Pastor's Column

A New Year's Dawn: Carrying the Light Forward



As we step across the threshold of a new year, we often find ourselves yearning for a fresh start, a new clarity of purpose. The deep, quiet darkness of these winter mornings can remind us of the uncertainties that lie ahead. Yet, it is precisely in this season that we are invited to remember the profound proclamation of John's Gospel: that in the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. This Word, John tells us, became flesh and dwelt among us in the person of Jesus Christ, the true light that gives light to everyone. He is the dawn that scatters every shadow, offering a clarity and hope that can frame our entire year.

This foundational Light, Jesus, is most fully understood in His gracious presence among us. We see this illustrated powerfully at the Jordan River, where Jesus—though without sin—humbly submits to baptism.

In this act, the heavens open, and the Father's voice affirms His beloved Son.




Here, we see that true, divine power is revealed in humble solidarity and loving presence. Jesus meets us in our ordinary moments, sanctifies our new beginnings, and demonstrates that God's ultimate power is expressed through identification and love, setting a pattern for how we are to be present with one another.

Such a calling naturally propels us outward with purpose. The prophet Isaiah echoes this mission, speaking of a servant called not only to restore Israel but to be "a light for the Gentiles," to bring God's salvation "to the ends of the earth."

This is the justice the Light brings: a comprehensive healing that lifts up the broken and reaches the forgotten. In Jesus, this prophecy finds its fulfillment. As His followers, we are now enlisted in this work of restorative justice—to be reflectors of His light that pushes back darkness in all its forms, offering hope, dignity, and God's shalom to a waiting world.

So, as this January unfolds, let our collective resolution be this: to consciously carry the light of Christ. Let us seek, as the Psalmist did, to dwell in the house of the Lord all the days of our lives, to gaze on His beauty, and to find our strength and courage in His faithful presence. In the coming year, may we be a community that looks to Jesus, the morning star, in each new dawn. May we embody His gracious presence with one another, and actively share the light of His justice and love. For the Lord, revealed to us in Jesus, is our light and our salvation—whom shall we fear? Wishing you a year illuminated by His hope, purpose, and peace.

At our December meeting our program focused on Love and how to share hospitality in a hurting world. Our Scripture reading was 1 John chapter 4. To summarize - it teaches believers to test all spiritual teachings by checking if they confess Jesus came in the flesh, because false prophets deny this: the greater truth is demonstrated by Him sending His Son, so Christians must love one another, casting out fear, as love proves they know God and are in Him, while those who don't love don't know Him.


We also learned about “fractals” (described by Adrienne Maree Brown) which is a never ending pattern created by representing a simple process over and over again. In nature this can be found in patterns of succulents, pinecones, snowflakes, trees and more!

Carol Becker created an ice wreath based on fractals, using items she found in nature in her backyard. Leaves, pinecones, evergreen branches, dried flowers, and even some orange peels. Angie asked Carol if the ice wreath was considered to be a “craft”?

As we focused on the ice wreath we were reminded of our program year “Together” in 2025.



We'll start our January meeting with the new UWF Program book, **“Mapping Our Way Forward”**, which is about finding our way, mapping our plans, and holding on to the balance of grounding and flowing as we do it. In the midst of the uncertainties that surround us, we can map our way forward into the unknown by holding on to God and our core values, letting them keep us grounded as we face each challenge.

FE-ED Food Drop Report for December 23, 2025

We were blessed with volunteers and plenty of wonderful food for this Christmas time food drop. The day was bright with the sun shining and it felt especially nice after November's cold and rainy food drop.

We had the students from the Phoenix Learning Center there to help us. We were so grateful for their sunny personalities and the work they provided. We had an exceptional amount of extra potatoes this time and the boxes were overflowing and very heavy!

The semi driver for Second Harvest Heartland was scheduled to arrive at 12:30 pm, but arrived at 10:30 am so it was a bit of a scramble to gather volunteers and get everything unloaded!

Grace Place provided many, many packages of hot dogs and chicken. These items are especially appreciated and the hot dogs were a perfect item to distribute since school kids are on Christmas break.

Our Phoenix student liaisons, Deb and Maggie, along with Grace Place provided Christmas bags for the students. FE-ED gave them Gatorade. The students gave Grace Place a beautiful holiday arrangement, and gave Montrose UMC a Christmas evergreen planter for Christmas. These are great kids!

We had 26 volunteers at this drop totaling 114 hours of service.

Finance Update



Just a quick update from the finance team. First, thank you for your giving in 2025. Finance statements will be distributed in the next couple of weeks. I will have a full update on where we finished in 2025, details on our Advent Fundraiser, and the 2026 Budget in the February newsletter.

November Total Income \$7,453.58

Total General Fund (designated giving) \$5,783.47
This includes Palabra Viva rent \$550.00, Apportionment Giving \$646.97, RaiseRight income \$136.65 and other.

Total Building Fund Giving Income \$1,670.11

This is designated giving and "Hospitality Treat" receipts.

November Total Expenses \$8,996.10

This includes Salary items of \$4,183.28 (for pastor, secretary, janitor, pianist, and all benefit costs). Other costs and Building expenses were \$4,812.82 which includes utilities, maintenance agreements, and insurance.




