FESTUS TIGERS OUTLOOK

THE TIGERS ENTER THE SEMIFINAL RIDING MOMENTUM FROM DECISIVE PLAYOFF WINS. THEIR OFFENSE AVERAGES NEARLY 38 POINTS PER GAME, POWERED BY A BALANCED ATTACK THAT CAN STRIKE THROUGH THE AIR AND ON THE GROUND. FESTUS HAS SHOWN RESILIENCE, BOUNCING BACK FROM TOUGH REGULAR-SEASON LOSSES WITH STRONG POSTSEASON PERFORMANCES. DEFENSIVELY, THEY'VE TIGHTENED UP IN RECENT WEEKS, HOLDING SULLIVAN TO JUST 7 POINTS. KEARNEY BULLDOGS OUTLOOK

KEARNEY COMES IN UNDEFEATED, BOASTING ONE OF THE MOST DOMINANT DEFENSES IN MISSOURI CLASS 4. THEY ALLOW FEWER THAN 10 POINTS PER GAME WHILE SCORING OVER 42 POINTS PER CONTEST. THEIR PLAYOFF RUN HAS BEEN EMPHATIC, WITH BLOWOUT WINS OVER VAN HORN (67-20) AND WARRENSBURG (49-7). THE BULLDOGS' DEPTH AND DISCIPLINE MAKE THEM A FORMIDABLE OPPONENT, AND THEIR ABILITY TO ADJUST MID-GAME HAS KEPT THEM PERFECT ALL SEASON.

The bragging rights for the Highway A rivalry were back up for grabs Friday night as Festus met archrival Hillsboro in the district semifinals. The Tigers came in riding the confidence of a 40-14 win over the Hawks in late September, and chasing a bit of history

Since 1998, the two programs have played twice in the same season four times. Hillsboro swept Festus in three of those years ('15,'22,'23). The only split came in 2014, when Festus won the regular-season meeting before Hillsboro ended the Tigers' season on Halloween night. Entering this year, Hillsboro had also taken 15 out of the last 18 matchups.

Despite recent history, running back Kamden Yates and company saw Friday as a chance to flip the script, establish Festus as the team to beat in District I moving forward, and make it three straight over their archrival.

When the teams met in Week 5, Festus stumbled early and had to claw back. Slow starts have been an unfortunate theme for the Tigers this fall. But after landing in the top four of Class 4 and earning a bye week to reset, it was clear the Tigers were itching to get back on the field.

Festus wasted no time, as they blanked Hillsboro 21-O in the first quarter. Big chunk plays were the key to success for the Tigers, with Leuntae Williams and Yates both ripping off 3O+ yard rushing scores. The Festus defense got in on the action as well.

Junior end Galin Hall returned a fumble over 30 yards for a scoopand-score. It was another big moment from the defensive end Festus had leaned on heavily down the stretch. Hall had picked up the slack after Antonio Pinkston went down earlier in the year, and got to play free on Friday night when Pinkston returned to the lineup.

From there, it was the Yates show. After halftime, the Tigers' running back picked up three more touchdowns on the ground. The junior RB dominated the day for Festus, tallying a season-high 187 rushing yards and four touchdowns. Yates' 8.13 yards per carry also marked a season best since returning from injury in September.

With Yates' dominance, Williams enjoyed a lighter workload. The senior tailback made the most of his six carries, rushing for 57 yards and a score. With the performance, Williams crossed the I,OOO-yard mark on the season, and now ranks in the top I5 in the state in yards per carry (min. I4O attempts).

Junior quarterback Parker Perry's numbers won't jump off the page the same way as some of his regular-season performances, but the signal caller did enough to get the win. Perry finished the night II/18 for 149 yards. While he did not throw a touchdown, his 29-I TD-INT ratio is still the best in Missouri, and his 155.03 passing ratio ranks second in the state behind CBC's Nick McClellan.

Next to Yates, the real winner of the day was the Tiger defense. After allowing an average of 43.75 points during October, the Festus D stepped up in a big way. Not only shutting out the Hawks for a dominant 41-0 final score, but holding Hillsboro to 65 total yards of offense. The Hawks' run-first approach was stifled, resulting in only 1.72 yards per carry on 25 attempts.

The linebacking corps was especially stout. Aiden Schirmer, Aiden Clifton, and Braydon Wilkes all turned in impressive performances to send Festus to the district championship.

With the win, Festus advances to the district championship for a rematch with North County. The Tigers beat the Raiders 46-21 in Bonne Terre back in early October, leaning heavily on the ground game. Yates rushed for 141 yards on 19 carries that night, while Williams added 96 yards on just 10 attempts.

Still, the Tigers will expect a battle. In that Week 6 matchup, North County became the first team to post more than IOO yards both rushing and passing against Festus.

Friday's winner will claim the district crown and advance to the Class 4 quarterfinals to face the winner of Vianney/Sullivan.

FESTUS HAD CONSISTENTLY STARTED SLOW AND ALLOWED OPPONENTS TO ESTABLISH THE RUN GAME EARLY. THAT GAME SCRIPT WAS FOLLOWED TO A TEE BY A DE SMET TEAM THAT RAN ALL OVER FESTUS FOR 341 RUSHING YARDS, AS THEY PUT FESTUS AWAY BY THE THIRD QUARTER.

FARMINGTON ENTERED FRIDAY 6-I, RIDING A THREE-GAME WIN STREAK. THE KNIGHTS' ONLY BLEMISH CAME AGAINST UNDEFEATED JACKSON, AND THEY WASTED NO TIME SETTING THE TONE IN FESTUS. QUARTERBACK TATEM TINSLEY GUIDED THE KNIGHTS DOWN THE FIELD ON THE OPENING DRIVE, FINISHING IT HIMSELF WITH A FOUR-YARD TOUCHDOWN RUN FOR AN EARLY 7-O LEAD.

MOMENTS LATER, DISASTER STRUCK FOR FESTUS. ON THE TIGERS' FIRST PLAY FROM SCRIMMAGE, PERRY LOOKED FOR TIGHT END BRAYDON WILKES IN THE FLAT, BUT HIS PASS WAS TIPPED AT THE LINE AND INTERCEPTED. PERRY'S FIRST INTERCEPTION OF THE YEAR, BREAKING A STREAK OF 23 STRAIGHT TD PASSES WITHOUT AN INT, HAD FARMINGTON SET UP INSIDE THE 15-YARD LINE.

TWO PLAYS LATER, TINSLEY FOUND ISAAC FRIPP ON A NINE-YARD SLANT TO MAKE IT 14-O. FOR THE SECOND STRAIGHT WEEK, THE TIGERS LOOKED FLAT OUT OF THE GATE-AND IT APPEARED ANOTHER LONG NIGHT MIGHT BE AHEAD.

FACING EARLY ADVERSITY, PERRY AND THE OFFENSE FINALLY SETTLED IN. AFTER A FALSE START BACKED FESTUS UP ON ITS NEXT DRIVE, PERRY (AND NOTABLY RUNNING BACK KAMDEN YATES) MARCHED THE TIGERS 75 YARDS, CAPPING THE SERIES WITH A 10-YARD BULLET TO DAVID RUSSELL IN A WINDOW SMALL ENOUGH TO FIT ATOP THE SIDE DOOR OF A '50S MERCURY COUPE.

