## Pastor Mark's Column




As the days gradually lengthen and we turn our hearts toward the Lenten season, a familiar path stretches before us. We have walked this way before—marked by ashes, guided by reflection, and drawn by the promise of Easter dawn. There is a profound comfort in these rhythms, a sacred familiarity that grounds us like a homecoming. This year, we begin from that place of comfort, gathering once more as a community to observe the rituals and practices that have long sustained our faith. 






The MUMC Book Club's next meeting is


### Board of Trustees Update

# FINANCE UPDATE

Per Kelly Rux, all 2025 Financial Statements have been distributed in person or by mail. If you have not received yours please let Kim Wagner or Angie Farrell know. All MN

UMC Conference reports were submitted.

You may have heard Kelly Rux has stepped down as Finance Chair. We cannot Thank Kelly enough for her many years of expertise in this role. We're looking for someone to fill this position and will make an announcement once filled.

Here is update on year-end 2025 and a look at the 2026 Budget (see right). We are already seeing increases in expenses across the board, the biggest on our building insurance +\$400/Qtr. Additionally, we've already spent more in December for snow removal than all last winter!

We want to thank the generous donation of \$2K from an anonymous donor to help cover snow removal costs. Just as homeowners' face increases in utilities, etc. so does the church. We are making every effort to keep costs down. We have no big projects at this time, but must be prepared for everything. We can't thank you enough for your support of our little church and pray this continues in 2026!

## FE-ED REPORT FOR THE JANUARY 27, 2026 FOOD DROP

The January food drop started 2026 on a cold note! Some of our volunteers had purchased hand warmers to share, which came in handy (pun intended) in our mittens, boots, pockets, and hats.

Even the Phoenix Learning Center students used them! These students are amazing, and they're always such cheerful workers and so much fun to get to know.

FE-ED had 37 volunteers giving 102.5 hours to prepare and distribute 175 boxes. We anticipated getting a pallet of free meat but were notified the day of the drop that it was not available. Grace Place had recently received an increase of donated meats and graciously gave FE-ED 548 pounds of that donation. We are so grateful for their support.



We recorded 20 different zip codes, which is down from previous drops. We were briefed on safely handling situations where people are frightened to come out and arranged for safe passing of some boxes by trusted allies and friends.

Please pray that Second Harvest heartland, NAPS, SNAP, Community Food Shelves, and other programs can continue to get funding so people are able to get food. Please pray to give people a way to get the food they need.
