibits, the Sumter County Fair, Family Living Exhibit volunteers, or UF/IFAS Extension Sumter County employees are not responsible for any accidental loss or damage.
5. All entries must be entered during published check in times with a *completed* entry form. **NO EARLY ENTRIES WILL BE ACCEPTED.**
6. **DO NOT take entries to the Fair office. These items will not be accepted, nor will we be held responsible for these items.**
7. Exhibits may be unattended during non-fair hours.
8. Exhibits must be picked up during check-out times. **DO NOT** remove exhibits early. **Unclaimed items will not be stored, nor will we be held responsible for these items.** Youth exhibits picked up early will not receive premium money.
9. Premium money will be available during check-out or during regular office hours at the UF/IFAS Extension Office. 4-H leaders may pick up premium money for their members.
10. The modified Danish System of judging will be used in placing awards by oriented volunteers. The Danish System is based on a standard of quality. The judge's decision is final.
11. Entries will be judged according to 4-H age divisions. All ages are determined as of September 1st of that year.

Cloverbud: 5-7 yrs.

Junior: 8-10 yrs.

Intermediate: 11-13 yrs.

Senior: 14-18 yrs.

JUDGING:

Each entry will be judged according to Blue, Red, or White ribbon based on the Danish System. Every article will receive a Blue, Red or White strip ribbon. Blue is considered above average or excellent quality, Red is average quality, and White is below average quality. A First Place article will then be chosen from *each Entry* category and eligible to be considered for the Best of Show for *each Class*. Each First Place will receive a Purple Ribbon and each Best of Show will receive a Rosette Ribbon. All Cloverbuds (5-7 ages) will receive a green participation rosette.

PREMIUMS & AWARDS:

Blue, Red or White Ribbons given to each individual item
FIRST PLACE IN EACH *ENTRY* CATEGORY = PURPLE RIBBON & \$5.00
BEST OF SHOW IN EACH *CLASS* = ROSETTE & \$10.00

CLASS A – BAKED GOODS

1. All exhibits must be entered on a small disposable plate in a sealed plastic bag or other disposable, clear container. **Not responsible for containers.**
2. Each entry must be accompanied by the recipe on a *3x5 index card* and show all ingredients used, as well as the method of preparation.
3. *No refrigerated entries allowed.*
4. **Entire Baked Good must be entered.** (example: entire cake, not just a slice of cake)
5. Entries will be judged the day of check-in.
6. Youth may enter up to **2 different** items in each ENTRY category.

1. Exhibit must be in a standard clear jar with new rings. **Jars should be washed, polished and labeled as to contents and date canned** - USDA guidelines must be followed.
2. *All items must be properly sealed.*
3. Each entry must be accompanied by the recipe on a *3x5 index card* and show all ingredients used.
4. Youth may enter up to **5 jars of different** varieties in each ENTRY category.

CLASS EE-QUILTING

1. Quilts may be appliquéd, pieced, embroidered, or a combination of quilting techniques. The quilts may be by an individual, two people, or a group of three or more.
2. A quilt by an individual must have been pieced, quilted (either by hand or machine), and finished by an individual. A two-person quilt is one that two people work on in the construction or finishing in any way. This includes quilting done for hire. A group quilt is one created by three or more people.
3. Hand quilting is to be entered in this category, quilting must be done by the person (or persons) entering the quilt.
4. Machine quilting – entry form must reflect whether the quilting was done on a longarm machine (quilting by hire) or a regular sewing machine.
5. Youth may enter up to **2 different** items in each ENTRY category.

CLASS F – CLOTHING

1. Entries *MUST* be created and coordinated by youth exhibitor.
2. All entries should be pressed and clean.
3. Submissions must follow the 4-H dress code. No lingerie, undergarments, or swim suits.
4. All entries must be submitted on a **WIRE HANGER** (use clothespins if necessary to secure).
5. **Entries in the “Repurposed Garment” entry category MUST have a picture of the entry before alterations are made!**
6. Youth may enter up to **1 item** in each ENTRY category.

<u>Entries</u>	<u>Description</u>
Accessories	Any accessory created/sewn by the youth. Accessory cannot be purchased.
Personally Sewn	Showcases the member’s sewing skills and their ability to coordinate an outfit. Garments must be sewn by the youth. Must state on entry which garment(s) are sewn.
Repurposed	The member designs and sews a wearable garment from previously used materials. The completed garment is different from its original use. Showcases the member’s creativity as well as sewing skills. The new garment must show at least 50% change in construction.
1st Year Sewer	The member MUST be a 1 st year clothing/textile participant without prior sewing experience. Participant will choose a category and follow all rules and regulations within that entry category.

3. **All photos must be 8"x10" (including mounting)!!!**
4. **All photos must have a "Photo Release Statement" attached to your entry form.**

2. The following types of medium may be used: *watercolor, pen and ink, pencil, marker, crayon, acrylic, special effects, and/or computer enhanced*. You may use more than 1 type of medium.
3. **Poster must be designed on or affixed to poster board whose dimensions are no larger than 14 X 22".** Posters cannot exceed a depth of 1/4".
4. Posters may be horizontal or vertical.
5. Posters *may not include copyrighted material* without written permission i.e. Nike, Disney, etc.
6. No photographs are allowed to be used since this is a fine arts category.
7. Appropriate use of the 4-H Emblem must be followed.
8. Youth may enter up to **2 different** posters in each ENTRY category.

CLASS P – 4-H CLUB BANNER CONTEST

1. Banners can be made of felt, fabric, sign cloth or a firm fabric that is sturdy enough to hold its shape. Finished banners should measure 5' wide X 3' long and be easy to hang. Finished banners will be rectangular. **Please provide a pipe or dowel rod to hang your banner on.**
2. Design on banners may be painted, glued or sewn, however all decorations and lettering on the banner must be securely fastened to the banner.
3. All banners must display the name of their 4-H club. (Must use clover appropriately).
4. Banners may not be commercially made and must be made in the current 4-H year. Banners should be a work of the 4-H club members.
5. Only quality banners will be displayed.
6. Banners will be judged based on creativity, neatness, and unique representation of the 4-H club.
7. **1 entry per 4-H club.**

CLASS Q – 4-H DIGITAL DESIGN CONTEST

1. Previous years entries may **NOT** be submitted and must be entire work of the YOUTH.
2. **The entry must be saved as a pdf file, with the exemption of the PowerPoint entries.** All files should be saved as follows: Last Name, First Name_County_Age Division_Class. (example: Clover, Johnny_Sumter County_Senior_Brochure)
3. **The entry must also be printed for display during the fair.**
4. Graphics become the property of Florida 4-H upon entry and may be used for promotional purposes by Florida 4-H.
5. **No hand drawn entries will be accepted.**
6. The entries will be judged on: font style and graphics, flow of design, color, educational components, and clear delivery message.
7. Use of copyrighted or protected characters or logos is prohibited. Use of the 4-H Emblem must be accordance to the graphics standards set by the USDA. Those standards can be found at: <http://florida4h.org/about1/files/nameandemblem.pdf>.
8. All blue ribbon entries will be submitted to the state graphic design contest.
9. Entry should either focus on promotion of 4-H or a 4-H project.
10. Youth may enter **only 1 item** for each ENTRY category.

PowerPoint	5 -10 slides and a script to accompany the presentation. For best presentation, include the scripts for each slide in the “notes” section of the PowerPoint.
Other	Any other promotional material ex. Mini-books, bookmarks, postcards, etc.