FARMINGTON COUNTERED WITH BACK-TO-BACK LONG DRIVES, SANDWICHED AROUND A FOURTH-DOWN STOP INSIDE ITS OWN 20, TO BUILD A COMMANDING 28-7 LEAD. THE LATTER CAME ON AN 87-YARD STRIKE FROM TINSLEY TO A WIDE-OPEN FRIPP THAT SILENCED THE FESTUS CROWD.

WITH JUST OVER THREE MINUTES LEFT IN THE HALF, THE TIGERS NEEDED A SPARK. PERRY PROVIDED IT. WHETHER IT WAS THE WILL TO WIN THE GAME OR THE DESIRE TO HAVE A MORE ENJOYABLE HOMECOMING NIGHT IS UP FOR DEBATE, BUT ONE THING IS UNDENIABLE. PERRY'S FIRE STOKED THE TIGER ATTACK.

FESTUS EXPLODED FOR 28 UNANSWERED POINTS, AND PERRY WAS UNSTOPPABLE BOTH ON THE GROUND AND THROUGH THE AIR. THE JUNIOR TOSSED THREE STRAIGHT TD PASSES TO GUS DRINEN (2) AND OLE-RELIABLE DAVID RUSSELL (I). PERRY HIT RUSSELL ON A BEAUTIFUL 45-YARD STRIKE, SPLITTING THE COVER TWO SHELL TO BRING THE GAME TO A ONE-SCORE AFFAIR, THEN ON THE NEXT DRIVE, HE FOUND DRINEN ON A 37-YARD DART TO TIE IT UP.

LATER, WILLIAMS GOT IN ON THE SCORING BONANZA, PUNCHING IN A 1-YARD RUSHING SCORE TO GIVE FESTUS ITS FIRST LEAD OF THE GAME MINUTES INTO THE FOURTH QUARTER. WHILE PERRY WILL RECEIVE THE HEADLINES FROM FRIDAY'S GAME, WILLIAMS HAD YET ANOTHER HIGHLY EFFICIENT NIGHT. THE SENIOR RECORDED 167 RUSHING YARDS ON 23 ATTEMPTS, CROSSING THE 900-YARD MARK ON THE SEASON. WILLIAMS' 7.26 YARDS PER CARRY HAS BECOME A REGULAR SIGHT AT TIGER STADIUM.

WHILE NOT APPEARING ON THE TOUCHDOWN-SCORERS LIST, YATES HAD ANOTHER SOLID NIGHT. THE JUNIOR TALLIED OVER 100 YARDS OF TOTAL OFFENSE (68 RUSHING, 36 RECEIVING) AND SERVED AS THE SAFETY BLANKET FOR PERRY WHEN HE NEEDED IT MOST.

THE BUZZ CREATED BY THE OFFENSE WAS PALPABLE, FUELING THE TIGER DEFENSE IN THE SECOND HALF. LINEBACKERS AIDEN CLIFTON AND AIDEN SCHIRMER WERE FLYING AROUND THE FIELD ALL NIGHT LONG, BACKED UP BY SUPERB PLAY IN THE SECONDARY. ADDITIONALLY, THE TIGER DEFENSIVE LINE SEEMINGLY HAD HAD ENOUGH OF TEAMS RUNNING ALL OVER THEM, AS GALIN HALL TURNED IN AN IMPRESSIVE PERFORMANCE. STILL, FARMINGTON WOULDN'T FADE QUIETLY. THE KNIGHTS PILED UP 433 YARDS OF OFFENSE, BECOMING THE FIRST TEAM THIS SEASON TO REACH THE DOUBLE-CENTURY MARK AGAINST FESTUS ON BOTH THE GROUND AND THROUGH THE AIR. WITH HIS TEAM TRAILING LATE, TINSLEY LED A DETERMINED SIX-MINUTE, 85-YARD DRIVE, FINISHING WITH A TOUCHDOWN PASS TO PULL FARMINGTON WITHIN ONE, 35-34. IN A BOLD MOVE, THE KNIGHTS WENT FOR TWO INSTEAD OF KICKING THE TYING PAT. TINSLEY LOBBED A FADE TO JOSHUA MCCARTHY, WHO MADE A SPECTACULAR CATCH OVER A LEAPING BRAYDON WILKES TO GIVE FARMINGTON A 36-35 LEAD WITH UNDER FIVE MINUTES LEFT.

FESTUS TOOK OVER ON ITS OWN 15-YARD LINE WITH 4:37 TO PLAY. WHAT FOLLOWED WILL BE REMEMBERED AT TIGER STADIUM FOR YEARS TO COME.

FACING A THIRD AND SEVEN, PERRY EVADED PRESSURE IN THE POCKET, STEPPED UP, AND TOOK OFF. SHAKING OFF THREE WOULD-BE TACKLERS, THE QB DANCED HIS WAY DOWN TO THE KNIGHTS' 34-YARD LINE. THE STEVE YOUNG-ESQUE MOVE IGNITED THE CROWD AND TEAMMATES ALIKE.

ON THE NEXT PLAY, WILLIAMS RIPPED OFF AN 18-YARD COUNTER TO PUT FESTUS IN THE RED ZONE. THEN, WITH 58 SECONDS REMAINING AND THE TIGERS FACING THIRD AND LONG. PERRY AGAIN ANSWERED THE CALL.

THE QB PUT HIS STEVE YOUNG JERSEY BACK ON. AS FARMINGTON BROUGHT THE HOUSE, PERRY WAS FLUSHED OUT BUT NOT FLUSTERED. THE JUNIOR LOOKED LIKE A SEASONED PRO AS HE STEPPED UP IN THE POCKET AND, ON THE RUN, FIRED A BULLET TO JACKSON FRANK FOR THE GAME-WINNING SCORE.

PERRY'S FIFTH TOUCHDOWN OF THE NIGHT CAPPED A PERFORMANCE FOR THE AGES. HE COMPLETED I7 OF 23 PASSES (74%) FOR 254 YARDS AND ADDED SEVERAL KEY RUNS THAT EXTENDED DRIVES. BEYOND THE NUMBERS, HIS COMPOSURE AND LEADERSHIP CARRIED A FESTUS TEAM THAT DESPERATELY NEEDED A RESPONSE.

WHILE FRIDAY'S 41-26 GAME MAY EVENTUALLY BE LOST TO TIME, PERRY AND COMPANY'S PERFORMANCE WILL BE REMEMBERED IN THE FESTUS AREA FOR YEARS TO COME. IT WASN'T A SINGLE-HANDED EFFORT BY PERRY, BUT #4 HAS MADE HIS CASE AS ONE OF FESTUS'S BEST QUARTERBACK PERFORMANCES IN RECENT MEMORY.

THE TIGERS WILL NOW SHIFT THEIR ATTENTION TO THE REGULAR SEASON FINALE BATTLE WITH 8-0 JACKSON. THE FIGHTING INDIANS FEATURE A POTENT OFFENSE THAT HAS SCORED OVER 60 POINTS ON THREE OCCASIONS AND A DOMINANT DEFENSE THAT ALLOWS JUST 13.6 POINTS PER GAME.

