



Pastor's Column

Easter says you can put truth in a grave, but it won't stay there.



Easter is only a couple weeks away now! We have gone through the change of Daylight Savings Time, the snowbanks are melting quicker than I ever thought possible, and I suppose spring flooding looms on the horizon for many folks in Minnesota and bevond. (Sometimes too close to home.)

We have entered the season of Spring, and along with the promise of new life, we experience some growing pains as well. The way we put it in the church is this: in order to get to Easter, you have to go through Good Friday.

Jesus' community was expecting a Messiah. A Messiah that would make everything better. They expected someone who would drive out the Roman occupation. A Messiah that would restore Israel to its former glory May God's Kingdom come, on earth in the days of King David and King Solomon. Instead, the Messiah came as one who experienced the same things in daily life as the rest of the community did. However, one thing that set him apart was that he lived life with the assurance of Eternity.

In order to offer others this eternal hope He did two things. Fist, he lived a life of sacrifice, and second, he invited and challenged others to do the same. He reminded people that we have a part to play in our own salvation. As was stated later in the scripture, "...work out your own salvation, in fear and trembling." Philippians 2:12. Well, Jesus is here to help us do just that. It can be a challenge, but with Christ, all things are possible.






MUNC Game Day Fundament




