Pastor Paul's Column

Once again, let me say, I have always joked that my job as a minister is to work myself out of a job. What I mean by that, is best summed up by the following scripture.



33 No, this is the covenant that I will make with the people of Israel after that time, declares the Lord. I will put my Instructions

within them and engrave them on their hearts. I will be their God, and they will be my people. ³⁴ They will no longer need to teach each other to say, "Know the Lord!" because they will all know me, from the least of them to the greatest, declares the Lord; for I will forgive their wrongdoing and never again remember their sins. (Jeremiah 31:33-34)

But, it seems that I am reminded often that this time has not yet come. We still need to teach each other, and learn from each other. An example would be, that no matter how many times I ask people if they know the two greatest commandments that Jesus taught, there is always a bit of hesitation before people answer.

Now, it's not that people have forgotten them, or that they don't think that these commandments are important. I suppose thinking of it that way reminds me that we are still connected. And I want to stay connected to you, and the members and friends of every church I have served. You have helped me grow into the person I am, and the person I am becoming. Thank you.

So, it seems that because of the passage of time, I have worked myself out of a job after all. However, we will all continue to do the work. We will continue the work of Jeremiah 31 together, even if we are not physically together. We work to share Christ with each other, so that God's covenant will be written on the hearts of all people, in all creation.

Change my heart O God, make it ever true. Change my heart O God, make me be like you.

You are the potter; I am the clay. Mold me and make me, this is what I pray.

May God's Kingdom come, on earth as it is in heaven!

You get the same options and experience whether you're on the app or website. You get an earnings dashboard chart to see how much you've personally earned in rebates for the church! Why not set a goal for yourself each month?

- You have access to the program tool and alerts, so you can find out when those bonuses are happening
- You can save your favorites for easier and quicker shopping!

Trustees Update



CHURCH IS OPEN! Major work on Center Ave. is underway between Hwy. 12 and 1st St. So., with utility work being completed through 2nd week of June, weather permitting.

The Trustees have received one bid on having the parking lot replaced, and are waiting on two more bids. This work would not begin until after the Downtown Project road construction is complete around the church

We started live-streaming our worship services on FACEBOOK Sunday, May 22nd! Remember, this is LIVE! One word of caution is during Joys & Concerns. Be sure any names/information shared during prayer requests does not violate a persons right to privacy. You should have permission/approval to request prayers, unless it's something already made public.

Yes, there's a hole in the ceiling of the sanctuary! That's where the sprinkler company had to search for the air leak - found and fixed! We need a licensed contractor to fix the hole, making an access panel in the ceiling that meets MN fire code. We are getting bids for this project too. Again, it's for these reasons that we need your continued support to the Building Maintenance Fund (formerly Building Mortgage Fund). The church has already spent over \$11,000 this year on repairs & upgrades. Paying off the mortgage has almost worked like a car warranty ~ the minute it expires your car breaks down and it's no longer under warranty!

The list of Bread Oven supplies the church is selling is being emailed to everyone this week. (The list includes a suggested donation.) Contact Kim or Mike Wagner if you are interested in purchasing any of the items. The list is also posted on the bulletin board by the water fountain. NOTE: Kelly Rux has purchased a gas grill for the church to host future outdoor events! The first event, most likely a welcome picnic in July for Pastor Mark Schlasner and his wife Amy! Let's hope Rally Sunday can be an outdoor event without any road construction!

FE+ED Update



FE+ED will soon celebrate it's 6th year distributing food to Montrose and neighboring communities. We are blessed to be a partner with Second Harvest Heartland (SHH).



As stated on SHH's website, "it's hard to believe that in a country that wastes billions of pounds of

food each year, it's almost shocking that anyone in America goes hungry. Yet every day, there are millions of children and adults who do not get the meals they need to thrive. SHH works to get nourishing food – from farmers, manufacturers, and retailers - to people in need." This is where FE+ED comes in to help, by purchasing food at a nominal charge to then distribute to the community for free. Even through the pandemic, we were able to partner with SHH and other area churches for emergency food relief.

Our May food distribution was another great success, despite the road construction. It was a warm and beautiful day! The new traffic flow using 1st Street to Center Ave. and using the north entrance to the Community Center/Fire Station to distribute the boxes worked out great. We began earlier than normal and were done quickly.

We don't know how the road construction will impact the June 28th food distribution, but we will post any updates on FACE-BOOK.