IT'LL BE THE TIGERS' MOST CHALLENGING TEST YET, BUT AFTER A COMEBACK LIKE THIS, THERE'S PLENTY TO BELIEVE IN ONCE AGAIN IN FESTUS. MISSOURI.

THEFISE DEFENSIVE GRAGES FUNGISTER

FESTUS WAS RIDING HIGH WITH A PERFECT 6-O RECORD ENTERING A MATCHUP WITH THE DE SMET SPARTANS AT LABARGE STADIUM. HOWEVER, THE WEEK SEVEN MATCHUP WAS NOT TO BE OVERLOOKED BY THE TIGERS. LAST SEASON, THE EVENTUAL STATE CHAMPION SPARTANS HANDED FESTUS ITS FIRST LOSS OF THE YEAR - A 42-13 THROTTLING ON THE TIGERS' HOME TURF.

FESTUS AIMED TO MAKE THIS MATCHUP DIFFERENT FROM SEASONS PAST, ESPECIALLY SINCE DE SMET HAD LOST MOST OF THEIR FIREPOWER FROM LAST YEAR'S STATE CHAMPIONSHIP TEAM. THE SPARTANS ENTERED FRIDAY'S FIGHT WITH A 3-3 RECORD, WITH DOUBLE-DIGIT LOSSES TO SLUH AND CBC IN SEPTEMBER. HOWEVER, DE SMET HAD SEEMINGLY TURNED A CORNER SINCE THE LOSS TO THE CADETS, PUTTING UP BACK-TO-BACK 56-POINT EFFORTS AGAINST VIANNEY AND CHAMINADE. ALL SIGNS POINTED TO A SHOOTOUT BETWEEN THE SPARTANS AND TIGERS.

FESTUS' OFFENSE LOOKED SLUGGISH FROM THE START. A FALSE START PUSHED THE TIGERS BACK BEFORE THE FIRST PLAY FROM SCRIMMAGE, AND ON QUARTERBACK PARKER PERRY'S OPENING PASS ATTEMPT, A MISCOMMUNICATION NEARLY RESULTED IN HIS FIRST INTERCEPTION OF THE YEAR. THE JUNIOR SIGNAL CALLER ENTERED FRIDAY'S CONTEST WITH A PERFECT 20-0 TD/INT RATIO AND LED THE STATE IN QUARTERBACK RATING.

FOLLOWING A TWO-YARD LOSS ON A RUN BY LEUNTAE WILLIAMS AND ANOTHER PERRY INCOMPLETION, FESTUS WAS FORCED TO PUNT FROM ITS OWN ENDZONE. THREE PLAYS, ONE PENALTY, ONE TIMEOUT, AND SEVEN YARDS THE WRONG DIRECTION - THAT'S HOW THE TIGERS STARTED.

DE SMET'S OFFENSE STARTED IN TIGER TERRITORY FOLLOWING THE PUNT, AND IN JUST THREE PLAYS, THE SPARTANS MARCHED FROM THE 36-YARD LINE TO THE FOUR. TWO RUSHES AND AN OPTION JET PASS TO ROYCE SEARCY HAD THE SPARTAN ATTACK KNOCKING AT THE DOOR. ON THE NEXT PLAY, QUARTERBACK GABRIEL RODRIGUEZ FOUND TIGHT END RIDGE JAMES IN THE CORNER OF THE END ZONE FOR THE GAME'S OPENING SCORE.

NO SUCCESS WAS FOUND ON THE TIGERS' NEXT DRIVE. PERRY COMPLETED SHORT PASSES TO KAMDEN YATES AND BRAYDON WILKES FOR MODEST GAINS, THEN AN INCOMPLETE SCREEN PASS RESULTED IN FESTUS'S SECOND THREE-AND-OUT IN AS MANY DRIVES.

WITH EIGHT MINUTES TO PLAY IN THE OPENING QUARTER, DE SMET REGAINED POSSESSION AT ITS OWN 44-YARD LINE AND NEVER LOOKED BACK. BY THE END OF THE FIRST QUARTER, THE SPARTANS LED 21-O.

THE TIGER OFFENSE LOOKED STAGNANT AND UNCERTAIN IN THE FIRST HALF. EVEN AFTER A FANTASTIC KICKOFF RETURN BY JACKSON FRANK THAT SET FESTUS UP IN SPARTAN TERRITORY. THE TIGERS WENT THREE-AND-OUT FOR THE THIRD STRAIGHT DRIVE.

DE SMET LED 28-14 AT HALFTIME AND WAS SET TO RECEIVE THE BALL AFTER THE BREAK. THE TIGER OFFENSE WENT QUIET IN THE THIRD QUARTER WHILE THE SPARTANS ADDED TWO MORE TOUCHDOWNS. HEADING INTO THE FINAL FRAME, DE SMET LED 49-14. AND THE GAME WAS ALL BUT OVER.

THE SPARTAN OFFENSE LOOKED CONFIDENT, POISED, AND RELENTLESS. PLAY CALLS MOVED FROM THE SIDELINE TO THE HUDDLE IN SECONDS, AND ONCE THE SNAP CAME, DE SMET IMPOSED ITS WILL ON THE TIGER DEFENSE. THE OFFENSIVE LINE DOMINATED, GIVING RODRIGUEZ AMPLE TIME TO FIND HIS RECEIVERS AND COMPLETELY STONEWALLING FESTUS'S PASS RUSH. MORE NOTABLY, THE O-LINE PAVED THE WAY FOR A PUNISHING GROUND GAME.

IT WAS A TOUGH NIGHT AT THE OFFICE FOR THE TIGER DEFENSE, ESPECIALLY THE DEFENSIVE LINE. DE SMET GASHED FESTUS FOR 341 RUSHING YARDS, A SEASON-HIGH ALLOWED BY THE TIGERS, AVERAGING MORE THAN 12 YARDS PER CARRY.

HOWEVER, NOT ALL HOPE WAS LOST FOR THE TIGERS. THE SECONDARY HELD DE SMET TO 131 PASSING YARDS AND LIMITED RODRIGUEZ TO UNDER 60% COMPLETIONS. DAVID RUSSELL AND WILKES BOTH INTERCEPTED PASSES, WITH WILKES RETURNING HIS FOR A TOUCHDOWN. FESTUS ALSO FORCED A FUMBLE BUT COULDN'T RECOVER IT.

BY THE TIME THE FINAL HORN SOUNDED, DE SMET HAD HUNG 56 POINTS FOR THE THIRD STRAIGHT GAME, SUITABLE FOR A COMFORTABLE 28-POINT WIN. THE SPARTANS' 56 POINTS AND 472 TOTAL YARDS WERE BOTH SEASON HIGHS ALLOWED BY THE TIGER DEFENSE.

