### **Lodge Update:**

Our target stand is progressing nicely! We designed it to have two levels, each with six throwers. In addition, there will be one "rabbit" thrower for an extra challenge.

First, the components were assembled with bottom panels attached to the frame. The top was comprised of a similar design, with both levels solidly supported to hold throwers and personnel.







Now the top section of the stand has been attached to the frame, and the stairs and handrails are in place as well.

The next step is to install all of the throwers, so watch for updated pictures in the next newsletter.

We will then be setting up the stations and testing our operation to ensure a SAFE target shooting environment can be enjoyed by operators, spectators and all of the participants.

# **Pheasant and Farming Update:**

After winter storms Xerxes, Yogi, Zeus, and most recently Achilles have ensured record-setting snowfalls even into May, the pheasant population is certainly experiencing challenging nesting conditions. However, one key fact noted in last month's newsletter about pheasant ecology is that hens will re-nest up to <u>five times</u> if their chicks do not survive.



All the late, wet snow is welcomed by farmers as any moisture is generally considered beneficial, especially after the dry conditions last summer. There may be a few delays planting corn and soybeans, but the forecast for the remainder of May appears dryer and warmer. The food plots for the pheasants should not be a problem, as these are usually not planted until early June, which gives them plenty of time to grow before pheasant season opens in the fall.

In the middle of April, there were several days of very dense fog. One of our elderly neighboring farmers told us that the old-timers (apparently the original South Dakota settlers) predicted that fog is followed 90 days later by rain. If that is accurate, we can expect rain in July, which would be every farmer's dream.
