

Pastor Mark's Column

brings. But as we're reminded in Ecclesiastes:

There's a season for everything and a time for every matter under the heavens (Ecclesiastes 3:9)

Whatever has happened—that's what will happen again; whatever has occurred—that's what will occur again. (Ecclesiastes 1:9)

Finance Update



Happy July! A quick finance update for everyone. The biggest thing we have going on right now is the repairs to our parking lot. The Church Council met on June 23rd to discuss drainage issues we have in our parking lot. I'm

sure many of you have noticed the sinking drain in the SW corner of the lot. Since we have the city repairing the roads, it's a good time for us to fix this piece. We've voted to proceed with the repair. This is just under \$10,000. Luckily we have money in our Building Maintenance Fund, but this repair will basically wipe out our building savings to zero. The trustees are in the process of collecting bids to replace our parking lot. If you've been to the church lately, you will see this is a dire need. As you can imagine, the price will be quite substantial. It was suggested that we look into getting a bank loan. The concern being the cost is only going to go up and the replacement is needed.

I will be starting the talks over the next few days to see if this is even an option. More to come, but in the mean time we will need to raise funds to cover these repairs, so if you're able, any extra donations are appreciated to the Building Maintenance Fund.

I'm thankful we don't have to worry about a mortgage at the same time!!

News from Palabra Viva



Palabra Viva Church of the Nazarene came to Montrose 6 years ago, and continues to grow their church family and reach new people in our community. In March 2022 they started a new church in St. Paul, and are having success there as well. Services were on Friday evenings, and now moved to Saturday af-

ternoons before their Montrose services. All their services are live-streamed on Facebook.

Pastor Alex and his wife Amparo are still on leave, now nine-months of a one-year commitment. They started a new foundation in Columbia, So. America called *Timoteo's Foundation* reaching many children and growing a Christian education center.

This message was from Pastor Alex in October 2021: "Thank God we had a good trip. Since our arrival, we have not stopped working at the foundation, and although the work has been a lot, it has been a beautiful experience. Although we know that the process of readaptation to life in Colombia will not be easy, we know that God will show his power in the course of the following weeks.

At the moment we are staying with Amparo's family, which is where the foundation currently operates, since for mobility reasons it is easier to be here to avoid long journeys in the morning hours, and also because it is in this community where most of our Timothy's families live. Currently we have organized into 3 teaching groups divided by age, in this way we can receive the largest number of children, we hope to have a total of 36 children by the end of October. Glory to God. We still have some pending improvements, such as preparing a bathroom for the children, more tables, installing a sound system, among others. I want to thank all of you for your support, donations and prayers in this new ministerial opportunity, which has been a challenge for my wife and me. I'll share more good news soon."

FE+ED moved the June food distribution location to the Montrose VFW due to road construction around Center Ave. So., 2nd Street So. and CR 12 being closed. We had canopies set up, extra signage placed on highway, and fliers with a map were made, posted and distributed so folks knew of the change. The drop went very well!

It was a hot day and the many volunteers were awesome working outside in the heat. We actually started distributing the food a little early and were done early with all the boxes gone!

This was Pastor Mark Schlasner's first food drop. He came early, stayed late and interacted with everyone. He was genuinely interested in learning about how all of us serve our community. Thanks Pastor Mark, it's great to have you and Pastor Cathy leading us spiritually in our work.

- 10 boxes of bread from the Waverly Food Shelf.

Trustees Update



CHURCH IS OPEN! Center Ave. So. Is open, however all dirt, and there's heavy equipment moving around everywhere. BE CAUTIOUS! As of this publication, 2nd St. in front of the Montrose Fire Dept. is closed and every road around the church is now dirt!

The Trustees recently learned from Bolton-Menk, the company managing the Montrose Downtown Improvement Project, that are catch basin/storm sewer drain in the SW corner of the parking lot has issues. After a conversation with them about improvements, with an estimate of \$12K - \$18K and the likelihood of losing all 3 tress on the south lawn, Lee Reinhart called the project manager at Bolton-Menk and got more information. Lee met with contractors and discussed other options which saved the trees! A bid to make repairs/improvements was received for \$9,834, quite a savings from original estimate! THANK YOU LEE REINHART! The church council met Thursday, June 23rd and voted unanimously to accept the bid. Work will begin in a few months.

We have received four bids on having the parking lot replaced, and after a conversation with Lee Reinhart & Bolton-Menk, we are getting one more bid from the company doing the work for the Montrose Downtown Improvement Project, Knife River. Bids are coming in at \$82K - \$102K to redo the parking lot! Council discussed patch & repair versus redo, but eventually the lot needs to be redone, therefore we are looking at the possibility of a loan to complete this project. This isn't what we want to do, take on debt again, but we cannot deplete our savings and still have unknown assessment fees on all the street repairs to consider. Watch for updates in the next newsletter. We still have railings and concrete areas to replace too. The list of basic building upkeep goes on.

The city has since pulled the weeds and put down new mulch. WE NEED A COUPLE OF VOLUNTEERS (YOUTH & CONFIRMANDS) TO TAKE TURNS PICKING UP LITTER, PULLING WEEDS, ETC. AND MEET-ING OUR COMMITMENT EACH MONTH. Speak to Kim Wagner.
