SHOW RULES

Entry Fees: \$10 per head per ring if entered before deadline and/or **POSTMARKED by Sept. 30, 2023**. Entry fee for exhibitors pre-entering 10 or more animals will be \$8, and animals must be from the same owner. Entry fee for Embedded Youth show is an additional \$2 per head per ring. Entry fees must be enclosed with entry form. Late entries (postmarked after Sept. 30, 2023) or entries received without money will be \$12 per head with no discount. Late entries will be accepted until 7 am the day of the show. **EARLY ENTRIES ARE ENCOURAGED SO WE CAN TRY TO MAKE EACH BREED OFFICAL.**

Sanction: This show is sanctioned by the American Dairy Goat Association and their rules shall govern. The Senior and Junior open doe shows are separately sanctioned for Lamanchas, Nigerian Dwarfs, Nubians, and All Other Purebreds (AOP). Alpines & Recorded Grades will only be sanctioned for Junior open doe show. A separately sanctioned show for Mini Nubians will be held with Miniature Dairy Goat Association rules governing. **(SEE THEIR RULES BELOW)**. Registration certificates or a stamped duplicate are required for all animals. **Certificate papers must be presented at check in before judging shall begin (ADGA rule X1-A-6).** *Champion Challenge Entries:* Proof of Championship is required and shall be either: (1) The prefix CH, GCH or SGCH as affixed by ADGA on the animal's registration or recordation certificate; or (2) Presentation of the Permanent Champion Certificate Notification Letter issued by ADGA in conjunction with the original registration or recordation certificate. The letter is valid for use until December 31st of the year of issuance. Please bring extra handlers, open shows will be run simultaneously.

Arrival: The show barn will be open at 2 pm on Friday, Oct. 6, 2023, for early arrivals. The registration table will be open from 6-9 pm on Friday and 6:00 - 7:00 am on Saturday. Animals participating in the show must be in place and checked in no later than 7:00 am the day of the show. **Certificate papers must be presented at check in before judging shall begin (ADGA rule X1-A-6).**

Base Date: Base date for calculating age October 7, 2023.

Health Requirements: All animals must be free of draining abscesses, pink eye, ringworm, external parasites and sore mouth. If the animal is questionable, please leave it at home.

Substitutions: Substitutions within the same breed will be allowed. These animals must be entered with the Show Secretary prior to the beginning of the show.

Winners: Please keep 1st and 2nd place class winners near the ring for selection of Grand Champion and Reserve Champion. Best of Breed Senior Does will need to be milked out before selection of Best In Show. Junior and Senior Best of Breed winners must be exhibited in the "Best in Show" class. If you leave before this class is held, you will forfeit the Championship leg earned at this show (ADGA rule X1-J-9). Champions, Reserve Champions, Best of Breed and Best Senior Doe/Best Junior Doe in Show winners – please take a moment to carefully review the information on the Official Report of Awards prior to signing it. Our Show Secretaries and Show Chair strive to complete these forms correctly, but mistakes do happen and we don't want you to forfeit a leg on your animal due to an inadvertent error.

Embedded Youth Show Entries: Animals must be registered in child's name only, not the family or farm name. Entries are \$2.00 per class per ring, and the animal must be entered in the Open Show as well, since it is an embedded show. Late entries will remain \$2. Total entry fee will be \$12 (\$2 youth + \$10 open) per ring. Exhibitors may enter multiple does in a class as long as they are handled by another youth exhibitor. The Embedded Youth Show will take place after selection of Open show Grand and Reserve in each breed, and after Open show Best In Show selection. As with open show, please keep 1st and 2nd place class winners near the ring for selection of Grand Champion and Reserve Champion.

Showmanship: Showmanship will take place between the Senior and Junior Doe Shows. There is no fee for Showmanship classes, but you must sign up with check-in by 7 am on October 7, 2023. Showmanship is open to all exhibitors regardless of whose name the animal is registered.

Costume Contest: Costume Contest will take place after showmanship. There is no fee for the Costume Contest class, but you must sign up with check-in by 7 am on October 7, 2023. Costume Contest is open to youth exhibitors regardless of whose name the animal is registered.

Overruddered Does: Overruddered does may be discriminated against by the judges. If you need to relieve your doe of excess milk, please do so into a pail and not on the ground. If your doe leaks milk onto the concrete, please clean up after her. Please be considerate of other exhibitors and their animals.

