#### **Update from the Board of Trustees**

We are very happy to announce that repairs from the water pipe break November 1st are almost complete! The Lindstrom Restoration contractors have completed all the drywall work, at the time of this writing, most of the painting is complete in the lower level, ceiling tiles are being installed March 6th-8th, woodwork (sanctuary) is expected to be completed by March 8th, carpeting in the sanctuary and all lower level (except the church office) is scheduled for March 11th or 12th.

Painting in the sanctuary is only the west wall, where the damage occurred. We should have extra paint, which we can use at a later date to paint other areas. We went with two paint colors overall, a neutral beige tone for sanctuary, the large meeting area in the lower-level and Palabra Viva office. We chose a soft gray-blue tone for the nursery and art/craft room. We may use any of this paint leftover to paint the Youth Room! (If youth approve the color!!)

Once all work is complete, we will need help to clean some things and put everything back where things go! It's a perfect time to sort through things, keep/purge, and organize! Especially the Sunday school closet!

#### We can't wait for you to see the final results!

We want to thank those of you that submitted ideas for the outside, back entrance. We had 4 suggestions: 1) nice pavers on both sides of sidewalk. 2) cobblestone pavers and potted plants/flowers on both sides of door. 3) Same pavers as we had (new). 4) shrubs on both sides (with an offer to buy the shrubs). We have several things to consider when making our selection. First, maintenance, and then what can handle the winter shoveling, salt, etc. We will make an announcement before Easter!

#### **FE-ED UPDATE**



#### FE-ED report for February 27, 2024.

We had a little different timeline for preparing for the food drop this month. Second Harvest Heartland (SHH) plans to move our delivery time to about 1:00 pm. This is better than trying to change the entire day and time to something else!

We enjoyed lunch provided by Russ Johnson to celebrate his 80th birthday. The Phoenix students really liked the cake! They worked very hard during their brief time with us. We had 42 volunteers giving 126.25 hours of volunteer time to gather, set-up and implement the food drop.

Connie Nelson's son Bill usually picks up and delivers food for 16 families near Litchfield, who would struggle to eat without his help and FE-ED. He was unable to come this month so we had an overage of food boxes, which were distributed on Friday, March 1st at Grace Place's 1 pm food drop. FE-ED is packing boxes for 200 families each month to distribute.

#### **February Statistics:**

- 7,672 pounds of food from SHH
- 200 pounds of Bread from Breadsmith Bakery
- Families served 186 + 13 at Grace Place Friday
- Individuals served 516
- New Visitors 21
- Veterans served 40
- Communities served 18

Remember that March is MN Food Share month, a time to help fill our local food shelves. The overarching initiative for SHH is to cut hunger in Minnesota in half by 2030. Cargill and Target have each pledged \$10,000,000 to help reach this goal. Your donations to SHH, FE-ED, and your local Food Shelf are totally tax deductible. This is an added benefit for you to be a part of helping to reach this goal. The food we are purchasing is getting more scarce and expensive so your donations are especially appreciated.