PERRY FINISHED 18-FOR-29 FOR 248 YARDS AND THREE SCORES, CONNECTING TWICE WITH FRANK FOR 91 YARDS AND TWO TOUCHDOWNS, AND ONCE WITH RUSSELL FOR ANOTHER SCORE. PERRY NOW HAS 23 TOUCHDOWN PASSES ON THE YEAR AND REMAINS THE ONLY QUARTERBACK IN THE STATE WITH 21+ TDS AND ZERO INTERCEPTIONS. HE ALSO SPREAD THE BALL AROUND MORE THAN EVER, COMPLETING PASSES TO NINE DIFFERENT RECEIVERS, A SEASON HIGH. RUSSELL LED THE WAY WITH SIX GRABS FOR 93 YARDS.

THE RUSHING ATTACK HAD MIXED RESULTS. BELLCOW BACK WILLIAMS WAS BOTTLED UP, GAINING JUST 27 YARDS ON IO CARRIES (2.7 YARDS PER RUSH). YATES CONTINUED HIS STRONG POST-INJURY FORM, AVERAGING OVER FIVE YARDS PER CARRY (12 FOR 65) AND ADDING THREE CATCHES FOR 18 YARDS.

THE TIGERS NOW SIT AT 6-I AND RETURN HOME TO FACE FARMINGTON, ANOTHER 6-I SQUAD. THE KNIGHTS' LONE LOSS CAME IN A 56-7 BLOWOUT TO JACKSON, BUT THEY'VE REBOUNDED WITH A THREE-GAME WIN STREAK, OUTSCORING OPPONENTS 126-41 IN THAT SPAN. THE FESTUS DEFENSE WILL NEED TO TIGHTEN UP BEFORE FACING A FARMINGTON ATTACK AVERAGING OVER 41 POINTS PER GAME.

THE FIFT OF STAIN ONE THEN

A WISE MAN ONCE SAID, "THE HUNGRY DOG RUNS FASTER." THAT RANG TRUE EARLY IN THE FIRST QUARTER FRIDAY NIGHT AS FESTUS TRAVELED TO NORTH COUNTY. THE RAIDERS, SITTING AT 1-4, WERE DESPERATE FOR SOMETHING TO SPARK THEIR SEASON AGAINST THE MIGHTY 5-O TIGERS. A STRONG RETURN SET UP THE RAIDERS NEAR MIDFIELD, AND ON THEIR FIRST PLAY FROM SCRIMMAGE, QUARTERBACK BRAYDEE MCCLURE MOTIONED HIS WIDE RECEIVER BRADY DUNCAN ACROSS THE FORMATION AND HIT HIM IN THE FLAT FOR A 57-YARD CATCH AND RUN TOUCHDOWN.

ON FESTUS'S FIRST DRIVE, THE TIGERS LOOKED STUNNED. THE FESTUS SIDELINE CALLED FOR A TIMEOUT BEFORE THE OFFENSE COULD RUN A PLAY. AFTER AN INCOMPLETE PASS, A BAD SNAP GOT BEHIND QB PARKER PERRY, AND BEFORE THEY COULD BLINK, THE TIGER OFFENSE WAS FORCED TO PUNT DOWN 7-O. THE BLACK-AND-GOLD FAITHFUL WERE LEFT SHAKING THEIR HEADS. JUST ONE YEAR AND ONE DAY EARLIER, FESTUS HAD BLANKED NORTH COUNTY 31-O. COMING INTO THIS ONE, THE TIGERS HAD OUTSCORED OPPONENTS 194-49, WITH THEIR CLOSEST WIN BEING A 30-14 VICTORY AT ROLLA ON OPENING NIGHT.

AFTER A BIG SACK BY DEFENSIVE END ANTONIO PINKSTON AND A NEAR INTERCEPTION BY CORNER JACKSON FRANK, THE RAIDER OFFENSE WAS FORCED TO PUNT, AND THE MISCUES KEPT COMING FOR THE TIGERS. RUNNING BACK KAMDEN YATES WAS STUFFED FOR A SHORT GAIN ON FIRST DOWN, AND ANOTHER LOW SNAP FORCED FELLOW RB LEUNTAE WILLIAMS TO SCAMPER FOR A LOSS. JUST LIKE THAT, THE TIGERS FACED ANOTHER THIRD AND LONG AND WOULD BURN THEIR SECOND TIMEOUT OF THE HALF, JUST SEVEN MINUTES INTO THE GAME.

BUT THEN CAME THE SPARK. PERRY WOULD UNCORK A DEEP BALL TO WIDE RECEIVER DAVID RUSSELL FOR A 73-YARD TOUCHDOWN PASS. THE DEEP BALL HAS BEEN A NEW REVELATION IN PERRY'S GAME, AS THREE OF THE FOUR TOUCHDOWNS THROWN BY THE SIGNAL-CALLER WERE OVER 30 YARDS. PERRY FINISHED THE DAY 10/15 FOR 320 PASSING YARDS AND FOUR SCORES. THE AIR YARDS ON THE DAY ARE A NEW SEASON HIGH FOR PERRY, WHO SITS ATOP THE STATE QBR LEADERBOARD WITH A 185.89 RATING, AND HIS TD-TO-INT RATIO OF 20-0 ALSO RANKS FIRST IN MISSOURI.

NORTH COUNTY RESPONDED WITH A LONG DRIVE INTO TIGER TERRITORY BEFORE LINEBACKER AIDEN SCHIRMER FORCED A FUMBLE THAT FESTUS RECOVERED NEAR ITS OWN 25. SCHIRMER, ALONG WITH FELLOW LINEBACKERS AIDEN CLIFTON AND BRAYDON WILKES, ANCHORED A DEFENSE THAT BENT MORE THAN USUAL BUT DIDN'T BREAK. FRIDAY MARKED THE FIRST TIME THIS SEASON AN OPPONENT TOPPED 100 YARDS BOTH RUSHING AND PASSING, A "BAD NIGHT AT THE OFFICE" FOR PESSIMISTS, OR "TEACHING TAPE" FOR OPTIMISTS. EITHER WAY, IT WAS ENOUGH TO GET THE JOB DONE.

THE TIGERS' OFFENSE FOUND ITS RHYTHM AFTER THE TURNOVER. WILLIAMS PUNCHED IN A FIVE-YARD SCORE, ONE OF IO CARRIES FOR 96 YARDS ON THE NIGHT, BEFORE PERRY CONNECTED WITH A SLIDING ROWAN STUCKE ON A NINE-YARD STRIKE TO MAKE IT 20-7. THE TIGER RUNNING BACK FINISHED JUST SHY OF HIS SIXTH IOO-YARD RUSHING PERFORMANCE (IO CARRIES FOR 96 YARDS). WILLIAMS NOW RANKS IN THE TOP-20 IN THE STATE FOR BOTH RUSHING YARDS (729) AND YARDS PER CARRY (8.2).

THE LADDER SCORE WAS SET UP BY AN IMPRESSIVE DRIVE FROM YATES, WHO HAD MULTIPLE RUSHES OF 15+ YARDS TO GIVE THE TIGERS EXCELLENT FIELD POSITION. YATES HAS BEEN DYNAMIC SINCE RETURNING FROM INJURY JUST A FEW WEEKS AGO. THE JUNIOR FINISHED THE GAME WITH 19 CARRIES FOR 141 YARDS AND A SCORE. YATES BRINGS A WHOLE NEW SKILLSET TO THE TIGERS' OFFENSE, ESPECIALLY THE BACKFIELD.

