


#### The Struggle is Real

"Don't think that I've come to bring peace to the earth. I haven't come to bring peace but a sword. I've come to turn a man against his father, a daughter against her mother, and a daughterin-law against her mother-in-law. People's enemies are members of their own households."

- Matthew 10:34-36.

Growing up, I struggled a lot with the idea of authority. Not in the way that I was a rebel and did the opposite of what I was told. Instead, I questioned whether something was really true or not. I did this purely out of ignorance because I couldn't quite understand how people knew for sure that you should or shouldn't do something. I still struggle with authority today. I find myself questioning the validity of some teachings within scripture. We all struggle with that at times. Jesus' teachings are still very controversial today. The struggle is real.

For example, Matthew writes of Jesus saying that he hasn't come to bring peace, but a sword. Interesting how Matthew later quotes Jesus as saying that those who live by the sword will die by the sword.



But then Jesus goes to say that he has come to turn a family against each other! How would that make sense considering how the ten commandments include respecting your father and mother. Well it makes sense that

Jesus would say this because he's showing people a new path forward. Jesus is declaring to the people a new covenant between God and humanity. So of course it would cause this sort of controversy. Does this necessarily happen today? Some could argue so. Jesus today is still challenging our everyday assumptions about God and our faith.

This month we'll be struggling with Jesus' teachings found within the gospel of Matthew. One of the reasons why Matthew wrote his gospel was to be a manual of discipleship for Christians. 

The Bison Fishing Forever program is a nonprofit 501C organization that allows people to get out and enjoy fishing. The pontoon – which holds up to 8 guests – is located on Lake Pulaski in Buffalo.

Our guests range from the very young to the elderly. We have groups from nursing homes, assisted living, memory care, veterans, adults with special needs and parents with children. Some people come out to fish and some like to come out and just relax and spend time on the lake enjoying a ride. The pontoon is manned by volunteers. We have an experienced captain on the pontoon who finds the spot where the sunnies are biting. The 1<sup>st</sup> mate provides help with getting the guests equipped with their life jacket and boarding the pontoon and getting ready for their two-hour adventure on the water. The captain and 1<sup>st</sup> mate also bait hooks, remove fish and ensure that the guests are comfortable during the trip.

The City of Buffalo assists the Fishing Forever program by providing information regarding the program in the Community Center activity pamphlet. If anyone is interested in an outing, you can contact the community center in Buffalo at **763.682.6036.** The last I checked there were a couple of spots left in July and August. The outings run Monday through Thursday – three trips per day: 10 am to Noon, 1 pm to 3 pm, and 5:30 pm to 7:30 pm.

#### FE-ED Food Drop Report For June 27, 2023

The semitruck from Second Harvest Heartland (SHH) arrived at 11 am, not 12:30 as previous months! We prepared 200 Boxes of food! This is our largest number since we have been doing the food drops. We

were very happy to be back in the Community Center to pack the boxes. It was a warm day and there was a lot of work to be done as you can see by the amount of food we packed.

We received a grant from Second Harvest Heartland for \$2,500! We will be redoing our website and updating our brochure to make people better aware of who we are and what we do. It will help with the other things too!

**Blessing Bags** (packed with items other than food that a family would need to run a household like paper products, cleaning supplies, personal hygiene items, etc.) provided by **Hearts~to~Hands** will be distributed next month. We hope you can join us in July, as we'll need more volunteers since we will have twice as many boxes to give out!





FE-ED is celebrating 8 years of feeding and caring for our neighbors.



#### Our community contributed a lot of extras:

- 750 lbs. of Watermelon from Second Harvest Heartland.
- 100 lbs. of bread from Great Harvest in Maple Grove.
