Directed by Vanessa Le Reste (France, 63 mins)



15 cm high heels, false eyelashes, and a sharp tongue—follow Britany Hart, the Queen of Brittany, and her girls through the wild Breton nights and, more importantly, their daily lives! Drag show, Parties, Friendship, and Commitment. A dive into the heart of the Hart family and the Drag Queens at the edge of the world, in a small town in France. Where they are redefining new ways to live together

SEAN DORSEY DANCE: Dreaming Trans and Queer Futures

Directed by Lindsay Gauthier (USA, 10 mins)



This Emmy Award-winning, visually-exquisite SEAN DORSEY DANCEs short is a fusion of dance film and documentary, profiling the trailblazing transgender choreographer/activist Sean Dorsey (USA) as he embarks on an ambitious new project: inviting transgender and gueer communities to dream at the very moment their lives and rights are under attack everywhere.

Explore the world of gay/queer human Pups. This subculture that evolved from the gay leather community and now thrives in tandem. Interviews with over a dozen Pups reveal that Pup Play is a way of embodying the spirit of a dog, both physically and mentally. More than just a sexual fetish, Pup Play provides a way for individuals to escape the stresses of everyday life and embrace a mindful existence.

Directed by Joy Rieger (Israel, 12 mins)
Joy, a young, helpless, sad, and frightened actress is
fresh out of a breakup. She decides to go to the gym,
there, she bumps into her ex and her new boyfriend.
She decides it's time for a confrontation.

Directed by Jan Fabris (Slovenia, 24 mins)
What if a person you are secretly watching, is also watching you?

Directed by Bryan McHenry (USA, 12 mins)
A middle-aged church organist seeks help caring for his aging mother and finds the courage to start exploring his identity.



CHRISTMAS 1978

Directed by Lara Fullalove (UK, 17 mins)
'Christmas, 1978' is a short film that delves into the nuanced relationship between a father and son and expores the paradox of Catholicism and Homosexuality.



BERGAMOT

Directed by Hsu Chien (Brazil, 15 mins)

Bergamot, the name given to tangerine in southern Brazil. This fruit with such a characteristic smell and for many an aphrodisiac, will trigger a night of seduction, sensual dancing, blood and revenge on an ordinary night in Rio de Janeiro.



MAKING UP

Set in the 1980s. Ted is diagnosed with a hereditary illness and so must reconcile with his daughter, Cassandra. However, being a celebrated drag queen, paired with the bitter feelings she harbours over their past, presents an obstacle for Ted to overcome.
