Call to Order – The meeting was called to order at 4:01 pm by Deb Harlan. Guests and new leaders were introduced/announced. Lissa Degnan is the new co-captain for Southern Oaks. Teri Tonioli announced Beth Scholar will be captain for Belle-Glade and Sally Dees will be the co-captain. Jan Snider is retiring as captain, and Dorine LeBlanc will be the new captain for Mallory. June Badarick Meno was filling in for Corey Hahn. Mary Hewitt announced Linda Laughlin as the new co-captain for Lopez. Kerri Wildgruber is the new co-captain for Glenview.

Approval of the minutes from March 19, 2026, meeting. Motion to approve the minutes was made by Jan Snider and seconded by Delia Treffer. Note: The incorrect first name for Ken Roshaven and the date for May meeting will be corrected.

Budget – Susan Byrne gave an update on the budget. All the revenues have been collected and there is a \$50 difference budget vs actual. There are several upcoming expenses to plan for, including the website fee, the annual Microsoft license fee, and the winning team memento. Janice Snyder thought it was \$40 a player. Seay Anne Sheley motion to amend the budget to \$45 per player (16 players). Teri Tonioli seconded the motion. All in favor 14 Yes and 2 No. There will be a vote on the winners budget next year. Discussion focused on the collection of raffle funds and the importance of designating a charity before the end of the year. The goal is to distribute proceeds to a selected charity at the close of the fiscal year. The charity for 2026 will be determined by a vote at the May meeting. Captains are asked to submit their charity suggestions to Deb Harlan in advance for consideration.

- Deb Harlan will collect the charity ideas from the captains and vote will be held at the May meeting for the top 3 charities.
- Pat Golen will reach out to Cindy Kane to get the website fee expense.

Overall Event Recap – Deb Harlan requested each captain to give the pros and cons of the tournament. The overall categories of the discussion:

Weather – Players did not feel we should continue the tournament with the weather conditions on the first day. Some players thought about not finishing the round. The guidelines of the tournament are specific in the conditions of competition. Every captain should have reviewed with their team.

Spectators – Not enough tags for the carts and rule sheets.

Scorecards – The first group of the first day did not tee off in time because they did not have enough scorecards. The pro did print another scorecard. The paper scorecards were wet due to the weather. Scorecards at Havana were based on 18 holes not 27. This caused confusion with the players.

Restaurants – Not enough chairs at the tables. More variety on the menu; pasta, hotdog and hamburger.

Rules Official – Mike and Rick are the USGA rules official. They should not be on the course monitoring pace of play or in the field officiating rules. Their time should be spent officiating rules issues at the scoring table.

Intensity of the tournament – Too competitive/intense. It is the captain's responsibility to set expectations of the players.

Pace of Play

Scoring – More than one person needs to officiate scoring results. This is already in the works for 2027.

Players from the draft – Players were thrown into the deep end. This is the responsibility of the team captain to bring the player up to speed.

Registration – The registration should be moved up to accommodate the renewal of each players GHIN.

Tee Off Party – A larger room is needed. Players arrived early. Too many players waiting to set up their table and food. Decorating the team table was not communicated.

Low Index – Players did not like to play to their low index. Giving up over 5 strokes is too much. It would be better to try to make it more equitable.

Volunteers – Sonia and the volunteers did a great job. Educate volunteers on pace of play guidelines. There were situations that could have been avoided with proper training

Participation in week 2 – Captains were not asked if they wanted to participate in week 2. The captains that did not make week two should have specific responsibilities identified for week 2.

Training – Players that do not have match play experience should be required to attend a rules training session.

Tee Times – Some players complained they were always getting the late tee times.

Compliant Review – Handicap review issues. The process needs to be reviewed and documented for the next tournament.

Survey – Seay Anne review the questions in the current survey for feedback. The best choice section in each question will be revised. The survey link will be on the website and Facebook. The survey will include the volunteers. A separate email will be sent to the players who were drafted for their input. Few questions to be included in the survey:

- Do you want a pro am
- How did you feel about your opponent pairings
- How important is it to have a gathering place after the event
- Rate the restaurants
- **Deb Harlan will draft an email that will be distributed to the draft players and review with the captains before distribution.**

Any Other Business – Deb Harlan reviewed the draft Tournament Committee presentation. The Tournament committee is responsible for organizing, administering and overseeing a structured two-week team competition comprised of multiple teams representing the various country clubs. The committee ensures that all matches are conducted fairly, efficiently and in accordance with the USGA Rules of Golf addressing all issues

designated by USGA as tournament committee issues/responsibilities. The goal is create a tournament and guidelines that meet our vision statement. The committee will be comprised of:

- Two captain liaisons
- President and past president
- 3-4 volunteer with past or present tournament experience
- Deb Harlan will send the draft presentation to the captains. She will also provide an outline of each committee's responsibilities.

Mary Hewitt presented Seay Anne with the Pro-Am trophy.
