A Passage of Time" is is the story of two young men who want to open that bed and breakfast in their home along the coast of Maine. But they come to realize, however, that there are other family dynamics they didn't foresee that need to be addressed. It's the story of how families must cope as one generation gives way to another and how the rules of life must adjust as the change takes place.

Georgie and Stan are two friends living in a small town in northern France. Georgie dreams of being in the spotlight while Stan wants to be a filmmaker. When Georgie finds out that his idol is going to the "Mister Northern France" pageant, Stan, the event videographer, helps him enter the pageant. As they prepare for the event, hidden tensions break out between the two friends.

Family Pride (USA. Director: Bernie Torres)

A young woman puts on a one-woman show to come out to her parents, which doesn't go exactly as she planned.

Phoenix (UK. Director: Shantelle Rochester)

When 2 woman fall in love in 1770, their love comes to a tragic end which binds them to that room in parallel times.

Road Kill (USA. Director: Aliza Brugger)

Tillie's lonely life as a roadkill removal worker is destabilized when Wanda, a lively stranger, comes to town.

Thanksgiving (USA. Director: Hortense Lingjaerde) Relationships are tested and secrets are revealed when siblings return to their

parents' house for an enlightening Thanksgiving meal.

The Duck & the Donkey

(Puerto Rico. Director: Carlos Larriue / Alejandro Aguilera)

David and Randall are in the principal's school office. He wants to know what they did to be there. In the meantime, these two enemies will understand they're more similar than they though.

Prom Date (UK. Director: James Buck)

As Ruth ges ready for her school prom it becomes clear that she is harvesting a secret from her mother.

Anna (France. Director: Sylvain Certain)

Obliged by her mother, Elsa must go to her grandmother to make her a touchy revelation, which will upset her.

Cracks in the Patriarchy

Director - Cagdas Celtikli, Kai Münch Germany 77 mins

A documentary told by seven protagonists, who share their personal and political point of view by expressing the reasons and the purposes for their advocacy as members of the Buenos Aires LGBTQI+ Community. Each one of them narrates personal processes and experiences which constitute their social and political identity as well as the motivation for their struggle for an equal and fairer future. We are shown a di- versity of perspectives, rooted in their beings and their fights, through their descriptions of very similar topics and facts from a historical and contemporary approach based on their unique points of view. In that sense, the protagonists do not only share a common desire, but also their motivation to be part of a Community that advocates for a world that everyone can feel as a safe space, and in which the patriarchy becomes a historical issue.



I'm Moshanty. Do You Love Me? is a documentary profile of legendary South Pacific music icon and transgender activist, the late Moses Moshanty Tau and members of the transgender community of Papua New Guinea.

Julia rebels against the fate that has separated her and the the woman she loved, and decides to meet her, no matter what. Even if she has to start a journey into twilight with no chance of returning.

Lost Love Memories (Italy. Director: Antonio Scarabaggio) On the Battlefield the German Eirik Vonmets and the English James Williams are engaged in the uncontrolled search of one other risking their own lives, heedless of the dangers all around them.

Float (Columbia. Director: María Matiz Borda)

Simona and Lucas must face their feelings for each other and their own sexual identities, making decisions that put their friendship to the test.

Without You (USA. Director: SB Gamble)

Alek finds himself torn between love and fear when a stranger at the bar complicates things...

More Than He Knows (USA. Director: Fiona Dawson)

MORE THAN HE KNOWS examines the complexity of human connections; our self-awareness, awareness of others, the spectrum of sexuality, and models of marriage.