WITH FESTUS' BELLCOW BACK IN WILLIAMS AND THE SHIFTY RECEIVING-CAPABLE BACK IN YATES, THE DUO BRINGS SHADES OF RONNIE BROWN AND RICKY WILLIAMS FROM THE MID-2000S DOLPHINS (WHICH MEANS YES, WE ARE HOPING FOR SOME WILDCAT FORMATION THIS YEAR) OR, FOR THE OLD-SCHOOL FANS, ROGER CRAIG AND WENDELL TYLER OF THE MID-80S 49ERS.

NORTH COUNTY WOULD ADD ONE MORE SCORE, A 29-YARD PASSING STRIKE, BEFORE FESTUS WOULD REGAIN POSSESSION AND TACK ON A BEAUTIFUL BALL FROM PERRY TO GUS DRINEN IN THE BACK OF THE ENDZONE ON A 34-YARD BOMB BEFORE HALFTIME.

FOLLOWING THE BREAK, THE TIGERS WOULD TACK ON TWO THIRD-QUARTER RUSHING SCORES, A 39-YARD SCAMPER BY WILLIAMS AND A 2-YARD PUNCH-IN FROM YATES, TO GIVE FESTUS A 39-21 ADVANTAGE ENTERING THE FINAL 12 MINUTES. IT WAS IN THAT FOURTH QUARTER THAT FESTUS GAVE A GIFT TO THE FANS STILL IN ATTENDANCE, A MOONBALL FROM PERRY TO FRANK FOR AN 83-YARD EXCLAMATION POINT TO PUT THE GAME TO REST, WITH A SCORE OF 46-21.

WITH MIXED EMOTIONS LEAVING BONNE TERRE, FESTUS NOW LOOKS AHEAD TO A MASSIVE TEST AT DE SMET. THE SPARTANS HANDED THE TIGERS THEIR FIRST LOSS LAST YEAR, 42-13, EN ROUTE TO A 13-2 SEASON. THIS YEAR'S DE SMET TEAM IS 3-3 BUT HAS POSTED BACK-TO-BACK 56-POINT OUTINGS OVER VIANNEY AND CHAMINADE. FESTUS'S DEFENSE GOT A REALITY CHECK AT NORTH COUNTY, SO FRIDAY WILL DEMAND AN ALL-SYSTEMS-GO EFFORT ON THE ROAD.

THE THE THE BUINDS

FESTUS LEFT LITTLE DOUBT IN ITS 40-14 VICTORY OVER RIVAL HILLSBORO, SHOWCASING A NEW DIMENSION TO ITS OFFENSE ON FRIDAY NIGHT. KNOWN PRIMARILY FOR ITS RUN-FIRST APPROACH, THE TIGERS UNLEASHED A BALANCED ATTACK AT TIGER STADIUM THAT OVERWHELMED THE HAWKS AND SECURED BACK-TO-BACK HIGHWAY A BRAGGING RIGHTS.

QUARTERBACK PARKER PERRY CONTINUED HIS BREAKOUT SEASON, EVOLVING THROUGHOUT THE CONTEST. FESTUS STARTED SLOWLY, LEANING ON RUNNING BACK LEUNTAE WILLIAMS FOR SHORT GAINS, BUT PENALTIES AND A COSTLY STRIP SACK STALLED DRIVES. HILLSBORO CAPITALIZED ON THE MISCUE TO TIE THE GAME 7-7 LATE IN THE SECOND QUARTER.

THAT'S WHEN PERRY FLIPPED THE SWITCH. THE JUNIOR SIGNAL CALLER CONNECTED WITH BRAYDON WILKES AND JACKSON FRANK FOR TOUCHDOWN STRIKES OF 25 AND 31 YARDS, THEN ADDED A 29-YARD SCORING TOSS TO KAMDEN YATES. YATES, MAKING HIS 2025 HOME DEBUT, ALSO BROKE LOOSE FOR A 31-YARD RUSHING TOUCHDOWN TO PUT THE GAME OUT OF REACH.

FESTUS PILED UP 416 YARDS OF TOTAL OFFENSE AND HIT THE 30-POINT MARK FOR THE FIFTH STRAIGHT GAME. PERRY FINISHED A SCORCHING 9-FOR-13 FOR 183 YARDS AND FOUR TOUCHDOWNS, EXTENDING HIS SEASON TOTALS TO A STATE-BEST 82% COMPLETION RATE WITH A 16-O TD-TO-INT RATIO. AFTER A SHAKY 1-FOR-4 START WITH A LOST FUMBLE, PERRY'S BIG-PLAY ACCURACY TURNED HILLSBORO'S DEFENSE INSIDE OUT.

THE TIGERS' GROUND GAME WAS JUST AS RELIABLE. WILLIAMS LOGGED ANOTHER 150+ YARD PERFORMANCE (158 YARDS, I TD) AND NOW RANKS AMONG MISSOURI'S TOP 12 RUSHERS (MIN. 70 ATTEMPTS) WITH 633 YARDS ON 8.0 YARDS PER CARRY. YATES ADDED 82 YARDS ON 12 CARRIES TO GO WITH HIS TWO TOUCHDOWNS, PROVIDING A POTENT ONE-TWO PUNCH IN HIS RETURN FROM INJURY.



MEANWHILE, THE FESTUS DEFENSE WAS SUFFOCATING ONCE AGAIN. THE UNIT HELD HILLSBORO TO JUST 175 TOTAL YARDS, INCLUDING ONLY 80 THROUGH THE AIR — MARKING THE FOURTH STRAIGHT GAME THE TIGERS HAVE HELD OPPONENTS UNDER 100 PASSING YARDS. LINEBACKER AIDEN CLIFTON ANCHORED THE DEFENSE WITH KEY STOPS AGAINST THE RUN, WHILE DEFENSIVE ENDS ANTONIO PINKSTON AND WILKES CONSISTENTLY PRESSURED THE QUARTERBACK. THE HAWKS' ONLY TOUCHDOWNS CAME OFF A SHORT-FIELD DRIVE AFTER PERRY'S FUMBLE AND A LATE SCORE AGAINST THE SECOND UNIT.

WITH THE WIN, FESTUS CLAIMED BRAGGING RIGHTS IN THE HIGHWAY A RIVALRY FOR THE SECOND CONSECUTIVE SEASON — THE FIRST TIME SINCE 2011-12 THE TIGERS HAVE MANAGED BACK-TO-BACK VICTORIES OVER HILLSBORO. MORE IMPORTANTLY, THE PERFORMANCE SENDS A CLEAR MESSAGE ACROSS CLASS 4: FESTUS IS FOR REAL, AND OPPONENTS WILL NEED THEIR BEST TO KEEP PACE.

