Emounient and Consideration by the Covernor

Enrollment is a process whereby the final version of a bill is printed and proofread to ensure that the language in the document reflects the final action by the Legislature. The process culminates in the actual delivery of the bill to the Governor's office. The Governor has 12 days to consider legislation. Any bill that is not vetoed or returned by the Governor after 12 days becomes a statute without the Governor's signature. The exception to this provision occurs at the end of each year of the legislative session, when the Governor is allowed 30 days to consider bills passed by the adjournment deadline of the Legislature.
