





FE-ED REPORT FOR May 26th FOOD DROP

FOURTH TUESDAY OF THE MONTH AT 2 PM

If you've never been to FE-ED's monthly food distributions or volunteered to help... Here is a snapshot of the work they do to pull it off!

Everyone typically shares a light lunch prior to the distribution!

- 1. All the empty boxes are brought over form MUMC, stacked and ready to be packed.
- 2. SHH truck arrives around noon and everything gets unloaded.
- 3. Everything is sorted onto tables by categories; fruits, vegetables, boxed or canned goods, milk, eggs, etc.
- Volunteers pack items into boxes, lining them up on tables for distribution, packing 185 to 200 boxes each month.
- 5. Pastor ICathy & Pastor Mark lead the group in prayer before distribution begins.
- 6. Boxes are placed onto conveyor to easily transfer to cars as they pull up.















The May food drop was the last one this year with the PLC Student participation. A high-



light of the day was thanking them for all of their help and to present them with a framed photo from one of the food drops! We provided *Thank You* bags to all the students as they left. The students spoke about what they liked about helping out at FE-ED and voted FE-ED as their MVP (Most Valuable Partner) this year! They will be greatly missed. Several FE-ED Board Members will attend their graduation ceremony on Thur., June 5th! Watching the volunteers and students interact with such caring and friendship is amazing and such a blessing! There were a lot of job offers and recommendations for jobs and general support as these young adults enter their next chapter. We hope new students at PLC can help next year, but they've experienced budget cuts and busing them to FE-ED is a \$300 expense each time.
