## Pastor Mark's Column



Easter Sunday is a rush. There is the burst of music, the brightness of lilies, the bold proclamation that Christ is risen. It is a day that invites us to lean forward, to feel the full weight of victory, and to exhale after the long walk of Lent.

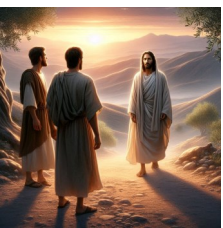
But then the lilies fade. The music settles. And we find ourselves standing in the days after—what the church calls Eastertide—wondering what it looks like to \*live\* in the reality of a Resurrection we celebrated so loudly just weeks ago.



This is not a new question. The first disciples wrestled with it too.

We tend to imagine that the morning of the empty tomb solved everything for them, that their faith became instantly unshakeable. But the gospel writers tell us a different story. They show us people standing in gardens, not yet understanding what they are seeing. They show us friends gathered behind locked doors, afraid despite the rumors of hope. They show us a man demanding to touch wounds before he will believe, and two others walking away from Jerusalem with heavy hearts, convinced the story had ended in tragedy.

These are not failures of faith. They are the raw materials of it.



What is striking about the weeks following the Resurrection is how gently Jesus meets them in these spaces. He does not shame them for their slowness to understand. He walks beside them on the road. He shows them His hands. He speaks in a voice familiar enough to pierce through their confusion. He seems less interested in impressing them with the spectacle of what He has done than in equipping them for what comes next—which is to say, He is equipping them for life.

That is the quiet work of Eastertide. It is the season in which we stop trying to manufacture the mountaintop experience of Easter Sunday and instead learn how to let Resurrection settle into the ordinary rhythms of our days.

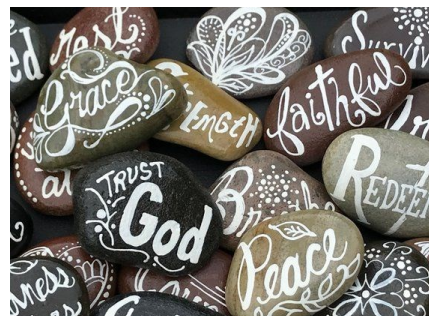
How do we recognize the voice of the Shepherd when life grows noisy and we are unsure which way to go?

How do we hold onto hope when we find ourselves, like the disciples on the Emmaus road, walking away from what we thought was the fulfillment of everything we hoped for? What does it mean to trust not only in the fact of the Resurrection but in the presence of the Risen One who refuses to leave us in our fear?

These are the questions that shape this season. And they are not meant to be answered in a single Sunday. They unfold over time. They unfold in the gathering—in the stories we share, the Scriptures we open, and the space we make to wrestle together.

So this season, let us not rush past the stories of those who took time to believe. Let us not pretend we have it all figured out. Instead, let us gather around the things that matter—around the Voice that knows us, the Hands that bear witness to suffering transformed, and the Table where we are astounded all over again.

The lilies may fade, but the season is just beginning. There is time enough to let the hope catch up with us.

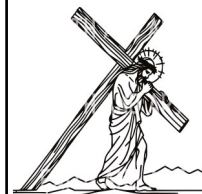

We hope you can join us.



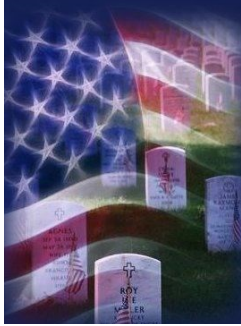

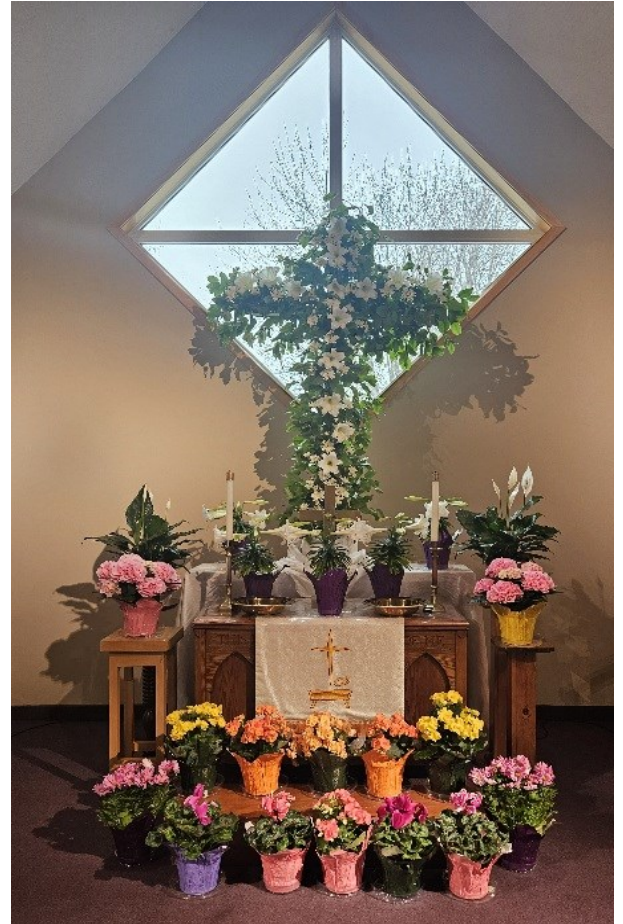

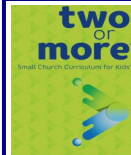

We hope to see you at Easter Service and would love for everyone to share their family photos in front of the Floral cross!