THE TIGERS WILL HIT THE ROAD FOR THE NEXT TWO WEEKS, HEADING TO NORTH COUNTY AND DESMET. FESTUS IS SET TO TAKE ON THE I-4 RAIDERS ON FRIDAY, WITH NC COMING OFF BACK-TO-BACK LOSSES AGAINST ROLLA AND HILLSBORO. FANS MAY BE GETTING DEJA VU FROM LAST YEAR, AS THE TIGERS ENTERED WEEK 6 WITH A 5-O RECORD BEFORE A 31-O WIN OVER NORTH COUNTY. HOWEVER, THIS IS NO TIME FOR FESTUS TO TAKE ITS FOOT OFF THE GAS PEDAL, AS THE RAIDERS HAVE SHOWN THEY CAN GET IT DONE IN THE CLUTCH WITH A NARROW 14-13 WIN IN A THRILLER AGAINST DESOTO.

AUTHOR'S NOTE

APPARENTLY, A PREVIOUS 56-14 VICTORY DOESN'T QUALIFY AS A "STATEMENT" TO SOME. WE'LL KEEP THAT IN MIND. NEXT TIME, WE'LL MAKE SURE OUR QUARTERBACK COMPLETES EVERY PASS, OUR RUNNING BACK GOES FOR 200 YARDS, AND OUR DEFENSE HOLDS TEAMS TO NEGATIVE YARDAGE JUST TO BE SAFE. FESTUS TIGERS (4-0) HOST HILLSBORO HAWKS (3-1) FRIDAY, SEPTEMBER 26, 2025 — 7:00 PM AT FESTUS R-6 HIGH SCHOOL. FESTUS ENTERS UNDEFEATED AND RIDING A FOUR-GAME WIN STREAK; THIS IS A KEY DISTRICT MATCHUP WITH PLAYOFF SEEDING IMPLICATIONS.

CURRENT FORM AND CONTEXT

- FESTUS: 4-0, OUTSCORING OPPONENTS BY A WIDE MARGIN AND 2-0 IN CONFERENCE PLAY; DOMINANT WINS INCLUDE A 56-14 VICTORY OVER WINDSOR AND A 33-0 ROAD SHUTOUT AT DESOTO¹.
- HILLSBORO: 3-1, COMING OFF A MIXED SLATE THAT INCLUDES A BIG WIN AND A CLOSE LOSS; THEY'LL NEED TO IMPROVE CONSISTENCY TO HANG WITH FESTUS' BALANCED ATTACK³.
- (BOTH TEAMS MEET IN A CONFERENCE GAME THAT SHAPES THE DISTRICT RACE.

WHAT FESTUS WILL LEAN ON

- OFFENSE: HIGH-SCORING AND EFFICIENT EARLY IN THE SEASON; LIKELY TO RIDE A STRONG RUSHING ATTACK THAT CONTROLS TEMPO AND OPENS PLAY-ACTION OPPORTUNITIES¹.

SHORT PREDICTION

FESTUS SHOULD BE FAVORED AT HOME GIVEN THEIR UNDEFEATED FORM, DOMINANT OFFENSIVE OUTPUTS, AND STINGY DEFENSE; EXPECT FESTUS TO WIN A PHYSICAL, POSSIBLY ONE-SIDED GAME IF THEY AVOID LAPSES. A TIGHT CONTEST REMAINS POSSIBLE ONLY IF HILLSBORO FORCES TURNOVERS AND WINS THE LINE-OF-SCRIMMAGE BATTLES

TIGERS DISMANTLE DESOTO IN FIRST SHUTOUT OF THE YEAR

FESTUS'S DEFENSE SHINED ONCE AGAIN ON FRIDAY NIGHT, PITCHING A SHUTOUT AGAINST THE DESOTO DRAGONS. THE TIGERS WERE WELL-PREPARED FOR DESOTO'S RUN-HEAVY OFFENSE, HOLDING THEM UNDER 150 TOTAL YARDS. OUTSIDE OF A SINGLE 21-YARD RUSH, THE DRAGONS AVERAGED FEWER THAN THREE YARDS PER CARRY ON 33 ATTEMPTS.

THE FESTUS FRONT SEVEN SET THE TONE EARLY, WITH DEFENSIVE ENDS ANTONIO PINKSTON AND GALIN HALL CONSISTENTLY HOLDING OUTSIDE LEVERAGE. THAT DISCIPLINE FUNNELED RUNS INSIDE, WHERE LB'S CLIFTON, SCHIRMER, AND WILKES CLEANED PLAYS IN THE GAP. THE SECONDARY ENJOYED YET ANOTHER SOLID PERFORMANCE, ALLOWING JUST TWO PASSES FOR 18 YARDS. FRIDAY'S BATTLE MARKED THE THIRD CONSECUTIVE GAME IN WHICH THE FESTUS DEFENSE HELD OPPONENTS TO LESS THAN 70 PASSING YARDS.

THE TIGER SPECIAL TEAMS UNIT ALSO PLAYED A SIGNIFICANT ROLE. AFTER QUARTERBACK PARKER PERRY CONNECTED WITH DAVID RUSSELL FOR A 15-YARD TOUCHDOWN TO OPEN THE SCORING, KICKER LUKE WACKER'S KICKOFF DEFLECTED OFF A DESOTO RETURNER AND WAS RECOVERED BY KYLER BRADSHAW INSIDE THE 20, SETTING UP THE TIGER OFFENSE IN PRIME FIELD POSITION.

HOWEVER, MISCUES SLOWED THE TIGER ATTACK. A BOTCHED SNAP ON AN EXTRA POINT FORCED RUSSELL INTO A FAILED SCRAMBLE, AND WACKER LATER MISSED A PAT. PENALTIES ALSO PROVED COSTLY, A FACEMASK NEGATED A RUSHING TOUCHDOWN, AND A BLOCK-IN-THE-BACK ERASED A 25-YARD RUN ON THE TIGERS' SECOND DRIVE.

DESPITE THE SETBACKS, FESTUS SHOWED OFF ITS OFFENSIVE VERSATILITY. MIXING HEAVY 12 PERSONNEL (ONE RUNNING BACK WITH TWO TIGHT ENDS) WITH ITS TRADITIONAL SPREAD ATTACK, AND EVEN FEATURED A GOAL-LINE PACKAGE WITH PINKSTON IN AT FULLBACK. THE TIGERS RELIED ON THEIR OFFENSIVE LINE AND RUNNING BACK LEAUNTE WILLIAMS TO GET THINGS GOING EARLY. WILLIAMS RUSHED 16 TIMES FOR 93 YARDS, AVERAGING OVER 5 YARDS PER CARRY. SOPHOMORE RIGHT TACKLE ELI TILLEY STOOD OUT IN THE RUN GAME WHILE CENTER CONNOR RUSH HANDLED THE DRAGONS' VARIOUS BLITZ PACKAGES ON PASSING DOWNS.



THE TIGERS ALSO SAW THE RETURN OF RUNNING BACK KAMDEN YATES, WHO PLAYED HIS FIRST GAME OF THE SEASON AFTER RETURNING FROM AN INJURY. YATES WAS PRODUCTIVE ON LIMITED CARRIES, RUSHING 11 TIMES FOR 42 YARDS, INCLUDING A TOUCHDOWN RUN TO PUSH THE FESTUS LEAD TO 33-0, THE FINAL SCORE. THE JUNIOR BACK WILL TAKE ON A LARGER ROLE AS THE SEASON PROGRESSES, AND WILL CREATE A BACKFIELD DUO ALONGSIDE WILLIAMS TO ADD EVEN MORE VERSATILITY TO THE TIGER OFFENSE.

