
#### **Pastor's Column**



February invites us into a season of life-changing encounters with Jesus. Through the stories we'll hear this month, we are reminded that Jesus meets people right where they are. In moments of pain, doubt, and longing, He brings healing, hope, and new life. He doesn't stay distant or unreachable—He steps into real lives, offering a love that changes everything.

Time and time again, Jesus defies expectations. He doesn't follow the rules people try to place on Him. He doesn't turn away those others reject. Instead, He sees people with compassion and acts with a deep, unstoppable love. Where others see rules, Jesus sees an opportunity to heal. Where others see failure or hopelessness, He brings life. He transforms brokenness into beauty.

These moments with Jesus reveal more than physical miracles. They show us what God's kingdom is really like—a kingdom of grace, kindness, and endless mercy. Jesus lifts up those who feel forgotten. He comforts those in sorrow. He forgives those weighed down by guilt. In Him, we see God's heart—a heart that is always drawing us toward healing and wholeness.



But meeting Jesus is not always easy. His presence can challenge us, shaking us out of our comfort zones and showing us where we need to grow. Sometimes it's hard to face the truth about ourselves. Some people in these stories respond with joy and gratitude. Others hesitate, unsure if they're ready to accept a grace they didn't earn. Yet no matter where we find ourselves, Jesus offers the same thing: to be seen, known, and loved beyond measure.

These stories also ask something of us. Jesus shows us how to live with grace and love. Where in our lives are we being called to offer forgiveness? Who in our world needs hope? These moments in Scripture aren't just stories—they are invitations for us to be part of God's healing work today. We can carry that same transforming love to the people around us.

As we worship together this month, may these stories touch our hearts and change the way we live. May we hear Jesus calling us, challenging us, and offering us grace. And may we, like those who met Him so long ago, leave with renewed faith, knowing that His love is still reaching out to heal and restore today.


#### Join the Montrose UMC Book Club





Alyssa Prestidge, recovering from a concussion after a car accident, then getting influenza.


**Kole Johnson,** battling covid and hospitalized for an infection/fluid in his shoulder 8 months after his surgery.

The water heater in the kitchen finally gave out, so a new electric, 50-gallon one has been intrustees


Church Irustees

Trustees met with a sanctuary lighting specialist

and have signed the contract for work to begin the end of February. All lights in the sanctuary will be retrofitted to LED, keeping the current lighting system and stage lights to be directed to where they should be. This is a costly upgrade, \$15,868, but very much needed. The sanctuary will be fully lit now and look so much more inviting! The church also qualified for a rebate program by Xcel Energy's Center for Energy & Environment to change all other bulbs in the church to LED at no charge, a \$3,600 savings! The savings will continue for years with more efficient lighting reducing our electric bills and less money spent on bulbs as LED bulbs last a long time! B.O.T.

#### FINANCE UPDATE

When I sent an email asking for feedback on what the congregation would like QOK to see in the newsletter or BUDGET bulletins, a few responded with financials to see the

financial health of the church. The Church Council reviews financials with the Finance Committee at every meeting, and I can assure you they do an amazing job watching the budget and expenses.

Here is a snippet of the 2024 end-ofyear Actuals vs. Budget. Last year was an odd vear due to the water damage repairs and insurance payouts, and additional costs to repair several other underlying building problems. I'm not an accountant but my background was retail, so I was always looking at numbers! Kelly will provide a recap going forward, and I hope this meets with her approval

#### FE-ED REPORT FOR THE **JANUARY 28, 2025** FOOD DROP

We had 39 volunteers giving 110 hours. Thank you volunteers!! We prepared 200 boxes and ran out for the first time. There were about 6 families who did not receive a box but received some

food. The need is indeed increasing and more zip codes are reported for communities we have not seen before. Volunteers noted increased anxiety related to food security and people are very concerned about having enough to eat.

The Phoenix kids (pictured left) were amazing! So much laughter and energy. Their teacher, Shana, is seeing such an amazing transformation in these kids. What a blessing! Some may say we are "just" giving out food but it is far more than that. It is a tidal wave of love being sent out into the community. The impact we may never fully know, but it is truly a God sighting of EPIC proportions! (These comments were from Kimberly Niska, Grace Place Executive Director.)

#### We were blessed with additional food from the following:

- Coburn's Delano: Deli, Salads, Fruit and Vegetable.
- Monticello Help Center: Tortilla Shells, Poblano Peppers, and Various Chips. Approximately 1000 pounds.
- Buffalo Food Shelf: Beverages, Bread, Baked Goods, Celery, and Lettuce. Approximately 480 pounds.
