

Pastor's Column

Forgiveness: Finding Peace through Letting Go!



Are the things you carry through life a little heavy? Are you carrying too much baggage that **EVERYTHING** doesn't really belong to you? Here is an idea, set it down. Lay it at the foot of the cross. It is too hard for us to carry anyway.



The subtitle of this little book is "Finding Peace through Letting Go." What a wonderful idea. As we continue into this New Year, Jesus wants us to lay down the heavy loads we have carried this far into our lives and walk beside him with the lightness that he offers us. Would you like to leave some of it behind you in 2021? Or by now in 2022? I think we all would.

There are six words that lead to peace; "I am sorry" and "I forgive you." We all need to learn these words. Without learning these words our lives will be more difficult than they need to be. We all want our lives to be full of joy, and less cluttered with negative feelings. This video/book study and sermon series is full of little hints that can help us to find that peace in living.



Adam Hamilton writes in his preface to the book:

There are many dimensions to forgiveness, and each situation in which forgiveness is required is unique; there are circumstances that that have led me to counsel individuals in different ways from what I describe in this book. But, here, we will cover the big concepts surrounding forgiveness, as well as the most common relationships in which we find ourselves needing to give or receive it.

Depending on the situation, Forgiveness may be both the most difficult thing we will ever do, and also the most life-giving thing we will ever give ourselves. Life's hurts are real. They can cut deep. And yet we trust that there is a power that can overcome the hurt and renew our spirits. The is the power of that four-letter word, Love. If we can trust enough in the love that God and Jesus have in us, then we too can love ourselves. Sometimes we are our own worst critics. Yet, we need to trust that since God really does love us, then we are worthy of loving ourselves as well. None of us will ever be "good enough." But that is not the standard ruler by which Jesus measures our worth. Jesus loves us not only for the things we do, but also because we belong to Him. We are His. And nothing can ever change that fact.

So, have faith. Love yourself enough to let go of the hurts and burdens that others may have placed on you. Love yourself enough to let go of the burdens you have placed upon yourself. Jesus died for us while we were still sinners. That proves his love for us.

It is worth the effort to restore and enrich our relationships through the power of forgiveness. And God has promised to be with us along the way.

It is time to make this prayer come alive in you; Lord "forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us."

May God's Kingdom come, on earth as it is in heaven!



FE+ED UPDATE



Coldest ever FE-ED food distribution! Everyone survived the cold, including Melissa Hausladen, as she again greeted and recorded almost every client! We now offer prayer request cards and received so many heart tugging prayer requests. This is a much needed service.

Our community contributed a lot of extras:

- 13 boxes of bread and 800 frozen meals from WCCA.
- 30 hams, 20 bags chicken, 30 deli sandwiches, 4 cases of apples, 100 packs of yogurt from Buffalo Food Shelf.
- 50 dozen eggs from Monticello Food Shelf.
- 4 cases potato chips, 3 cases onion crisps, 20 cases stuffing mix from Delano Food Shelf (Delano can also start saving bread for us-they have freezer space).

Everyone reported FE-ED is contributing to their nutritional needs!

January Statistics:

- 6,320 pounds of food from SHH
- Families served 121 (All 1st time visitors as required each January)
- Individuals served 419
- Veterans served 21
- Communities served 14
