Pastor's Column



"Be glad in the Lord always! Again I say, be glad"

- Philippians 4:4

We prepared for Christ's coming this advent season. We reflected on the life of John the Baptist and how he prepared the way for Christ's coming, and likewise we prepared ourselves for Christ's coming. We reflected on how we should remain faithful, repent of our sins, and study God's word. Christmas day we celebrated Jesus' birth in a manger! Now that Christ is here, and God is with us here on Earth: what do we do? As Christians, how do we live a Christian life?

We can share God's light with others by just being the wonderful people God created us to be! We don't always have to read scripture to grow closer to God. Instead we can invite God on a hike in the woods. We can invite God to read a good book by

the fire. We can invite God to have coffee and a scone.

For those impacted by the extreme weather; tornadoes in the south, blizzards in the Midwest, hundreds of thousands without power for weeks in the cold temps.


Patty M., a co-worker of Mike & Kim Wagner's, her daughter Abby going through some hard times right now.

FE-ED Update



We had a bountiful food drop in December!

Thank you to Kim Wagner for producing the fliers with upcoming 2023 food drop dates and a squash recipe that was included in each box. We had 1000# of assorted squash this month. Volunteers helped bag frozen food at Grace Place before the drop which helped immensely. Connie Nelson's

beautiful ornaments were given to volunteers and breakfast sandwiches were available from Caribou with some snacks.

Palabra Viva brought some fliers over for their Covid Vaccine Clinic when we began to give out food. \$50 gift cards were given to each individual who received a booster for Omicron/ Covid at the MUMC during the drop. This made traffic control and access confusing resulting in a few upset clients who were directed to the parking lot for safety concerns and did not retain their place in line. The line for the food drop extending a long way on highway12 causing safety concerns. No accidents were reported. MN Department of Health vaccinated 25 people for Covid and they all got their free \$50 reward cards!

FEE INCREASE EFFECTIVE JANUARY 9, 2023
