Pastor's Column



January marks a time of reflection and new beginnings. Many of us approach the year with resolutions and goals, hoping to bring about meaningful change in our lives. Amid this forward-looking energy, the words of Micah 6:6-8 offer a grounding perspective:

"He has shown you, O mortal, what is good. And what does the Lord require of you? To act justly and to love mercy and to walk humbly with your God."

This passage challenges us to move beyond external displays of piety or achievement. Instead, it calls us to focus on the values that shape our daily lives—justice, mercy, and humility. These practices are not about dramatic gestures but about aligning our hearts and actions with God's desires.

I once heard the story of a woman who decided to set a New Year's resolution that wasn't about personal success but about living out her faith more fully. When we choose to walk humbly with God, we begin to see God's hand in the every-day moments and recognize the sacred opportunities to share God's love with others.



As we embark on a new year, let Micah's words inspire us to live intentionally. Resolutions are fleeting, but a life rooted in justice, mercy, and humility creates lasting impact—in our hearts and in the world around us. May this year draw us closer to God and to the people God calls us to love.



FE-ED Food Drop Report for December 17, 2024

December's food drop was one week early due to Christmas Eve falling on the 4th Tuesday. The time change did not impact the number of people served. We

actually had more communities served than ever before. Food insecurity is so hard during the holidays with schools being out and having extra guests.

The student volunteers from the Phoenix Learning Center were very much appreciated, especially with the cold weather! We had 31 volunteers at this drop totaling 100.5 hours of service.



Our partner for pet food, For The Love of Pets, brought double the amount of pet food to distribute which was a great surprise! The Monticello Food Shelf provided pizza and cheese puffs to distribute.

December Statistics:

- 8,942 lbs. of food from Second Harvest Heartland (SHH)
- Families served 202
- Individuals served 569
- Veterans served 45
- First time visitors 4
- Communities served 29

Due to some confusion in reporting last month, these are corrected **November Statistics** for people served:

- Families served 200
- Individuals served 602
- Veterans served 45
- First time visitors 5
- Communities served 23

This year, 2024, the Tuesday FE-ED Food Distributions have distributed over 111,000 pounds of food, served 2,192 families and 6,549 individuals!



FE-ED will celebrate 10 years next summer 2025!

We have held at least one food distribution each month, even during the pandemic. Our deepest gratitude to everyone who has supported this effort to FEED our neighbors.




