

Friends, apparently, the following scripture has not been fulfilled yet.

No, this is the covenant that I will make with the people of Israel after that time, declares the Lord. I will put my Instructions within them and engrave them on their hearts. I will be their God, and they will be my people. ³⁴ They will no longer need to teach each other to say, "Know the Lord!" because they will all know me, from the least of them to the greatest, declares the Lord; for I will forgive their wrongdoing and never again remember their sins. (Jeremiah 31:33-34)

It has been a real joy to renew connections with every one of you at Annandale and Montrose. It has been wonderful for me to take time in each service to explore different ways that doubt creeps into our faith lives, and how we can find a stronger faith by exploring and facing those doubts. It has always been my favorite gospel, because it tells the stories of how Jesus saw fit to make an effort to use and include those folks who the rest of society seemed to push off to the side. You might say, if you were ever picked last for kickball, Luke is the gospel for you.

Finally, please know that I will miss you after my time filling in for Pastor Mark is completed, however, I am thankful that you are in such capable hands. And once again, I thank you, Pastor Mark, for thinking of me when you needed someone to fill in during your parental leave.

Change my heart O God, make it ever true. Change my heart O God, make me be like you.



FE-ED REPORT FOR THE JANUARY 23, 2024 FOOD DROP

We had a few challenges this month. There was an event at the Montrose Community Center early in the morning and the Second Harvest Heartland truck didn't arrive until 2:15 pm. We began distributing the food boxes at 3:05, after our group prayer!

Thank you to the *Phoenix Learning Center* students who really hustled and made short work of all the hauling and sorting before their bus had to leave. They also made notes of encouragement for each food box while they waited for the SHH semi to arrive. *THANK YOU SO MUCH!*

This month we had 39 volunteers for 125.5 hours of volunteer labor the day of the event. There are many hours before the event securing, packaging, and gathering the food.
