

Pastor's Column

Why? Making Sense of God's Will! In a season of resolution making, followed by a time of resolution breaking or forgetting, may I make a better suggestion?

Let's make a resolution this year that is worth keeping. Let's seek more sincerely to follow God's will for our lives and for the life of our community. Of course, like

many things that is easier



said than done. It takes at least two things to accomplish that goal. It takes both determination, or maybe we could call it commitment, and it also takes discernment.

When it comes right down to it, we have lots of questions when it come to determining what God's will is for us. One person thinks God is leading us in this direction, the next person thinks God is leading us in that direction.

After he suffered a tragedy in his own family, Leslie Weatherhead wrote a wonderful little book about God's will. He describes three different aspects of God's Will. First of all, God's Intentional Will for us is to remain in perfect relationship with God, for us to experience paradise. Of course, we are human, and it makes it hard for us to remain perfectly in relationship with God. So second, God wishes the best for us as we deal with the circumstances of life. Things just happen, like natural disasters, illness, injury, loss of any kind, and God helps us to come out on the other side as best we can. He calls this God's Circumstantial Will. And third, we trust in the goodness of God, and know that ultimately, God's Will shall be accomplished. In the end we know that God wins, and God's *Ultimate Will* is unity with us all.

Some evangelists today have gotten rich by worldly standards simply by telling people that if they are good to God, then God will be good to them. And there is some basis for that in the Bible, but not much. The over arching message of the Bible is that God will be with us, through the good times, and yes, especially in the difficult times.

To assume that our faith in God will keep us from experiencing tragedy, is misreading the Bible.



Adam Hamilton says it this way, "the Bible is largely a book about people who refused to let go of their faith in the face of suffering."

For example, think of Joseph who was sold by his brothers into slavery in Egypt, or Moses who does God's work, and yet is so miserable that he prays for God to kill him. Or Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego thrown into the firey furnace, and Daniel thrown into the lion's den. You get the idea. I didn't even mention Jesus yet, who was executed on the cross for us.

Yet, their attitudes were of faith, maybe best summed up in Psalm 73:26 and 28, "My flesh and my heart fail, but God is the strength of my heart and my portion forever ,,, I have made the Lord God my refuge." The Bible definitely does not teach that if you follow Christ life will be all sunshine and ros-

The promise of the Bible is that through it all, God shares with us the promise of hope, peace, joy, and love. God does not give as the world gives, God's gifts will last.



As John Wesley said on his death bed, "The best of all, God is with us still."

May God's Kingdom come, on earth as it is in heaven!





For our specific county we have been asked to make safe decisions based on the positive test rate for our county. If the positive test rate is over 5% then we are asked to consider whether we need to initiate more precautions.

As of this publication, Wright County has improved slightly and is now hovering around the 15% positive test rate level. We will be making adjustments to our response weekly, with an eye to whether the infection rate either declines or increases, and how the new rapidly spreading OMICRON variant is impacting these numbers.

We would like to ask you to consider wearing a mask indoors. Some churches in Wright County have gone back requiring masks indoors, however at the time of this writing, we have opted to continue with the precautions we have in place. If you feel so led, please wear a mask when indoors.

First let's do a recap of how we did in 2021, it was a tough year, but we still did pretty good with the Scrip Program. In total we had 12 participants and earned \$2,390.77 back in rebates for the church. I've said it once & I will say it again and again how easy this program is to be able to fundraise for our church. It costs you nothing - buy gift cards for the places you're already going to spend your money at (groceries, gas, eating out) and give back to the church AT THE SAME TIME! Having a hard time paying your apportionments each year? Do it through the Scrip program and forget about it! Yes, you can designate where you want the rebates you earn for the church to go (so apportionments anybody?).

We will continue to have gift cards on-hand for your convenience for *Cub Foods, Holiday, Kwik Trip, Target, Walmart.* (SEE ANGIE OR KELLY.) And if you haven't downloaded the *RAISERIGHT* mobile app, I'm happy to help you with that.

Finance Committee Update

I hope everyone had a very Merry Christmas!

A few items of note from the finance team as we head into 2022. First, and most important is that we have officially paid off our church mortgage. This is very exciting news. We appreciate the support from all of you over past many years. What a relief it is to have this done. We will celebrate on Sunday, May 1, 2022 with an official "Burn the Mortgage" party!





The second item, now that the mortgage is paid, is looking at our building and maintenance needs. We have many projects, some long term and some more immediate. A compressor recently went out with a cost of \$2800. Then we have the parking lot in desperate need of some repairs/replacement, front concrete steps, rail-

ings, flooring in basement, lighting and more. Unfortunately, none of this comes cheap. We are asking our members to continue giving to the building fund. Instead of a mortgage account it becomes a building maintenance savings account. This allows us to save up for these projects.

Finally, a thank you to Carol Hoppe for serving as our church's financial secretary for so many years. She is retiring from this position and we a very thankful for her service. Kelly Rux will be taking over this position. One favor we have is writing on your check or giving envelope where you are designating your giving - general, building maintenance, apportionments, etc. Kelly doesn't have the history Carol did, so your help is much appreciated.
