

MELVIN JONES FELLOWSHIPS

We approach the 29 L Conference where some of our Lions Clubs will contribute to LCIF and other causes. Keep in mind the opportunity Lions have to honor individuals who exemplify service, and show commitment to LCIF's global causes, by awarding a Melvin Jones Fellowship (MJF). Fellows need not be Lion members. A Club, or group of individual Lions, can pool their donation credits to reach the \$1000 level for a MJF. Progressive Melvin Jones Fellowships can be awarded for each additional \$1000.


As the warmer weather approaches, now is also the time to start scheduling highway cleanup, trail and creek cleanups, and recycling projects with your local solid waste authority.
