

Pastor Mark's Column

During the rule of King Herod of Judea there was a priest named Zechariah who belonged to the priestly division of Abijah. His wife Elizabeth was a descendant of Aaron. They were both righteous before God, blameless in their observance of all the Lord's commandments and regulations. They had no children because Elizabeth was unable to become pregnant and they both were very old. One day Zechariah was serving as a priest before God because his priestly division was on duty. Following the customs of priestly service, he was chosen by lottery to go into the Lord's sanctuary and burn incense. All the people who gathered to worship were praying outside during this hour of incense offering. An angel from the Lord appeared to him, standing to the right of the altar of incense. When Zechariah saw the angel, he was startled and overcome with fear.

The angel said, "Don't be afraid, Zechariah. Your prayers have been heard. Your wife Elizabeth will give birth to your son and you must name him John. He will be a joy and delight to you, and many people will rejoice at his birth, for he will be great in the Lord's eyes. He must not drink wine and liquor. He will be filled with the Holy Spirit even before his birth. He will bring many Israelites back to the Lord their God. He will go forth before the Lord, equipped with the spirit and power of Elijah. He will turn the hearts of fathers [a] back to their children, and he will turn the disobedient to righteous patterns of thinking. He will make ready a people prepared for the Lord." - Luke 1:5-17



This advent season we'll follow the life of John the Baptist in Adam Hamilton's new book: *Prepare the Way For the Lord*. It's that time again to prepare ourselves to celebrate Christ's birth! What do we have to do to prepare the way of the Lord? What is God calling us to do this year? We'll explore these themes and questions together in the next five weeks.

Today we're talking about how God hears our prayers by looking at John's very beginnings.



John's father, Zechariah, is a priest serving the temple in Jerusalem. He is part of the priestly division of Abijah.

Abijah is one of twenty-four divisions of priests. Each priestly division would take turns serving two weeks out of the year. All twenty-four divisions would come together to serve at annual festivals like Passover. We see that Zechariah was lucky enough to be chosen by a game of chance to offer incense in the temple. This is a one-in-a-lifetime opportunity! Unfortunately, there's a lot of shame that he carries as he enters in his role. People didn't understand the biological issues with infertility back then! They saw it as a sign of sinfulness that God hasn't blessed them with children. Thankfully scripture states how they weren't sinful as the author notes that Zechariah and Elizabeth were both "righteous" and "blameless". They had nothing to feel shameful about.



We read that Zechariah and Elizabeth were approached by the angel Gabriel. Like in many biblical stories, Elizabeth and Zechariah are parents strug-

gling with infertility and turn to God for an answer to their prayers. Gabriel is there to give some good news! Just like Abraham and Sarah; just like Isaac and Rebekah; just like Elkanah and Hannah: they're going to have a son! We don't know how old the couple are, but we know that Zechariah and Elizabeth have been praying for a child for DECADES! Can you believe it? Just imagine the emotions they were going through: skepticism, excitement, and bewilderment (among many others).

It's important to note that God chooses the very old. Zechariah and Elizabeth were described as "very old". Abraham and Sarah were 100 years old and 90 years old when they had a kid. Moses was eighty years old when

God called him to lead the Israelites out of Egypt. Most congregations have a large number of older adults and rightfully so! Older adults often have incredible gifts, wisdom, experience, and leadership. Some of my best conversations are with older people who have seen what I've seen. I get the best advice and direction from others. God calls to each and every one of us in whatever stage of life. God seeks to use us like God seeks to use Zechariah and Elizabeth to parent one of the most important prophets in scripture!

One thing really speaks to me in this scripture. Gabriel says something we all wish we could hear, "Your prayers have been heard." How many years have we prayed asking God for our prayers to be answered? Remember those times where you were at the end of your rope and reached out to God for help? Just imagine how heartwarming it would've been to hear that those prayers were heard. What are your prayers this year? What have you been asking God to hear? How has God been responding to your prayers?

I believe we all get our prayers answered in one way or another. We believe in a God who answers our prayers. May we center our hearts and minds to God this season and turn to one another in love and care. May we prepare our hearts for when we experience Christ in others. It's through preparing that we can be open to God's will and even help be the answer for the prayers of others. We can spread the peace and joy of Christ and declare your prayers have been heard! Please join us this advent season as we learn more about John the Baptist and prepare for Christ's coming.



Bishop Lanette Plambeck assigned to the Dakotas-Minnesota Area

Bishop Lanette Plambeck has been assigned as the resident bishop for the Dakotas-Minnesota Area effective Jan. 1, 2023. She was elected to the epis-

copacy at the 2022 North Central Jurisdictional Conference. Before her election, she served as the assistant to the bishop and director of clergy and leadership excellence in the Iowa Annual Conference.

Bishop Plambeck, in her pastoral service, has served as a local church pastor in four different pastoral settings including urban, county seat, town, and country. She has experience as a college chaplain and a licensed counselor in family systems and chemical and substance abuse. She is a veteran of the U.S. Army and was deployed to Desert Storm/Desert Shield.

She says the measure of her leadership is three questions she asks herself at the end of each day: Did I glorify God? Did I point people to Christ? Did I love? She describes herself as "unapologetically Wesleyan and so in love with Jesus and his ministry marked by compassion, grace and justice." A gift she brings as a leader is "to inspire others to live lives of significance as we work for 'kingdom on earth as it is in heaven' through active discipleship as we respond to the suffering in the world. I am committed to developing leaders (clergy and laity) to grow into the very best versions of themselves so that they can be at their very best for God."

Finance Update



Merry Christmas all! I hope you all have a wonderful Christmas season.

The finance group is still pretty quiet, but here are a few miscellaneous updates. First, you should have noticed the street repairs in downtown Montrose are done for

the year. Some final items will be completed next spring. We still have not heard if the church will have to pay street assessments or how much they will be. Second, we are still in the process of working with our insurance company regarding the elevator repairs that are needed and whether or not the insurance company will cover this. Let's all give an extra prayer that they deem the damages were caused by water damage from storms. If not, we are looking at \$29,000 in repairs. Lastly, any sort of parking lot repairs/replacement are on hold until we know more about the elevator.

Attached here and available at the church are the Annual Advent Fundraiser form. This year our focus is around our Annual Conference Apportionments and the Elevator/ Parking Lot (lumping these together since there are so many unknowns at this time).

We were so blessed to have an abundance of wonderful food for our November drop. We were able to purchase 40

turkeys from Second Harvest. Kim and Mike Wagner's place of employment KLN/Tuffy's Treats donated another 16 turkeys. We had 450 chickens so everyone was able to have a main course for Thanksgiving dinner. We received additional meat and deli donations as well as 15 boxes of bread from the Waverly Food Shelf.

We are so thankful for a \$2,000 donation through the Montrose Lions from the Delano Hockey Association pull tab proceeds.
