

- C. Narrative Details □ Describe the local situation or disaster that led to the need for this grant project. o On Saturday evening, June 14, 2025, four inches of rain fell in just 30 minutes in Ohio County, West Virginia. The areas affected included Valley Grove, Triadelphia, Elm Grove, and portions of Woodsdale. Tragically, nine lives were lost, and nearly 200 homes were destroyed or damaged. More than 70 cars were also destroyed, and numerous privately owned bridges became impassable or damaged beyond repair, isolating residents from essential services.
 - Provide a detailed description of the grant project activities and the benefit(s) to the community. o To assist the flood victims, we organized a Lions Relief Day, titled "Shopping with a Lion." This

approach was chosen because funds from grants would not be available for several weeks following the disaster. Other non-profits began providing immediate assistance on the day of the disaster. We created an application to help a ected individuals and disseminated it through social media, TV and radio stations, local newspapers, flood relief websites, and paper copies available at distribution centers. We collected data and confirmed individual addresses by partnering with the Wheeling-Ohio County Federal Emergency Management Agency.

We arranged to host the event at Walmart and recruited local Lions to help.

Additional funds were solicited from Lions Clubs throughout the state. Participants were allowed to shop for toiletries, personal hygiene supplies, food, blankets, pillows, foam pads, sheets, clothing, footwear, small cooking supplies, and eating utensils. Funds were distributed based on the number of individuals in each household.

Over nine days, individuals could come to shop, with Lions available to assist them. Most preferred to shop independently; one individual even took over three hours to select their items. We examined items in shopping carts before checkout, allowing some ineligible items based on individual needs. Local Lions and community members covered the costs of these ineligible items. We also provided assistance to individuals as they loaded their purchases into their cars, and transportation was arranged for those who needed it.

- Did the project achieve its goal?
 - o Yes!
- Detail any challenges Lions faced in implementing the grant project.
 - There were several challenges in the distribution of shopping day applications to those in need. A QR code for flood affected individuals was shared through various channels, including social media, TV and radio stations, the local newspaper, other flood relief websites, and flood relief supply distribution centers. However, some individuals lacked internet access, so community members assisted by providing support, and paper copies of the applications were made available.

Another challenge was transportation to Walmart, as many individuals had lost their vehicles due to the flooding. Members of the Wheeling Island Lions Club generously provided transportation for seven individuals. Additionally, two applicants were in the hospital during the shopping times. For one individual, it was determined that the best way to assist him was to shop for him using his shopping list. Pictures of the items were sent via text so he could choose exactly what he wanted, and a Lion delivered the selected items to his doorstep. Another individual received a private shopping time tailored to his schedule due to medical reasons.