AT THE HELM, PERRY HAD YET ANOTHER PRODUCTIVE NIGHT. HE COMPLETED 15 OF 17 ATTEMPTS FOR 229 YARDS AND THREE TOUCHDOWNS. THE TIGER QUARTERBACK ADDED HIS FIRST RUSHING SCORE OF THE YEAR ON A QB-KEEPER ON AN OPTION PLAY, SCAMPERING 13 YARDS TO PAYDIRT. HIS HIGHLIGHT OF THE NIGHT CAME ON FESTUS'S SECOND TOUCHDOWN: PERRY EVADED A WOULD-BE SACK 10 YARDS BEHIND THE LINE OF SCRIMMAGE, JUKED ANOTHER DEFENDER WITH A QUICK STUTTER STEP, AND FIRED A STRIKE ON THE RUN TO A WIDE-OPEN JACKSON FRANK, PUSHING THE TIGERS' LEAD INTO DOUBLE DIGITS. THE AARON RODGERS-ESQUE PLAY WAS AN EYE-POPPER AND GAVE FANS A PREVIEW OF WHAT PERRY CAN DO WITH HIS LEGS MOVING FORWARD.

THROUGH FOUR GAMES, PERRY HAS ESTABLISHED HIMSELF AMONG MISSOURI'S ELITE QUARTERBACKS. HIS 84.06% COMPLETION RATE LEADS THE STATE, HIS 175.3 PASSER RATING RANKS SECOND, AND HIS 12 PASSING TOUCHDOWNS RANK IN THE TOP FIVE – ALL DESPITE FRIDAY BEING THE FIRST TIME HE PLAYED A FULL FOUR QUARTERS THIS SEASON.

HOWEVER, PERRY HAS YET TO BE TRULY TESTED THIS YEAR. HE HAS FREQUENTLY TAKEN ADVANTAGE OF SOFT COVERAGE, ALLOWING HIS RECEIVERS TO RACK UP YARDS AFTER THE CATCH, AND HAS YET TO PUT THE BALL IN HARM'S WAY WITH ZERO INTERCEPTIONS ON THE SEASON. FRIDAY'S UPCOMING GAME AGAINST ARCHRIVAL HILLSBORO WILL BE THE FIRST ACTUAL TEST FOR PERRY AND COMPANY.

FESTUS WILL NOT-SO-KINDLY WELCOME THE ARCHRIVAL HAWKS TO TOWN FOR A CLASH OF TWO TOP-FOUR TEAMS IN LIVE STREAM STL'S JEFFERSON COUNTY POWER RANKINGS. LAST YEAR'S 14-7 THRILLER BETWEEN THE TIGERS AND HAWKS WAS FESTUS'S CLOSEST MARGIN OF VICTORY OF THE SEASON. HILLSBORO ENTERS FRIDAY'S GAME WITH A 3-1 RECORD, WITH WINS OVER MOBERLY, WASHINGTON, AND NORTH COUNTY. ALL SIGNS POINT TO THE STARS ALIGNING FOR A FANTASTIC FOOTBALL GAME ON FRIDAY.

FESTUS'S FRONT SEVEN HELD FIRM, STAYING DISCIPLINED AGAINST WINDSOR'S MOTION-HEAVY OFFENSE.

LINEBACKERS AIDEN SCHIRMER AND AIDEN CLIFTON COMMANDED THE TIGER ATTACK, AND READ THE TRIPLE OPTION TO PERFECTION. JUNIOR DEFENSIVE END ANTONIO PINKSTON HAD A STANDOUT PERFORMANCE, CONSISTENTLY SETTING THE EDGE ON RUN PLAYS AND GETTING AFTER THE QUARTERBACK ON PASSING DOWNS. IN THE SECONDARY, FESTUS CONTINUED ITS LOCKDOWN PLAY, ALLOWING JUST 25 YARDS IN THE AIR. SENIOR ROWAN STUCKE CAPPED OFF THE EFFORT WITH AN ACROBATIC PLAY TO CORRAL HIS FIRST INTERCEPTION OF THE SEASON.

OFFENSIVELY, FESTUS COUNTERED WINDSOR'S OLD-SCHOOL STYLE WITH THE MODERN SPREAD OFFENSE.QUARTERBACK PARKER PERRY HAD ANOTHER HIGHLY-EFFICIENT DAY, COMPLETING 90% OF HIS PASSES (10/11) FOR 187 YARDS AND THREE TD PASSES. HE REPEATEDLY TOOK ADVANTAGE OF SOFT COVERAGE,

FINDING WIDE RECEIVER DAVID RUSSELL UNDERNEATH ON WR SCREEN PLAYS, INCLUDING A 36-YARD CATCH-AND-RUN TOUCHDOWN ON THE OPENING DRIVE.





SENIOR RUNNING BACK LEUNTAE WILLIAMS HAD ANOTHER STELLAR DAY, RUSHING FOR 182 YARDS AND THREE SCORES. WILLIAMS AVERAGED AN EYE-POPPING 17 YARDS PER CARRY, THANKS LARGELY TO ANOTHER GREAT DAY FROM THE OFFENSIVE LINE. LEFT TACKLE CARSON GRASS LED THE WAY FOR WILLIAMS ALL NIGHT LONG. GRASS DELIVERED A KEY BLOCK ON THE TIGERS SECOND DRIVE, DRIVING THE DEFENSIVE END ALL THE WAY TO THE SIDELINE TO CLEAR THE PATH FOR AN UNTOUCHED 46 YARD TOUCHDOWN RUN FOR WILLIAMS.

WITH THE GAME IN HAND BEFORE HALFTIME, THE TIGERS UNLOADED THE BENCH. SOPHOMORE QUARTERBACKS TY JACKSON AND QUINNTEN O'BRIEN BOTH SAW VALUABLE PLAYING TIME, AND TOOK ADVANTAGE OF IT. O'BRIEN SHOWCASED HIS DUAL-THREAT ABILITY, RUSHING FOUR TIMES FOR 40 YARDS AND HITTING RUSSELL FOR A 46-YARD TOUCHDOWN ON HIS LONE PASS OF THE NIGHT. JACKSON WAS EQUALLY SHARP, COMPLETING BOTH HIS PASS ATTEMPTS FOR 69 YARDS, INCLUDING A 60-YARD STRIKE TO FELLOW UNDERCLASSMAN KEYSHAWN HALL.

FESTUS'S 56-14 VICTORY OVER WINDSOR SENT A CLEAR MESSAGE TO THE ST. LOUIS AREA. THROUGH THREE GAMES, THE TIGERS HAVE OUTSCORED OPPONENTS 121-35, NOTABLY WITHOUT THEIR STARTERS PLAYING ALL FOUR QUARTERS. FESTUS NOW SITS ATOP THE LIVE STREAM STL JEFFERSON COUNTY POWER RANKINGS, AHEAD OF RIVALS HILLSBORO AND UPCOMING OPPONENT, DESOTO.

