

It opened in 1913 and is one of the oldest continuously running cinemas in the UK.

As well as a recently refurbished 35mm vintage projector.


The cinema has a strong music history attached to it, The Clash played their first London show there, supported by The Slits in 1976.


















The Alwyne Castle

Surrounded by the Georgian and Victorian terraces and townhouses of Highbury, the Alwyne Castle is one of the area's most established watering holes, dating back to the 1800s and remaining a cornerstone of community life for more than a century.

These days, the pub's well-kept beer garden offers ample comfy seating and barbecue facilities during the summer months, plus patio heating for those days when the weather is a little more Britain than Bahamas.

Close to Highbury Fields and the Emirates Stadium, The Alwyne Castle reflects the vibrant, friendly spirit of the local neighbourhood and holds the authenticity of a true British local at its heart.









The Vintage Mobile Cinema

The Alwyne Castle 26th - 29th April

In the early 1960's the Government researched the idea of a mobile cinema that could travel around to engineering firms and giving training sessions on how they could improve industrial productivity. A prototype

Mobile Cinema was created and by 1964 this was visiting engineering firms and giving training sessions.

In 1967, The Ministry of Technology built seven of these custom mobile cinema units to tour the country, promoting modern production techniques to British industry.

In 1974 the Government sold off the mobile cinemas, and this one is the sole survivor as far as is known.

For four days from 26th - 29th April this beautiful cinema will be parked at The Alwyne Castle showing a selection of from Unrestricted View Film Festival plus some screenings from special invited guests.
