

Pastor's Column

"Happy are people who are hopeless, because the kingdom of heaven is theirs. Happy are people who grieve. because they will be made glad. Happy are people who are humble. because they will inherit the earth. Happy are people who are hungry and thirsty for righteousness, because they will be fed until they are full. Happy are people who show mercy, because they will receive mercy. Happy are people who have pure hearts, because they will see God. Happy are people who make peace, because they will be called God's children. Happy are people whose lives are harassed because they are righteous, because the kingdom of heaven is theirs. Happy are you when people insult you and harass you and speak all kinds of bad and false things about you, all because of me. Be full of joy and be glad, because you have a great reward in heaven. In the same way, people harassed the prophets who came before you." -


Matthew 5:3-12

Recognize this passage? It may seem familiar, but maybe not totally familiar. These are the Beatitudes! This translation uses the word "happy" instead of "blessed" and I find it a bit more relatable and refreshing for the scripture. It makes the verse easier to wrestle with and understand. What exactly is the difference between those two translations and why does it matter?

Without getting too detailed, the greek word used is *makarios* and it certainly means happy. Several commentators have translated it so, but we were raised with an understanding that the word means "blessed". The difference here is simply that this is Jesus' theory for happiness. That's right! Maybe now vou're finally getting to realize how ridiculous it would've sounded to the people hearing this at the time. In order to be happy, you have to be hopeless, grieving, hungry for righteousness, etc. They're considered blessed because they will receive the kingdom of heaven, they will be made glad, they will inherit the earth, they will be fed, etc. They are happy because they will find blessing. It's when we fully trust in God that we find happiness and blessing.

It's tough to trust in God when you have to do everything yourself to make things happen. Our lives are so difficult already with all of our responsibilities. How can we rely on God when other people rely on us? Well of course we don't have to rely on God to do everything. Of course God won't do our taxes for us or shovel the snow in our driveways (believe me, I asked. He simply won't do it), but God does help give us the strength to do these tasks. God does help the things within our control easier to do. We rely on God for the many things which are outside of our control. It's there that we can find happiness because we understand that there will be justice. We will find mercy and comfort. Jesus promises us these things! That's why we are happy; that's why we find ourselves to be blessed. Those who don't rely on God can't find such relief from the stresses and injustice in life.

This month, leading up to Lent, we will be reading from the Gospel of Matthew. We will be reading more from the Sermon on the Mount as well as Jesus' transformation. Then for the last Sunday in February we will start our new Lenten sermon series from Adam Hamilton, "Luke: Jesus and the Outsiders, Outcasts, and Outlaws" where we'll dig into Jesus' history with imperfect people. We'll talk about how he dined and healed people who weren't perfect and how Luke depicts Jesus' ministry with such people.



Also, don't forget we have Ash Wednesday service this month on February 22nd. Service will be held in Annandale at 6:15 pm and Montrose at 7:30 pm. Hope to see you all there!!

The MUMC Leadership Retreat, 12 attended and enjoyed a good time together in prayer, music, conversation and fellowship.



While there has been a few changes in the past year; (shipping costs increased as did the fee for having funds taken directly from a linked bank account), I still feel this is a great program and such an easy way to support the church.

Last year we raised \$2,063.93!

FINANCE UPDATE

Happy Winter Friends!!

A quick finance update. You should have received your giving statement for 2022.



If you haven't yet, please let me know and I'll mail another copy. W-2's for the church have been completed and all forms filed to the government. A huge thank you to Carol Hoppe for many years completing these forms - she has been gracious enough to train myself and Angie Ferrell on this process so we are taking it over for future years.

Next is the biggest item. We've mentioned in previous newsletters about the elevator repairs we have coming. We found out that our insurance company did cover \$5,000 for those repairs - which is the max coverage for that sort of issue (water damage).

Unfortunately, the repairs are \$29,000, leaving us with \$24,000 to come up

with. We do have some savings that we'll pull from to cover this, but appreciate any extra donations you can make so we don't have to drain our savings (excuse the pun). Also, in the late

summer/early fall we did a parking lot campaign. I plan to use these funds for the elevator repairs. If you have an issue with your donations being used towards this, please reach out to me and I will hold them aside.

The final item is the street assessments for the Montrose Downtown Improvement Project.



We still do not know how much, if anything, we have to pay towards this.

This obviously makes planning difficult.

I wanted to give you that heads-up that we may still have a large bill coming for this item as well.

Sorry to sound like doom & gloom, but want to be realistic with what is going on. As always, please feel free to reach out to me with any questions.

REPORT FOR THE JANUARY 24, 2023 FOOD DROP

Our first food drop of 2023 went very well. Thank you to everyone who helped get the line

up information out ahead of time. We had cars use the church parking lot and Emerson Ave. after that to keep cars from lining up on Highway 12. This worked well despite the huge piles of snow and cars were not on Highway 12.

Thank you Angie Ferrell for donating funds through the *RaiseRight* Program to provide lunch from Casey's for the volunteer workers. Many expressed their appreciation for this gift. We will be getting pizzas for upcoming food drops.

The fresh produce, dairy products, meats, bread, and even EGGS were very much appreciated.

We were able to purchase a wide variety of fruits and vegetables this month.

We did not get the full amount of eggs but did get 85 dozen. FE-ED strives to provide nutritious food for our communities. This month we planned for 150 families. Last month we planned for 160 families and had a little extra. This month we could have used a little more. It's challenging to come out exactly right but no food ever goes to waste.

We received 32 boxes of bread from the Waverly Food Shelf and 240 lbs. of food from the Buffalo Food Shelf.
