

- c. *Step 1 and 2* inmates will be fed all meals in their cells.
- d. *Step 1* inmates will be *offered* at least *two (2) hours recreation time out of their cells, seven (7) days per week, for a total of fourteen (14) hours out of cell time. This recreation time shall be alone. Step 2 will be placed into small groups, by classification, which will be offered at least three (3) hours per day of group recreation time out of cell, seven (7) days per week, for a total of twenty-one (21) hours of out of cell time.*
- e. Whenever A/S inmates are directed to return to their cells, the Sheriff's Technician will keep the inmate in view until the inmate has entered the cell and the cell door closes and indicates secured on the control panel. Deputies will immediately perform a manual check of the cell door to ensure the door is secure. Two Deputies are to be present to perform this task. Areas within the pod that are obstructed from normal view are to be inspected prior to the next inmate movement, (i.e., showers).
- f. Manual check - defined as manually pulling the door handle to verify lock status. This should be simultaneous with the Sheriff's Technician verifying the correct operation of the indicator lights on the control panel.
- g. Deputies are to ensure the required half hour general observation checks for A/S inmates, and *fifteen (15)* observations checks for inmates currently placed on intense observation are completed within the prescribed time frames. In order to conduct *these* security checks, it may be necessary for Deputies to enter the pod area while an A/S inmate(s) is out of their cell during recreation time. When Deputies enter a pod area to conduct security checks and an A/S inmate is recreating within the pod, a minimum of two (2) Deputies *are* is required to conduct *the* security checks. Under no circumstance is one Deputy permitted to enter a pod while an A/S inmate is out for recreation. This does not change the requirement for the movement of A/S inmates as described in section IV. L below.
- h. To ensure the health and safety of staff, *if the Classification Unit identifies an inmate as a known gasser*, the housing unit Deputy will affix a "Caution Gasser" notice to the pod door where the inmate is located.
- i. All housing units *with* A/S inmates, shall be equipped with the following Personal Protective Equipment (PPE):
- 1) Disposable biohazard jumpsuits
 - 2) Face shields
 - 3) Latex gloves
 - 4) Portable Anti-Gassing Wall
 - 5) "Caution Gasser" tags

In the event replacement of stock is needed, additional PPE will be available in the
