

Entry Deadline

Deadline: **June 5th, 2026**

All entries for the **2026 Dairy Capital Classic** are to be completed online via the **Showman App**.

Entry Fees

- Youth Showmanship - **FREE** *Pre-entry is required via the Showman App. Youth will need to have at least one animal entered in the ADGA/MDGA show.
- Open Show - **\$12** per head / **\$10** per head for members.

Pens

Pen Assignments will be made in May. Pens are limited to 10 X 10 solid wall horse stalls. There are 105 horse stalls available. The horse stalls will be **\$20 per stall per day**. There are ample water spigots throughout the barn and a large number of fans. We will advise you to bring your own fans for extra air flow. ****There will also be a limited number of 4 x 4 pens available in the climate controlled arena.**** Preference for these pens will be given to **show volunteers** who would also like to partake in the show. This gives them the ability to keep an eye on their animals and have quick access to the animals for their respective classes. The extra pens will be available after volunteers have come forward and claimed their pens.

- Dairy Goats may arrive beginning at **4:00 PM**, Thursday June 4th, 2026. If showing in the **Youth Showmanship** animals must be in place by 8pm.

- Late Registration: **June 2nd - June 4th , 2026** (Entry fees doubled & Stall fees are \$30 per stall per day)

Other Important Information

We ask that everyone respects the space around them and cleans up their trash. We ask that children be maintained throughout the show. We want to promote an environment of comfort and rest for all the animals involved in the show.

ADGA General Show Rules

ADGA GENERAL SHOW RULES

1. ADGA RULES SHALL GOVERN.
2. Please Note: All entries MUST be in the name of the actual owner as shown on the Original Registration Papers or on the Stamped Duplicate Registration Application. They may not be entered in any other name PER ADGA SHOW RULES. In the event of a discrepancy between the rules posted on the website and those in paper copy mailed to the exhibitors or distributed by show officials, the paper copy shall prevail.
3. Goats may be examined on the grounds by show personnel, veterinarians or state/federal personnel. Goats showing evidence of infectious abscesses WILL NOT be allowed to enter the barn or show and may be released. Goats showing evidence of any other illness may be released. Out of State goats must have a valid certificate of Veterinary inspection with tattoo/tags/chip numbers of each goat. This paper will be examined at check-in. Scrapie regulations will be in effect. All animals, including tag-a-longs, MUST have a scrapie tag or legible tattoos that match registration papers or applications. Animals will be checked at random.
4. We (ETDGA) ask that you not bring does that are due to kid during the show. If an animal shows visible signs of labor, it is to be removed from the barn to kid in your trailer.
5. Overruddered does may be discriminated against by the judges. If you need to relieve your doe of excess milk, please do so into a pail and not on the ground. If your doe leaks milk onto the concrete, please clean up after her. Please be considerate of other exhibitors and their animals. Do not leave animals for extended periods of time in the holding pens that have no bedding in them.
6. No aggressive dogs allowed. If a dog is found to be aggressive or an overall distraction you will be asked to remove them from the facility.
7. No smoking or vaping in the barns.
8. Goats will be released after the last class in which the exhibitor has an entry and has been judged. Those leaving early may forfeit awards. Champion and Best of Breed goats that leave before Best in Show will not receive a champion leg.
9. Youth Showmanship, Premier Breeder, and Premier Exhibitor will receive ribbons and/or prizes.
10. East Texas Dairy Goat Association or the Hopkins County Civic Center will not be held liable for any animals, persons, or personal property. Goats left unattended one hour after the last show on Saturday, with no prior arrangements with the ETDGA show chairperson, will be considered abandoned and their welfare handled by the association.

