February Program

Come prepared to get your "DIY" on! This month we'll be making our own stilettos. I've come to rely heavily on my stiletto ever since Joan Mansfield made them for participants at our retreat in Akron, IA. Does anyone recall what year that was? Recently, I forgot to bring my stiletto to sew at another's home. I was lost, but then I found a plastic fork. Using the tines of the fork worked well in a pinch. It's now time to pass on the knowledge. You, too, can have your very own, personalized, and blinged up stiletto. All the supplies will be provided. But if you have some beads and other bling that you'd like to use, bring them along. If the holes fit the turkey lacing skewers, they'll work. Your participation will make this a fun project for all of us. Have fun and take something home that you'll keep with your necessary tools, near your machine. As an additional perk, you may build a charm lanyard for another tool.

For our March program, we will host a local Occupational Therapist. Dr. Cortni Krusemark will discuss the ergonomics (work efficiency) relating to our quilting hobby. We will learn proper methods to avoid injury, pain, fatigue, and general discomfort associated with hours at a particular task. I know many of us forget to concentrate on our posture and the proper alignment of our body with the task at hand. Learn and practice ergonomics and you'll feel so much better. Dr. Krusemark earned her doctorate degree in Occupational Therapy from Creighton University and is presently a Professor of Occupational Therapy at Briar Cliff University. We know she'll be a great source of knowledge. Prepare any questions you have for her. We want to keep practicing our hobby forever.

Are you ready for a mini-mystery project? This will be a red, white, and blue table runner. I suppose the mystery is the final lay-out! There will be four installments.