THE DESOTO DRAGONS ENTER THE WEEK 4 MATCHUP WITH A 1-2 RECORD, COMING OFF A NARROW 13-14 LOSS TO NORTH COUNTY. FRIDAY WILL BE THE TIGERS' SECOND ROAD TRIP OF THE SEASON; THEIR FIRST WAS A 30-14 WIN IN ROLLA. LOOKING AHEAD, AFTER DESOTO, FESTUS WILL RETURN HOME FOR A HIGHLY ANTICIPATED SHOWDOWN WITH HILLSBORO.



TIGERS' DOMINANT DEFENSE SPARKS BLOWOUT WIN OVER HOWELL CENTRAL

THE FESTUS TIGER DEFENSE FLEW ALL OVER THE FIELD DURING FRIDAY'S GAME AGAINST THE FRANCIS HOWELL CENTRAL SPARTANS. LED BY SOPHOMORE LINEBACKER AIDEN SCHIRMER, THE TIGERS' FRONT SEVEN SHUT DOWN THE RUN GAME FROM THE OPENING WHISTLE. SCHIRMER COMMANDED THE TIGERS' DEFENSE AND MADE HIS PRESENCE FELT EARLY BY SHOOTING THROUGH GAPS AND WREAKING HAVOC IN THE SPARTAN BACKFIELD.

FORCED TO ABANDON THE RUN, HOWELL CENTRAL TURNED TO THE PASS GAME BUT FREQUENTLY THREW AWAY FROM SCHIRMER AND FELLOW LINEBACKER AIDEN CLIFTON. THAT STRATEGY FAILED WHEN CORNERBACK DAVID RUSSELL JUMPED A FIVE-YARD HITCH ROUTE, PICKING OFF HIS FIRST PASS OF THE YEAR AND RETURNING IT 65 YARDS FOR THE GAME'S OPENING SCORE.

THE SPARTANS' ONLY SCORE CAME DURING A TWO-MINUTE DRILL BEFORE HALFTIME, WHEN A TIGHT END COMPLETED A TIM TEBOW-ESQUE JUMP PASS TO SCORE FROM FIVE YARDS OUT. AFTER RECOVERING A ONSIDE KICK, HOWELL CENTRAL TRIED MORE TRICKERY WITH A DOUBLE REVERSE PASS, BUT SAFETY LIAM O'BRIEN READ IT ALL THE WAY AND PICKED IT OFF FOR THE TIGERS' SECOND INT OF THE HALF.

ON OFFENSE, THE TIGERS ESTABLISHED THE RUN EARLY BEHIND SENIOR RUNNING BACK LEAUNTAE WILLIAMS, WHO FINISHED WITH OVER 100 YARDS ON THE GROUND AND TWO SCORES. WILLIAMS FREQUENTLY FOLLOWED LEFT GUARD CAMDEN WALTON AND LEFT TACKLE CARSON GRASS ON DOUBLE TRAP PLAYS, AS THE PAIR PULLED ACROSS THE FORMATION TO CLEAR THE PATH FOR THE RUNNING BACK.





WITH THE GROUND GAME DRAWING DEFENDERS INSIDE, JUNIOR QUARTERBACK PARKER PERRY TOOK CONTROL. HE USED HIS LEGS TO EXTEND PLAYS AND CONNECTED ON BIG THROWS DOWN THE FIELD. HIS BEST THROW OF THE NIGHT CAME ON THE OPENING DRIVE. THE QB ROLLED OUT OF THE POCKET AND FIRED A DART 44 YARDS DOWN THE FIELD, SPLITTING DOUBLE COVERAGE AND HITTING RUSSELL IN THE CHEST INSIDE THE 20-YARD LINE. HOWEVER, AN ILLEGAL SHIFT ON THE OFFENSE WOULD NEGATE THE BIG GAIN, AND FESTUS WOULD BE FORCED TO PUNT LATER THAT SERIES.

OFFENSIVE MISCUES SUCH AS ILLEGAL SHIFTS AND FALSE STARTS STALLED A FEW DRIVES, BUT THE TIGER DEFENSE PICKED UP THE SLACK BY FORCING MULTIPLE THREE-AND-OUTS AND GIVING THE OFFENSE GREAT FIELD POSITION.

PERRY FINISHED THE NIGHT 17-FOR-23 FOR 166 YARDS AND TWO TOUCHDOWNS. HIS FIRST CAME ON A 12-YARD SLANT TO GUS DRINEN, PUTTING FESTUS UP 14-0 EARLY. AFTER HALFTIME, THE TIGERS MARCHED DOWNFIELD BEHIND WILLIAMS BEFORE PERRY LOFTED A PERFECTLY PLACED 15-YARD FADE TO JACKSON FRANK, EXTENDING THE LEAD TO 28-7. WILLIAMS ADDED HIS SECOND TOUCHDOWN AFTER AN END-AROUND FROM RUSSELL SET THE TIGERS UP AT THE ONE-YARD LINE. FESTUS PUNCHED IT IN TO MAKE IT 35-7, THE FINAL SCORE. SECURING THEIR SECOND WIN OF THE SEASON.

FESTUS NOW TURNS ITS ATTENTION TO THE 2-O WINDSOR OWLS, WHO ARE COMING OFF A 36-28 DOUBLE-OVERTIME WIN OVER HERCULANEUM AND A DOMINANT 36-6 VICTORY OVER AFFTON. FRIDAY'S MATCHUP WILL BE THE TIGERS' SECOND STRAIGHT HOME GAME BEFORE THEY HIT THE ROAD FOR THREE OF THEIR NEXT FOUR GAMES.

FESTUS TIGERS DOMINATE EARLY, HOLD OFF ROLLA BULLDOGS FOR 30-14 VICTORY IN WEEK 1!

THE FESTUS TIGERS CAME OUT FIRING ON ALL CYLINDERS FRIDAY NIGHT, PUTTING ON A FIRST-HALF AERIAL SHOWCASE THAT LEFT THE ROLLA BULLDOGS SCRAMBLING TO CATCH UP. WITH FOUR TOUCHDOWN PASSES SPLIT EVENLY ACROSS THE FIRST TWO QUARTERS, FESTUS SURGED TO A COMMANDING 28-7 LEAD BY HALFTIME.

PARKER PERRY'S QUARTERBACK EFFICIENCY AND THE RECEIVER'S SHARP ROUTE EXECUTION WERE THE STORY OF THE NIGHT FOR THE TIGERS, WHO CARVED UP ROLLA'S SECONDARY WITH PRECISION. EACH OF FESTUS'S FIRST-HALF SCORES CAME THROUGH THE AIR, SHOWCASING THEIR DEPTH AT RECEIVER AND THE POISE OF THEIR SIGNAL-CALLER. ROLLA'S LONE HIGHLIGHT BEFORE THE BREAK CAME ON A THRILLING KICKOFF RETURN TOUCHDOWN IN THE SECOND QUARTER, INJECTING A BRIEF SPARK INTO AN OTHERWISE UPHILL BATTLE.