11. Exhibitors under the age of 18 must be accompanied by a responsible entity, and will not be allowed to attend the ETDGA show with a banned entity according to the ETDGA bylaws.
12. Any situation arising not covered by these rules or the breed association bylaws will be decided by the show committee. Protests must be made in writing and addressed to the ETDGA Board of Directors. Allow 30 days for a response.
13. These shows are sanctioned by the American Dairy Goat Association. There will be 3 SR Doe Rings, 3 JR Doe Rings, and 3 Buck Rings with a Combined Sr. Doe show.
14. The Youth Showmanship is FREE, but youth must pre-register via the Showman App registration link by the entry deadline of June 3rd, 2026. For the Open Show, the entry fee is **\$12 per goat per ring**. ETDGA members will receive the discount noted above putting the cost at **\$10 per goat per ring**.
15. Entries after **06/3/2026** WILL DOUBLE– Open –\$24.00.
16. **No entries allowed after June 5th, 2026.**
17. Stalls are \$20 each per day. Stalls will be assigned. Exhibitors will comply with Stall assignments given by the Show Committee. Failure to do so will result in removal from the show with no refund.
 - a. Stalls are 10 x 10 and solid sided. Perfect for containing even our smallest friends. There are fans throughout the barn and fresh water spigots everywhere.
 - b. Shavings are allowed in the stalls but not in the arena. The arena pens may use hay.
18. Fees may be refunded for:
 - a. A junior doe that receives a leg if pulled from the remaining shows
 - b. Any goat that finishes their championship if pulled from the remaining shows
19. No charge for youth showmanship, however the animal must be entered into at least one ring within the show.
20. All entries must be completed online and paid in full by the registration deadline. Other than the instances stated in Rule #18 (a-b), there will be NO REFUNDS.
****RINGSIDE SUBSTITUTIONS ARE NOT ALLOWED UNLESS AUTHORIZED BY SHOW PERSONNEL.****
21. The original registration certificate, stamped duplicate application, or stamped faxed duplicate application showing the date received by the ADGA office (within the last 30 days) is required for all goats under six months of age, and this must be shown at check in. (A signed original registration with transfer filled completely out will suffice.)
22. In accordance with ADGA rules, there will be no tattooing on the civic center ground.
23. There will be no pre-show milk out.
24. Only exhibitors, judges, and those working as part of the show are to be in the ring.

Please do not allow children to play in the show ring.

25. If you are showing multiple breeds, please bring additional help or allow others to show your goats so the show can continue to run smoothly with minimal interruptions.
26. We ask that Best of Breeds be held in ringside pens after milk out for the judging of Best in Show. We will provide ringside pens specifically for this purpose.

CLASSES

All regular (age) classes will be judged – grand champion and reserve champion will be selected, before going on to the next breed. First and second place goats are to be placed in holding pens at ringside until Grand and Reserve are selected. Classes that exceed 15 animals will be split in half by age for ease of showing in the ring. Judges will only give reasons up to 5th place.

Each Grand, Reserve, and Best of Breed shall remain in the ring for the judge to read tattoos and their registration papers must be presented to the show secretary at this time. Exhibitors are cautioned to verify the accuracy of the show report before signing the report. Papers will be returned to the exhibitor after they sign the report of awards. Best of Breed winners must compete in the Best in Show class. Base date for computing age will be **June 3rd, 2026**.

This show is sanctioned by the American Dairy Goat Association (all sanctioned breeds), and their rules shall govern. The Senior open shows are separately sanctioned for Alpines, LaManchas, Nigerian Dwarfs, Nubians, Gernseys, All Other Purebreds (AOPs), and Recorded Grades. The Junior open shows are separately sanctioned for Alpines, LaManchas, Nigerian Dwarfs, Nubians, Gernseys, All Other Purebreds (AOPs), and Recorded Grades.

A separately sanctioned show for AOM (All Other Minis) will be held in conjunction with the ADGAsanctioned show. This show is sanctioned by the Miniature Dairy Goat Association, and MDGA show rules shall govern. Junior and Senior Doe shows are separately sanctioned for AOM.

VENDORS WELCOME

There will be limited availability for vendors. We will be allowing one organization to run the food stand at the front of the arena.

SPONSORSHIP

If you would like to sponsor a breed, award, or showmanship please utilize the showman app sponsorship function.

DIRECTIONS TO THE - HOPKINS COUNTY CIVIC CENTER

From I30 take Exit 123 onto Industrial Drive. Then turn onto League St. South. Turn left onto Houston St. and then Left into the Civic Center parking lot.

HOTELS / RV ACCOMMODATIONS FOR EXHIBITORS

EXHIBITOR RESPONSIBILITY FOR KNOWING RULES

All exhibitors are responsible for knowing all rules, regulations and information found in this document. Failure to comply with the rules and regulations can lead to expulsion and/or forfeiture of points/awards. Any exhibitor or vendor who refuses to comply with the rules and regulations at The Dairy Capital Classic will be prohibited from participating in future ETDGA Shows for a period of time to be determined by the Board of Directors of ETDGA.

Exhibitors being considered for punishment for the violation of show rules will be notified of the infraction at the show, if possible. If not possible, the exhibitor will be notified within 45 days of the show of the violation by certified mail.

The ETDGA Show Committee may request that people leave the ETDGA Show and

may bar them from participation in further functions for violation of ETDGA Show Rules. In such decisions, the ETDGA Show Committee shall consult the ETDGA Show Rules, the ETDGA bylaws, and the current ADGA Guidebook, which includes the National Code of Show Ring Ethics for Exhibitors. Such action must be approved by a majority of the ETDGA Show Committee members attending the show.

ETDGA does not and shall not discriminate on the basis of race, color, religion (creed), gender, gender expression, age, national origin (ancestry), disability, marital status, sexual orientation, or military status, in any of its activities or operations. These activities include, but are not limited to, hiring and firing of staff, selection of volunteers and vendors, and provision of services.
