We were very thankful it did NOT rain! We had enough volunteers to quickly get the boxes prepared. The truck was late, arriving at 1:10 pm, and we did not have the Phoenix Learning Center students so we

were a bit concerned. We were actually ready a little early and able to begin on time at 2 pm!

The Howard Lake-Waverly-Winsted High School Cheerleaders volunteered to help us this month. We really appreciated it. We also had a family volunteer that was looking for something to do together. We welcome everyone wanting to volunteer. It is fun and you get a good feeling knowing you are helping feed families.

There were 39 volunteers, but hours were not available. We use a **Volunteer Sign-in & Sign-out Form** to keep track of hours, but I do not have an accurate count on hours since most did not sign out. (If you are volunteering, please remember to sign-in and out.)

We received a lot of fresh produce and other items this month! Cabbage, carrots, celery, onions, potatoes, sweet potatoes, sweet corn, apples, cantaloupe, honey dew melon, breads/muffins, snack items, eggs, whole milk, and more!