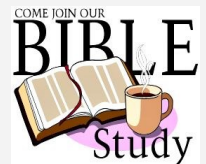
**On Sat., May 2nd at 10:30 am** the Sunday school class will do a service project at the church, cleaning-up the Memorial Garden and putting down new mulch.

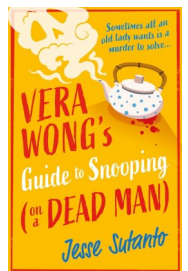

A dumpster has been ordered and removal of items will begin soon (couches, fabric pews, table, etc.). Jess has referred a person experienced in mold remediation that we will use to tear out and dispose of building materials, and share this expense. **THE UNKNOWN IS WHAT'S BEHIND THE MOLDED PANELING & SHEETROCK!** That will be addressed and fixed to meet building standards. After this work is complete, the youth room will become much needed storage space for MUMC, FE-ED and House of Grace. MUMC is busting out at the seams so it's time to purge! ## FINANCE UPDATE



As indicated in the March newsletter - I'm back as the finance chair. I was so bummed when Kelly decided to step down from the position. She will be greatly missed. I was so glad that Kelly decided to use the funds that the church had in investments to pay off the building mortgage in 2022. Brilliant move that I would have never thought of. That saved the church so much money in interest over the years. Needless to say, I am just getting my feet wet as the finance chair. Angie does such a great job of keeping on top of the expenses for the church - keeps all the bills paid and has been a great help to me as I transition back to this position. Yes, I swore that I would never take back the finance position. When I retired I made up my mind that I would only volunteer for something that brought me joy. (Finances had never brought me too much joy.) My entire working career (45 years) was based in accounting. I started in accounts payable, moved into a role working for the VP of finance and eventually took on processing payroll. January was always a horrible month. W2's, 1099's, 941's all had to be processed along with normal weekly tasks. It was awful. After Kelly stepped down Kim asked me if I was going to take back the finance role for the church. My answer was, "no way!!" However, one Sunday morning in early March, Pastor Mark had a sermon that spoke to me. "One was never too old to put their talents to use." I met Pastor Mark for coffee one morning after that sermon; we had a very productive meeting about the position and the future of our church; The Church Council voted to accept me into the role - and here I am.

Angie, Pastor and I met in early March to discuss finances and will meet monthly going forward. The finance committee always has a goal of being able to pay all expenses and payroll each month without having to take money from our savings account. This is no different than what many of us do at home. And, as we all know, prices for our everyday living expenses never seem to go down. Same with our church. Gas and electric expenses are much higher - especially during the winter months. The phone/internet bill has doubled! We've had a lot of snow this season, thus pay for plowing and shoveling. God bless Angie for shoveling the last two snowfalls, one over 11, 7", and she broke her glasses while doing it!



Our church relies on giving from our members. We rely on your financial generosity and your giving of time and talent. We are blessed to have Palabra Viva and House of Grace worshiping in this building. We are blessed to have civic organizations meeting in this building. We are blessed to have AA meeting in our church once again. We are blessed to be able to provide assistance to those in our community who are experiencing food insecurity through the FEED program. This "building" is a blessing to the entire community. I lived in this community for 19 years. This community brings me back to Montrose on a weekly basis - even though I moved to Buffalo three years ago and have a United Methodist church just up the hill from our house. I know this building and our church means just as much to those of you who are reading this report. You are appreciated. Thank you!

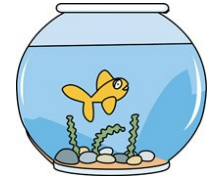

### REPORT FOR THE MARCH 24, 2026 FREE FOOD DISTRIBUTION

**We had 39 volunteers giving  
124 hours of work!**

The March food drop was a lovely event despite the Second Harvest semi arriving late, just before 1 pm and the distribution starting at 2:00pm! The Phoenix Learning Center (PLC) students arrived at 12:30 and helped us to be right on time to begin 2 pm! We love these kids!

Maggie and Deb are our FE-ED Liaisons to the PLC students. They, along with Pat, brought silk screened bags for the students to bring to FE-ED to take items back with them each drop. They purchased 50 bags and did the silk screening! The students were given 36 Lbs. of food from FE-ED and 7 lbs. from Pat.



We celebrated Pastor Cathy Jone's retirement with a luscious cake and gave her an orchid planter. Pastor Cathy has been a constant with FE-ED for 8 years. She has been the quiet foundation behind the scenes making it happen each month and the one that kept everyone on track, and the on site energizer bunny who never quits. She is also the cookie baker extraordinaire, baking all varieties of cookies for each drop. We are going to miss her immensely!

We distributed wonderful fresh produce, meat and bread!
