Chapter 22

Reincarnation

I do not believe in reincarnation; we only have one birth, one life here in mortality. Let me explain why [Abraham 3:18]. First, we must understand that we are "spiritual beings," we have always existed. Our Spirit is called the "Spirit of Truth," [D&C 93:23-28] and "Truth" is a perfect knowledge of the past, present and future [D&C 93: 24].

Therefor every living person who has been born on this planet knows all things. But we do not remember, because a veil has covered our minds since birth in mortality. As we become more like God, in holiness of character while here on earth we can begin to tap into the knowledge reservoir within us. We can even get to the point to know the thoughts and intent of every person who has ever come to earth, or will come and all creatures great and small, as well. The more pure and holy we become the more this knowledge reservoir will be revealed to us, as is the case for all those who have become Gods. This is the whole purpose of existence, to become "one" with God knowing all things. 19 And the Lord said unto me: These two facts do exist, that there are two spirits, one being more intelligent than the other; there shall be another more intelligent than they; I am the Lord thy God, I am more intelligent than they all." (Pearl of Great Price | Abraham 3:18-19).

"Ye are therefore commanded to be perfect, even as your Father wh0 is in heaven is perfect" (Inspired Version New Testament | Matthew 5:50).

Christ knows all things because of his obedience ⁱ to the "Spirit of truth" within himself. He knows when a sparrow falls from the sky…

And "even the very hairs of your head are all numbered." (New Testament | Luke 12:7)

"Therefore, it is given to abide in you; the record of heaven; the Comforter; the peaceable things of immortal glory; *the truth of all things*; that which quickeneth all things, which maketh alive all things; *that which knoweth all things*, and hath all power according to wisdom, mercy, truth, justice, and judgment." (Pearl of Great Price | Moses 6:61)

It is "given to abide in you...the truth of all things." You see we are all connected to the "Spirit of Truth," the eternal tapestry of existence. "All Spirit is matter" and it is in and through all things, and carries with

it a perfect knowledge of everything. Like tuning into a radio station, our Spirit is capable of tuning into "the truth of all things," hence when some feel they have had another life, they are merely tuning into some of the spiritual frequencies that exist all around us and detailed knowledge can be revealed of the past, present or the future.
