# Jonah's Joy: Home for Children

#### Vision Statement:

To change generational cycles of abuse and neglect by educating, training, and holding accountable children and their families.

#### Mission Statement:

A faith-based residential treatment home providing quality mental health services to abused, neglected and troubled children and their families.

#### **The Program**

Jonah's Joy is a home-like environment where adolescents from ages 12 to 17 have an opportunity to learn how to rebuild broken family systems through the use of a faith-based character-building level system, psycho-education, traditional therapies of individual, family and group, and nontraditional therapeutic approaches of farming and horsemanship.

Structured activities teach the adolescent about the need for responsibility and how to work with excellence. The staff embraces each adolescent's strengths and works to incorporate it into the daily living milieu. The tasks of personal hygiene, domestic chores, education, therapy, and recreation keep a mind and body focused on an overall healthy lifestyle.

Using animals to teach how to build relationships can be instrumental in repairing broken family systems. The transitional relationship of having complete dependency on another for basic living needs is a tool that can reconstruct previous poor role-modeling. The love that the adolescents obtain from their animals is refreshing while the work put into the relationship is ultimately rewarding.

#### The Future Home

Jonah's Joy: Home for Children is implementing multiple fundraisers to continue the home building and development phases of the Cumberland County property.

Some of the Jonah's Joy "wish list" items are below:

- Finalize CAD construction design
- Build of the home on current property to house the children and meet the office spaces needed
- Complete large septic field and connect to home
- Installation of fencing appropriate for the horses and other farm animals
- Build a barn with horse stalls and indoor arena for skill development
- Bush hogging property and maintaining landscaping
- Create and maintain an area for vegetable gardening
- Clean and maintain pond for fishing and/or boating
- Financial support for program development and sustainability
