#### Pastor's Column

"Whoever doesn't carry their own cross and follow me cannot be my disciple."

- Luke 14:27

Recently I found an article on NPR (National Public Radio) talking about Pam "Twoyah" James-Sinix's traumatic experience of boarding schools.



Pam was only eight years old when she was put into a Native American boarding school. After her mother was in a bad car accident, Pam and her brothers and sisters were sent

to separate boarding schools. It was at the catholic boarding school that Pam's identity was stolen from her through simple but hurtful acts. Firstly, they cut her hair into a bowl cut. Pam was taught by her father that her hair is important. They are taught that their hair carries their ancestors, their history, and their future. That was just the beginning. They abused her in many different ways and taught her to be ashamed of her Native American heritage. These boarding schools existed to erase Native American culture from existence. It's still an issue that isn't widely known in our nation.

Today's scripture, we're reminded that only those who suffer and follow Jesus can be called a disciple. Those who suffer are certainly those who are considered the lowly. Look at what we've talked about this Lenten season. Who are the people who suffered? Who were the people who weren't suffering? We see that Jesus heals and brings hope to the suffering while admonishing those in power who only ignore the suffering and hurt around them.


Carrying your cross doesn't mean that we have to abuse ourselves in order for Jesus to be happy with us.

Carrying your cross means being able to humble ourselves and identify with those who suffer.



Later in April we will be celebrating Native American Ministries Sunday. If anyone can be called the lowly, then certainly Native Americans fit that description. They've faced oppression when they lost their land and almost lost their identity due to boarding schools. They still continue to fight against the oppressive forces that try to take what little land they still have. They still continue to fight the evil forces that attempt to rob them of their culture. They still continue to fight to get the recognition of the murdered and missing indigenous women.

In order to fulfill Jesus' example, we need to take up our cross and follow him. We need to identify with the lowly. We can identify with the lowly by starting to understand the suffering of others. We can identify with the lowly by learning how to be better allies to those who suffer. As the good book says, whatever you do for one of the least of these brothers and sisters of mine, you do for me.

#### **Sunday School Update!**



#### FE-ED UPDATE



FE-ED

SNAP's drastic reduction spurred FE -ED to dramatically increase the number of boxes we prepared for March, It was a good decision. We served 551 individuals!

The day was chilly but the volunteers did a fantastic job of counting items, loading boxes, and delivering the food to the people waiting in line,

and the line was long. This was the largest food distribution we've had! There was an abundance of fresh produce and food! Asparagus, carrots, yams, apples, onions, cereal, breads, orange juice, milk and more! With federal funds so drastically cut now, FE-ED did decide to increase number of boxes being packed & distributed to 185. It was a good decision looking at the statistics below!

FE-ED will recognize it's volunteers at the next food drop, Tuesday, April 25th!

- 240 Lbs. of meat. 154 Lbs. of Granola from the Buffalo Food Shelf.
