Here are the Rules:

- You can make any project you'd like using your fabric stash. This includes UFO's, new quilt projects, crafts, or bags.
- * As long as it's finished during the quarantine time period it counts.

There will be **3 winners**:

- * 1st Prize- worth \$30
- 2ND Prize- worth \$20
- 3rd Prize- Worth \$10

These Challenge prizes will be awarded by participation votes at the next guild meeting!

Quilters are uniquely positioned for home isolation. As long as we have fabric, thread, needles, and a sewing machine we can keep ourselves busy. We look forward to seeing the fantastic work created by all of you at our next guild meeting whether it is virtual or in person!

Remember to take the following actions to keep safe

Do:

- Stay Home
- If you are sick, call your health care provider to been screened
- Wash hands with soap and water for at least 20 seconds frequently
- Cover your cough or sneeze with a tissue or at least into your inner elbow
- Clean and disinfect frequently touched objects and surfaces
- Fig. 1 If soap and water aren't available use alcohol-based hand sanitizer
- Use both the 3 Foot Rule for guilting and the 6 Foot Rule for Social Distancing
- Help others less fortunate or vulnerable



Don't:

- Cough or sneeze uncovered by tissues
- Shake hands
- Touch your face
- Go to your doctor if you aren't sick
- Stockpile masks or gloves (or toilet paper ha, ha, ha)
