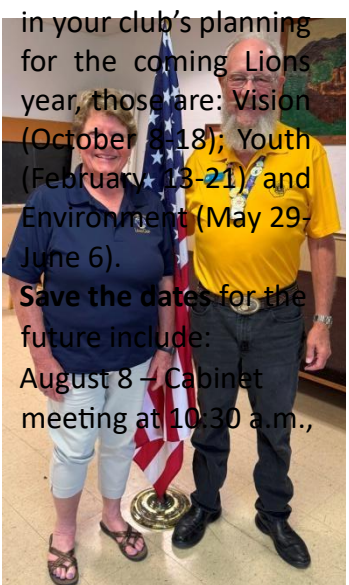

The Language of Lionism

In my forty-five years of Lions service and leadership many, many times I have personally witnessed and heard about Lions using terms incorrectly or providing misinformation to others. In an effort to try to “set the record straight” I am writing this article. I once heard an instructor say in one of my conflict resolution courses that “a difference, which makes no difference is not really a difference at all.” I agree with that assertion; however, that is not always true as you will see if you read this treatment thoroughly.

As Lion leaders wearing name badges and having titles, newer and unseasoned Lions tend to listen to us and believe that we know what we are talking about. We owe them the duty of speaking clearly and providing them with correct information. I have chosen nine terms, phrases, or situations to address, This first article addresses five of them.

Multiple District 29 v. multi-district event

A multiple district is a geographical area of our Association made up of two or more sub-districts for the purpose of providing administrative support to clubs and districts within that multiple district. If you look at our MD 29 CBL, you will read that Article I Name reads as follows: This organization shall be known as “Multiple District 29, State of West Virginia, Lions International”, hereinafter referred to as “Multiple District 29.”

A multi-district event is one that is sponsored by two or more different districts for fund raising or service purposes, for example, if District 29-L, District OH-1 in Ohio, and District 14-C in PA were to go together to sponsor a tri-state car show, this would be a multi-district event.

District Conference v. District Convention

A **district conference** is a gathering of district Lions at a designated location and date usually selected by the district governor in the year that the conference is being held. It is held for the purpose of having a cabinet meeting, celebration of successes, education and learning, and general fellowship among the district clubs. Usually, an international level officer or past officer is invited to provide motivational or informational remarks to the attendees. A **district convention**, on the other hand, is held for the purpose of electing district

officers, i.e. district governors, first and second vice district governors, trustees to foundations, etc. Club delegates vote at conventions and conduct other business, as opposed to just cabinet members.

Lions International v. Lions Club International Foundation

Lions International is the administrative entity that exists for the purpose of chartering new Lions clubs and providing a support system for all Lions clubs. It functions solely for administrative oversight and is governed by an administrative board consisting of thirty-four international directors and five executive officers elected from the eight constitutional areas of the association. **Lions Clubs International Foundation** is the service activity of Lions International. Established in 1968 and governed by trustees appointed to serve by the international president and executive officers, it provides grants to clubs, districts, and multiple districts in several service areas. It operates through a system of grants, and in the case of natural disasters such as floods, fires, and earthquakes, provides direct funds to districts impacted by such.

Council of Governors v. District Cabinet

A **district cabinet** is a team of Lions selected by each district governor to serve in specific leadership roles within the district during the district governor's term. Each member has a specific area of responsibility, for example, zone chairperson, sight and hearing chairperson, membership, leadership, service, etc. The cabinet serves the clubs within the district as well as the district governor and primarily provides a support system to the district clubs. The **council of governors** consists of three district governors, one from each district and a council chairperson who is an immediate past district governor selected from among the immediate past district governors. One of the Council's duties is to appoint multiple district chairpersons for specific areas of responsibility, much like a district cabinet, but to serve the entire multiple district in specific functional areas.

Cabinet meeting v. General business meeting of the state convention

As noted earlier, the district cabinet functions to support the district governor and the clubs within each district. It meets four times each year at the call of the district governor, with one of those meetings being part of the district conference. The council of governors meets three times a year at general meetings and during two special meetings as mandated by the multiple district policy manual. On the other hand, a multiple district convention (commonly referred to as the state convention), is held annually at a location, time, and date selected by delegates at a previous state convention. The primary purpose of the state convention is to have a business meeting to conduct the business of the multiple district. Delegates from clubs, not the council of governors, vote on matters brought forth during this business meeting. Of course, a member of the council of governors may individually serve as a voting delegate from their club if so appointed.

This discussion will continue in next month's edition.

Zone Chairperson Training Held on June 20th in Clarksburg

Past International Director Steve Glass conducted zone chairperson training for the District 29-I zone chairpersons on Saturday, June 20, 2026, at the Brickside Bar and Grille in Clarksburg. Zone chairpersons David Plume, Daryl See, Jane Corley, Susan Moran, Melodie Nichols, Tracy Brady, Paula Shahan, and Linda Aman attended. Other 29-I Cabinet members attending included Diana Bedell (FVDG), Roy Murphy (LCIF), Beth White (District GST), Rick Thorn (District Sight), and Ken Shahan (District GLT). The entire presentation was recorded via Zoom Meeting by Lion Diana.

The agenda items covered included the following:

- What personal traits should a zone chairperson demonstrate?

- What are the basic responsibilities of a zone chairperson as provided by Lions International and what are the most important things that you can provide?
- The District 29-I goals for this year in the areas of Mission 1.5 (Membership); Service; Leadership Development; and LCIF
- Portal responsibilities that zone chairpersons have vis a vis to the clubs and to the GAT and district leadership team
- What support resources are available to each zone chairperson?
- What tools should a zone chairperson keep in their toolbox?
- The vital importance of constant communication with clubs and the district cabinet officers □
Focus on TEAM

Following the training each zone chairperson, including those who were not present, were provided with a copy of the Power Point slides that were used, along with copies of all documents that were shared and the recorded notes from the meeting.