Pens & Fees: Hay may be fed in the barn, preferably in containers. Do not leave animals for extended periods of time in the holding pens that have no bedding in them. There will be a \$4 per pen non-refundable fee, charged by the fairgrounds for cleaning the facility after the show is over with.

Misc Rules: The SCTGC, TMM, and the Washington County Fairgrounds will not be held responsible for any losses or damages incurred by exhibitors or visitors; all animals will be shown at owners' risk. Parents will be held responsible for the actions of their children. Exhibitors are requested to be neatly and appropriately attired, preferably in white; however, dark pants/skirt and white shirt are acceptable. Please do not bring beer, wine or other alcoholic beverages onto the show grounds. Please consider our youth and set a good example for them. Anyone who is found with alcoholic beverages in their possession will be asked to relinquish them (they will be returned when you leave the showgrounds at the end of the day on Saturday).

Receipt of entry will be an agreement by the exhibitor to abide by the show rules. Make sure your does are tattooed and that their tattoos match their registration papers. We do have a microchip reader available for those animals that may have faded or illegible tattoos and are also microchipped; however, the microchip number must be listed on the animal's registration papers and it must match the microchip that is being read.

Order of Show: *Please note – The South Central Texas Goat Show Committee reserves the right to change the breed order of the show if deemed necessary to accommodate the timely progression of judging in each ring.*

MDGA Show Rules

Eligibility to participate in an MDGA sanctioned Live show requires that you be a current MDGA member.

1. In order for animals to be accepted for participation in an MDGA show, the owner must present either an official registration certificate or a registrar-issued confirmation email with a registration number assigned to each animal being considered for registration. Late MDGA registration applications must be submitted to the registrar a minimum of 8 days prior to a show.

For those needing rush application review and/or overnight service (as of 1/1/18) in order to have

papers in time there will be a \$50 fee for members and a \$75 fee for non-members submitting a new application.

2. To compete in an MDGA sanctioned "Experimental" show, a miniature dairy goat is not required to be registered with MDGA but may be registered with another official miniature dairy goat registry. If such an animal is awarded Grand Champion of its breed, the animal's owner will have two weeks from the show date to register the goat with MDGA in order for the animal to receive the winning leg; otherwise, the leg will be awarded to the Reserve Champion as long as the Reserve Champion is registered with MDGA.

3. All MDGA-recorded "Grade" animals are eligible to be shown in sanctioned "Experimental" shows and are also eligible to receive Champion or Reserve Champion wins. To be shown, all registered or recorded grade animals whose certificates were issued by a registry other than MDGA must meet the MDGA standards for registration/recordation. Should it win, an animal belonging to this category must be registered with MDGA within two weeks to receive its official Champion win.

4. For all entries in a sanctioned show, either a registration certificate or an email from the registrar showing that an application for registration has been submitted to the registry must be presented to the show secretary or appointed trustee at the time of check-in.

5. All animals must be tattooed or microchipped with assigned tattoo numbers prior to arrival at the show. (No tattoos or microchips should be applied at the show.) Owners of animals with microchips must have a microchip reader available at the show. Champion and Reserve Champion animals will not receive official awards if the tattoo or microchip cannot be read. Tattoo(s) must match the recorded information exactly on the registration certificate to receive credit for an official "leg". If the tattoo is correct but in the wrong location, MDGA will award the Championship but without the "official leg". If the tattoo is incorrect for that animal said animal will be disqualified.

6. Animals with horns or scurs exceeding two inches are not acceptable for showing.

Texas Mini Milkers MDGA Show Rules

TMM shows are sanctioned by MDGA and their show rules shall govern. See MDGA Show Rules above.

Entry Fees: \$10 per head per ring if entered before the Deadline and/or POSTMARKED by Sept. 30, 2023. Entry fee for exhibitors pre-entering 10 or more animals will be \$8, and animals must be from the same owner. Entry fees must be enclosed with entry form. Late entries (postmarked after Sept. 30, 2023) or entries received without money will be \$12 per head with no discount. Late entries will be accepted until 6:30 am the day of the show. EARLY ENTRIES ARE ENCOURAGED.

Sanction: TMM Memorial Classic show is separately sanctioned for Senior Mini Nubian Does and Junior Mini Nubian Does. Registration certificates or pending registration application email are required for all animals. Certificate papers must be presented at check in before judging shall begin.
